John Buhler, LLD, OC Bonnie Buhler

HONORARY DOCTOR OF LAWS

John and Bonita (Bonnie) Buhler are well known for using their means to build a better community. Deeply devoted to their family, together the philanthropic couple from humble beginnings has five children, ten grandchildren, and two greatgrandchildren.

In 1969 John Buhler purchased Morden's Standard Gas Engine Works and renamed it Farm King Limited. It was the start of a farm equipment empire that was consolidated as Buhler Industries in 1994, and later included the manufacturing plant Versatile, fulfilling Buhler's lifelong dream of building tractors.

Bonnie Buhler was born in British Columbia and moved to Winnipeg at age 12. She attended Kelvin High School before taking her first job at Manitoba Telephone Systems, later working as a legal secretary. She also took on the role as special events coordinator with Buhler Industries.

In 2007 John retired as the Chairman and CEO of Buhler Industries, having amassed a fortune that he and Bonnie are choosing to share with others. Bonnie was driven to help improve health care facilities after her daughter was diagnosed with a difficult medical condition; eventually their giving expanded to include education projects as well. In total, the Buhlers have provided more than \$60 million in charitable gifts, choosing charitable endeavours deserving of their time and passion.

John has received many honours during his career, including "Manitoba Entrepreneur of the Year" in 1998, the Queen's Jubilee Medal for community service in 2002, an Honorary Doctorate from the University of Manitoba in 2011, and the Order of Canada in 2012. Bonnie Buhler was awarded the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal in 2012, and in 2007 together the couple was honoured with the Variety Gold Heart Humanitarian of the Year Award.

The Buhlers' legacy of generosity now includes The Buhler Gallery at St. Boniface Hospital, The Buhler Cancer Centre at Victoria Hospital, the Buhler Reflective Gardens at St. Amant Centre, the Buhler Welcome Centre at the Manitoba Children's Museum, and the Buhler Commons and John and Bonnie Buhler Library at Red River College.

In 2010 a major donation led to the opening of the Buhler Centre on the corner of Portage Avenue and Colony Street, now home to UWinnipeg's Faculty of Business and Economics as well as Professional, Applied Continuing Education. Part of the donation was used to establish the John and Bonnie Buhler Knowledge Fund, which provides generous scholarships and bursaries to a handful of deserving students annually.

For their devotion, commitment to caring, The University of Winnipeg is pleased to offer John and Bonnie Buhler an Honorary Doctor of Laws.

Jean Chrétien
PC, OM, CC, QC
HONORARY DOCTOR OF LAWS

Joseph Jacques Jean Chrétien is one of Canada's most successful political leaders, serving as our 20th Prime Minister from 1993 to 2003. Born and raised in Quebec, the 18th of 19 children (ten of whom did not survive infancy), Chrétien proudly wore his humble origins as "the little guy from Shawinigan".

A law graduate from Université Laval, he was first elected to the House of Commons in 1963 and served in various cabinet posts under prime ministers Pearson and Trudeau, most notably as Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development, Minister of Justice – where he negotiated the Charter of Rights and Freedoms — and Minister of Finance.

In 1990, Jean Chrétien became leader of the Liberal Party of Canada, and led the party to majority governments in 1993, 1997 and 2000.

Mr. Chrétien lived and governed through changing times: most notably the rise of the separatist movement in Quebec, and fought and won two referenda. He pioneered the Clarity Act of 1999 to avoid ambiguity in future referendum questions. Despite the difficult economic times of the 1990s Mr. Chrétien balanced the Government's books and laid a solid economic foundation

from which the country still benefits today. His vision was one of fiscal responsibility merged with social awareness.

Regional rivalries and ethnic and linguistic tensions make national governance a complicated art.

Chrétien balanced these realities and remained a staunch champion of bilingualism and multiculturalism. He has believed in a strong, and as much as possible, generous federal government; he celebrates Canada's multicultural identity and has always believed the strength of our country's unity is based on its diversity.

Abroad he has encouraged Canada to provide leadership in a progressive, internationalist understanding of our global obligations — actively supporting Canada's pivotal role in developing the concept of human security and the Ottawa Treaty, a landmark global treaty banning anti-personnel landmines.

