## Are you choosing one or two courses to start your studies?

Are you planning on starting your university studies on a part-time basis? Are you only registering for one or two courses per term?

Prior to applying for admission, find out if the courses you want are scheduled at a time you are available? Follow the steps below.

## How to navigate WebAdvisor as a Prospective Student:

- 1. go to Student, click on WebAdvisor
- 2. select *Prospective Students*
- 3. click on Search for Course Sections [Undergraduate Studies Resources]
- 4. go to *Term* and choose from the menu the term you wish to take courses:
  - Fall (3 credit hours)
  - Fall/Winter (6 credit hours)
  - Winter (3 credit hours)

- 6. you can fine tune your search by choosing 'Sections meeting after' or 'Sections ending before' and select a specific time and you can even choose preferred days of the week as well,
  - e.g., if you're only available after 4:00pm on Tuesday and Thursday under 'Sections meeting after', select 4pm and tick Tue and Thu

<b>TIP:</b> During Fall and Winter terms courses are usually scheduled as follows:			
3 x p/week	2 x p/week	1 x p/week	
Mon/Wed/Fri	Tue/Thu	1 Evening – Mon to Thu	
50 minutes	75 minutes	1 Afternoon – Mon to Fri	

- click on Submit a list of courses will be displayed
- 8. to review the course descriptions and to see if the course has a requisite requirement, click on the 'Section Name & Title'
- 9. the second column specifies the Status of the course
  - Open means there is room to register,
  - Closed means that the maximum number of students have registered in the course, but you could place yourself on the Wait List as #1 and
  - Waitlisted means that students have placed themselves on a list hoping to register go to Wait Lists to find out more.
- 10. If the courses you want to register for are available when you are, then apply for admission ASAP!