Jean Chrétien represents the best of Canadian values: patriotism, tolerance, openheartedness, humor and progressiveness. For his deep loyalty and dedicated service to Canada, The University of Winnipeg is honoured to present Jean Chrétien with an Honorary Doctor of Laws.



Jean Chrétien CP, OM, CC, CR

DOCTORAT HONORIFIQUE EN DROIT

En fonction de 1993 à 2003, le 20e premier ministre de notre pays, Joseph Jacques Jean Chrétien est l'un des dirigeants politiques les plus respectés du Canada. Né au Québec, où il a grandi, le 18e de 19 enfants (dont dix n'ont pas survécu à leur première année de vie), M. Chrétien a fièrement assumé ses humbles origines qui lui ont valu le surnom de « p'tit gars de Shawinigan ».

Diplômé en droit de l'Université Laval, il a été élu pour la première fois à la Chambre des communes en 1963 et a occupé plusieurs postes au Cabinet sous la direction des premiers ministres Pearson et Trudeau, notamment à titre de ministre des Affaires indiennes et du Nord canadien, de ministre de la Justice – où il a négocié la Charte canadienne des droits et libertés — et de ministre des Finances.

En 1990, Jean Chrétien a accédé à la direction du parti libéral du Canada, auquel il a permis de former des gouvernements majoritaires en 1993, en 1997 et en 2000.

Il a vécu et gouverné durant une époque marquée par les changements : il a notamment fait face à la montée du mouvement séparatiste du Québec en luttant victorieusement contre deux référendums. À cet égard, il a, en outre, élaboré la Loi sur la clarté de 1999 afin d'éviter toute ambiguïté concernant les futures questions référendaires. En dépit des difficultés économiques des années 1990, M. Chrétien a réussi à équilibrer les dépenses du gouvernement et à établir une solide assise économique dont le pays

bénéficie aujourd'hui encore. Sa vision mariait responsabilité financière et conscience sociale.

De surcroît, associées aux tensions linguistiques et ethniques, les rivalités régionales ont fait de sa gouvernance à l'échelle nationale un art très complexe.

Cependant, M. Chrétien a su conserver l'équilibre entre ces différentes réalités en défendant ardemment le bilinguisme et le multiculturalisme de notre pays. Il a toujours cru en un gouvernement fédéral fort et, autant que possible, généreux. Fermement convaincu que la force de l'unité du Canada réside dans sa diversité, il a constamment rendu hommage à l'identité multiculturelle de notre pays.

À l'étranger, il a encouragé le Canada à exercer un leadership dans une perspective avant gardiste et internationaliste de nos obligations dans le monde — à cet égard, il a activement soutenu le rôle central du Canada dans l'élaboration du concept de sécurité humaine et de la Convention d'Ottawa, un traité international historique interdisant l'usage des mines antipersonnel.

Jean Chrétien incarne le meilleur des valeurs canadiennes : patriotisme, tolérance, empathie, humour et avantgardisme. En reconnaissance de sa profonde loyauté et de son dévouement envers notre pays, l'Université de Winnipeg a l'insigne honneur de lui remettre un doctorat honorifique en droit.





David Moroni

HONORARY DOCTOR OF LETTERS

David Moroni's legacy as a Principal Dancer of the Royal Winnipeg Ballet (RWB) is only enhanced by his international reputation as the founder of the RWB School's Professional Division. Thanks to his vision, countless classical ballet dancers trained in Winnipeg now work on stages all over the world.

Moroni joined the RWB in 1964 and became a Principal Dancer in 1968. In 1970 the RWB Board of Directors and then Artistic Director Arnold Spohr decided that a professional level training school was needed to develop local talent and strengthen the company. Moroni was asked to take on this enormous challenge and responsibility. Sacrificing his performing career, he embarked on what would become his life's work

Moroni created the program from modest beginnings. For several years, he was the entire school: sole teacher and administrator. He worked to develop an integrated academic-dance program to ensure that Professional Division dancers also received a strong academic education; the dance curriculum was based on the Russian system of creating versatile dancers.

In 1989, the province's Department of Education officially recognized the RWB School Professional Division, which enabled students to receive credit for their dance studies. In 2008 the Professional Division cemented a relationship with The University of Winnipeg Collegiate making it the "school of choice" for RWB students.

Moroni's passion to create well-rounded individuals has led to additional UWinnipeg connections for students. UWinnipeg's Faculty of Education recognizes the work completed by graduates of the RWB School Teacher Program, allowing them to designate dance as a teachable minor.

Under his leadership, the Professional Division has garnered international critical acclaim and is a sought after school by aspiring dancers from across the country and around the globe. As retired RWB Principal Dancer and Collegiate alumna Tara Birtwhistle expressed, "I am grateful to have grown as a dancer under his watchful eye. When he is in the audience I seem to stand taller and dance bigger. I want to make him proud."

Robert J. Sawyer BAA, DLitt HONORARY DOCTOR OF LAWS

Named the 'the dean of Canadian science fiction' by The Ottawa Citizen, Robert J. Sawyer is a revered bestselling author in Canada and among the most distinguished in the world. According to Locus Index to Science Fiction Awards, Sawyer has won more awards for his novels than anyone else in the history of the science fiction and fantasy fields.

Sawyer is one of very few around the globe to hold the triple crown of science fiction writing awards: the Hugo; the Nebula, a.k.a. "the Academy Award" of science fiction; and the John W. Campbell Memorial Award. He also has won the Canadian Science Fiction and Fantasy Award ("the Aurora") a record 14 times.

His writing has an extraordinary capacity to transcend generations and disciplines, attracting a diverse readership. Sawyer's lucid prose often explores the interplay between religion and science. He accurately explains many scientific concepts and research activities, from quantum physics to genetics. Sawyer's fiction often engages the reader in questioning the advancement of scientific knowledge and the struggle to elaborate on and develop appropriate ethical principles to meet scientific advancements.

In addition to his novel writing, Sawyer has done film and television work; his book FlashForward was turned into an ABC TV series with the same name. He has served as a consultant to Canada's Federal Department of Justice (concerning the shape of future genetics laws), NASA (on future space station plans), and many other organizations.

Sawyer adds significant lustre and depth to the Canadian academic community. He has earned other honours, including The Humanism in the Arts Award and an honorary doctorate from Laurentian University. Sawyer has taught writing at numerous universities and has served as a Writer-in-Residence at institutions across the country.

The University of Winnipeg is honoured to present Robert J. Sawyer with an Honorary Doctor of Laws for his prolific broad body of work and for realistically portraying the relevance of science to the human condition.





Linwood DeLong BA, MA, PhD

FELLOWSHIP IN UNITED COLLEGE

An accomplished scholar, researcher, and librarian, Dr. Linwood DeLong is being honoured for making countless contributions during his decades-long career with The University of Winnipeg. He retires this year following a term as Acting Dean of the Library, after more than 30 years thriving in several roles in the University library where he shared his expertise in research methods and materials with students and faculty alike.

Known for inspiring library staff at the early stages of their careers, Dr. DeLong continued to pursue his own scholarly research, which in addition to publishing peer-reviewed iournal articles included two book-length studies: Ignatius Aurelius Fessler as a Historical Novelist: His Theory and Practice, and A Guide to Canadian Diplomatic Relations, 1925-1983. With his high-proficiency in German language, in addition to his MA in Library Science, DeLong is also a competent translator who holds a PhD in 18th-Century German Literature

During his time at The University of Winnipeg, Dr. DeLong actively committed himself to tireless service above and beyond his position. His faith and dedication led to his being nominated in 2002 by

representatives of the United Church to serve on the Faculty of Theology Advisory Committee, which he did until its dissolution in 2013. He also served on the Senate Library Committee, taught German to continuing education students, and worked with departments across campus to improve holdings.

In 2012 the University was offered the generous gift of the Eckhardt-Gramatté Library, a collection of rare music and art books, a significant number of which are in German. Named as Head Librarian and Curator, Dr. DeLong worked long hours properly cataloguing the collection to ensure best access to the wealth of knowledge contained within.

For his passion, integrity and loyalty to The University of Winnipeg and its students, we honour Linwood DeLong as Fellow of United College.



Sohrab Abizadeh, BSc (Gold Medalist), MA, PhD PROFESSOR EMERITUS

Dr. Sohrab Abizadeh is a devoted teacher and distinguished academic who has served The University of Winnipeg with great distinction since first joining the institution in 1983 as an associate professor in the Department of Economics.

Abizadeh is a prolific researcher who has made significant contributions to the discipline of economics, and has played an exceptional role in the university administration - all while demonstrating a strong commitment to his students. He received UWinnipeg's Clifford J. Robson Memorial Award for Excellence in Teaching and was listed in the segment of Popular Professors at UWinnipeg in the Maclean's Guide to Canadian Universities. These two distinctions are among the highest compliments that students can pay their professor. Abizadeh's teaching dedication, his research, and his attentiveness to students have tremendously enhanced the undergraduate programs of economics majors and honours at UWinnipeg.

Abizadeh is known for his generosity of time and as a mentor of his colleagues and students. He has published 45 well-received peer-reviewed journal articles, 14 chapters and three books. His research areas include public finance and international trade.

Abizadeh has committed a great deal of time serving the University on numerous committees. He is sought after for 'his balanced views and ability to mediate difficult situations.' Abizadeh has also filled a number of important administrative roles at UWinnipeg. He served as Department Chair of Economics (1987-1992) and later filled the role of Acting Chair on three separate occasions to facilitate administrative leaves by various colleagues. He also served as Associate Dean of Arts and Science (1992-1997) and as Director of the International Office (1998 -2000). His commitment to the University earned him the Robin H. Farguhar Award for Excellence in Contributing to Self-Governance.

Abizadeh's impact on the University can be further measured by the respect he has achieved among his peers.

Sandra Kirby, PhD, MA, BEd, BPE PROFESSOR EMERITA

Dr. Sandra Kirby is an accomplished teacher, researcher, scholar and administrator and a former Olympic athlete with the Canadian Rowing team who has dedicated much of her career to eradicating sexual harassment and abuse, homophobia and violence against children in sport. She has a deep history with The University of Winnipeg, having joined the Department of Sociology in 1989, serving as Chair for nine years, and serving on and chairing numerous committees. She served many years on Senate and was also elected to the Board of Regents. She was appointed Associate Vice President, Research and Dean of Graduate Studies in 2007. In these roles, Kirby was instrumental in developing the first suite of stand-alone graduate programs at UWinnipeg, including the prestigious Master's in Development Practice - Indigenous Development; she was the principal collaborator in preparing that program's concept paper for the MacArthur Foundation. She also facilitated the process that resulted in the \$10 Million NSERC grant by Dr. Jeff Martin, the largest the University had ever received. Kirby is the author or co-author of ten books in addition to more than thirty book chapters, reports and refereed articles. She has another book in development.

Complementing her substantive research, Kirby possesses a curious nature and wisdom that has touched thousands of students. She is a well-known research methodologist, particularly in the areas of marginalized communities and sensitive data. Her work has extended to include research ethics, disability, policing in racialized communities, palliative care, and human rights and homophobia in sport. Her work as a core member of the International Task Force on Harassment and Abuse in sport has more recently focused on the establishment of the World Safe Sport Agency.

Kirby has brought considerable prestige to UWinnipeg through her engagements with the International Olympic Committee on Child Protection in Sport, UNICEF, the Canadian Association for the Advancement of Women and Sport, Status of Women Canada, and the Manitoba Innovation Council. In these roles she has acted as an international ambassador for UWinnipeg, and a tireless champion of human rights.

Kenneth William Meadwell BA (Hons), MA, PhD, OPA

PROFESSOR EMERITUS

Dr. Kenneth Meadwell has served The University of Winnipeg with great distinction for three decades and achieved a level of excellence as scholar, teacher, researcher, administrator and community member. Meadwell is an internationally known specialist in francophone Canadian literature and literary theories, with three books and over one hundred scholarly articles and reviews to his credit. His groundbreaking work on the enigmatic Québec writer, Réjean Ducharme, is recognized as a milestone in Ducharme studies, and his study of identity and alterity in the French novel of Canada is considered a must-read in scholarly circles. In 2013, he was named Knight in the Order of Academic Palms of the Republic of France, one of the oldest and highest honours that France bestows, for his remarkable contribution to the promotion of French language, literature and culture.

As Professor of French Studies at UWinnipeg, Meadwell was so beloved by his students that he was selected as "Popular Prof" by Maclean's magazine Guide to Canadian Universities for five consecutive years (2002 to 2006). He served as Department Chair for 13 years and for his dedicated abilities as an administrator who guided departmental development from French Studies to Modern Languages and Literatures received UWinnipeg's Robin H. Farquhar Award for Excellence in Self-Governance in 2009.

He maintains ongoing and close ties with the academic world in France and has been an Invited Professor of Canadian Studies at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Duke University and the Universidad de La Laguna in Spain. More than a decade ago, he created the Meadwell Scholarship Endowment which awards — in perpetuity — an annual scholarship to a student studying French at UWinnipeg.

Deborah Schnitzer BA (Hons), MA, PhD

PROFESSOR EMERITA

Dr. Deborah Schnitzer has served her discipline, her department, and The University of Winnipeg with great distinction and compassion for more than a quarter century. Her distinguished record of research and scholarship has focused on art-based modes of representation involving multi-and interdisciplinary work. She is a legendary professor among her students and colleagues for her enthusiasm, energy, writing and love of teaching.

Schnitzer's interests in activism, scholarship, course design and community-based learning have led to her creating The Institute for Literacy & Transformative Learning. As founder and past director of the institute she was able to create an interdisciplinary program that integrates theory and practice, involving students in organizations and programs concerned with access, inclusivity, social justice, human rights, peacemaking and creative freedom.

In developing the institute, Schnitzer partnered with university and community members to explore collaborative and cooperative teaching, research and learning models. Drawing strength from diversity, the institute successfully integrated scholarship and activism with the help of participants' varied experiences, learning styles and practices.

Schnitzer also co-founded UWinnipeg's Experiential Learning Initiatives Network, which along with The Institute for Literacy & Transformative Learning, became core elements of UWinnipeg's community engagement.

Schnitzer is a beloved teacher who has received several teaching awards on and off campus. She earned the prestigious 3M National Teaching Fellowship and UWinnipeg's Clifford J. Robson Memorial Award for Excellence in Teaching. Schnitzer has also earned several writing accolades which include the 2010 Margaret Laurence Award for Fiction for her book An Unexpected Break in the Weather. She also received the 2011 Grand Remi Award for Best Experimental Film & Video with her colleague Shelagh Carter. She has collaborated on many other film projects that have been seen around the world.

Schnitzer's innovative teaching methods — which reveal links between literature and other arts and between the academy and the community — have continued beyond her retirement; she continues to challenge boundaries and inspire those around her: both students and colleagues.

CAMPUS SUSTAINABILITY RECOGNITION AWARD

Dedicated to campus sustainability at The University of Winnipeg, Andrée Forest has applied a steadfast approach to finding solutions for active transportation and waste management, while promoting outreach and sustainable governance as both an environmental studies student and a member of the University of Winnipeg Students' Association executive.

Soon after arriving to study at UWinnipeg in 2009, Forest initiated a dialogue with the Campus Sustainability Office to improve waste management. Identifying bin infrastructure as an area in need of improvement, Forest researched best practices and her early suggestion to size various bins proportionally to respective waste stream volume will come to fruition this summer when all bins are replaced after a successful pilot.

Forest has a longstanding involvement in active transportation at UWinnipeg: she was an early member of the IceRiders winter cyclists, and part of the team that worked to see the UWSA BikeLab open its doors. She represented UWinnipeg at two Velo-City conferences, in 2012 (Vancouver) and in 2013 (Vienna, Switzerland).

In the areas of outreach and governance, Forest has dedicated her time to the development of the annual GrassRoutes Sustainability Festival, chairing the committee in 2013 after volunteering as an organizer for the festival's initial three years. In 2012, Forest was selected to attend All Climate Reality Training Canada (in San Francisco) where training was offered by the Honourable Al Gore, former Vice-President of the United States and a Nobel Prize Laureate.

Forest has also invested time in exploring how student coursework could contribute to sustainable solutions. She developed a conceptpaperinclassonadaptingtheawardwinning Vancouver-based 'CityStudio' program — which nurtures collaborative projects from staff, community members and university students — with an aim to bring it here as a Master's thesis project. A key student leader, Forest has sat on the Campus Sustainability Council for more than three years. She is also a member of the Experiential Learning Network, contributing to course development in the area of campus sustainability.

For her ongoing dedication to sustainable action, The University of Winnipeg is honoured to present Andrée Forest with the Campus Sustainability Recognition Award.





Serena Keshavjee BA, MA, PhD

CLIFFORD J. ROBSON MEMORIAL AWARD FOR TEACHING EXCELLENCE

A University of Winnipeg assistant professor and coordinator of art history, Serena Keshavjee has earned the highest praise from her students. She is consistently described as an "exceptional, genuine professor" and is renowned for her contagious passion for art. She helped develop the new Masters in Curatorial Practices, an applied program that includes a series of academic theoretic courses and hands-on experience taught by the best curators in Winnipeg.

Keshaviee demonstrates outstanding expertise in all of her subjects. She effectively engages discussion in the classroom, and enlivens the learning environment bv bringing in new technologies: a student in one of her courses, researched, designed and organized a QR code tour of UWinnipeg campus buildings. Keshavjee is a mentor who consistently goes beyond the call of duty to help her students with their education. Her engaging lectures and courses are constantly sought out by a cross-discipline of students. "I love going to class" is a common refrain of her students.

Keshavjee makes herself available outside of class time and keeps generous office hours. She is always willing to discuss papers and constantly encourages her students to challenge themselves and improve their work. She makes them aware of scholarship opportunities and various other beneficial activities.

Keshavjee is able to make art history accessible and approachable. encourages her students to go beyond what they thought possible and inspires even the shyest students to participate in class. She prompts them to think in an interdisciplinary manner by intertwining literature, religion, visual culture and ideological connections to reach a deeper, more profound understanding of the subject matter. This encouragement in critical thought transcends the classroom and has led to success for Keshavjee's students in other courses and other facets of their lives.

Michael Collins McIntyre BA. PhD

THE ROBIN H. FARQUHAR AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN CONTRIBUTING TO SELF-GOVERNANCE

Michael Collins McIntyre has contributed much to self-governance at UWinnipeg. He was appointed Assistant Professor in 1975 and served as Assistant Dean from 1978-82, and as Dean from 1982-92, of the Faculty of Arts and Science (which at the time encompassed virtually the entire University).

McIntyre tackled many responsibilities that are currently shared among several different positions. His colleagues marveled at his ability to provide fiscal, administrative, and academic leadership, all while maintaining a research program and developing into a brilliant professor. McIntyre notes that continuing research and teaching during his time as Dean allowed him to be "of" rather than "from" the faculty. He credits this for the wonderful collegiality that allowed problems to be solved and progress made.

McIntyre established UWinnipeg's Centre for Academic Writing. As Dean, he also developed an accessibility program for those with physically disabilities; it contributed to a three-fold increase in special-needs students. McIntyre also boosted the arts presence on campus by fostering the evolution of Theatre from a program to a department, and by establishing In-Residence programs for writers, directors and playwrights. Working with the departments, he was able to foster research capacity in the sciences. During his term, our Physics Department became one of the

very few departments at any university to enjoy 100% NSERC funding.

McIntyre joined UWinnipeg's Psychology Department in 1975 after earning his PhD in neuropsychology at the U of Minnesota and completing his post-doctoral fellowship at Cornell University. After his tenure as Dean, he returned to the Department of Psychology, from which he retires as a professor this year.

In 2005, McIntyre received the Clifford J. Robson Award for Teaching Excellence. In addition to inspiring minds in the classroom, McIntyre provided invaluable guidance to students planning graduate studies.

McIntyre has amassed an impressive legacy of research, publishing more than 40 refereed journal articles and 55 conference presentations and informal publications. He has also served as an Affiliated Scientist and Program Leader of the Functional Neuroimaging Program at the National Research Council of Canada, and has supervised doctoral and post-doctoral students in psychology, neurophysiology, linguistics, radiology, and physics.

For his numerous outstanding contributions and accomplishments, The University of Winnipeg is pleased to present Dr. Michael Collins McIntyre with the Robin H. Farquhar Award for Excellence in Contributing to Self-Governance.



Dr. Peter J. Norton BA, MA, MSc

DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD

Dr. Norton graduated from The University of Winnipeg in 1995 with a B.A. in Psychology and Sports Science. He attained his Masters of Science in Sports Psychology from The University of Western Australia and his Masters of Arts in Clinical Psychology at The University of Nebraska-Lincoln. In 2003, after completing his pre-doctoral residency at The University of British Columbia Hospital, Dr. Norton obtained his PhD in Clinical Psychology from The University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

Currently, Dr. Norton is applying his expertise at the University of Houston's Department of Psychology as a Professor of Psychology. He is also the founder and Director of the University of Houston Anxiety Disorder Clinic, a specialty research, treatment and graduate-training clinic accessible to many individuals who might otherwise be unable to afford treatment.

Dr. Norton is dedicated to providing low-cost treatment to patients – essential because it is estimated only 15-20 per cent of people receive adequate treatment for anxiety-related problems. Much of Dr. Norton's work focuses on increasing dissemination of evidence-based treatment practices and increasing accessibility of such treatments for individuals with anxiety disorders. He co-authored The Anti-Anxiety Workbook, which takes the best practices of clinical psychology and puts them into a how-to manual format aimed at people suffering anxiety disorders.

Dr. Norton is recognized as a leading researcher in the field of anxiety disorders. He has authored three books and nearly 100 scientific journal articles or book chapters. His papers have been cited 1,369 times in just 12 years. His clinical and service work have made a difference in many lives.

In 2009, Dr. Norton received Theodore Blau Early Career Award for Outstanding Contribution to Professional Clinical Psychology from the American Psychological Society. He has received numerous awards and research grants from the U.S. National Institute of Mental Health, U.S. National Institute for Drug Abuse, University of Nebraska-Lincoln, University of Houston, Anxiety Disorders Association of America, and from the American Psychological Association.

For his academic achievement, excellence in teaching and research, outstanding contributions to his field, and care and commitment to people experiencing anxiety disorders, Dr. Norton was selected for the Distinguished Alumni Award by a vote of the University of Winnipeg Alumni Council, the representative body of University of Winnipeg alumni, a group comprised of more than 42,000 graduates of The University, United College, Wesley College and the Professional, Applied and Continuing Education.

THE ERICA AND ARNOLD ROGERS AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH AND SCHOLARSHIP

The University of Winnipeg proudly honours two deserving recipients: Dr. Catherine Taylor, Professor of Rhetoric, Writing and Communications, Professor and Director of Academic programs, Faculty of Education; and Dr. Pradeep Atrey, Associate Professor of Applied Computer Science.

Dr. Catherine Taylor is widely known for work on sexual and gender diversity and social justice within education. As the Principal Investigator of several large-scale research projects that are actively supported by virtually all national, provincial and territorial schools system organizations in Canada, she and her research teams are instrumental in building inclusive school climates for sexual and gender minority students and their parents. These research projects include the first-ever national survey on homophobia and transphobia in Canadian schools in partnership with Egale Canada Human Rights Trust, and the Every Teacher project on LGBTQ inclusive education in partnership with The Manitoba Teachers Society. The multifaceted research approach - involving students, educators. directors and Education professors has resulted in many publications and presentations reaching scholars, educators and government officials and has directly informed policy and law development across the country. Her unwavering commitment to make schools inclusive and safe for all children and youth advances human rights across Manitoba and Canada. Taylor is also a dedicated mentor to a significant number of students, providing important training in research methods for emerging scholars.

Dr. Pradeep Atrey's research is making notable contributions at the international level in the continually evolving area of security and privacy in technology. Designing privacy loss models and techniques to preserve the privacy of people, Atrey is developing algorithms and frameworks for state-of-the-art surveillance systems. He has also contributed in the areas of multimedia security (video authentication sharing), cloud-based privacy-enabled social networking, and secure computation of multimedia data in medical and surveillance applications. His research has a great impact on society and includes a significant number of refereed journal articles, conference papers and book chapters. He has delivered keynote speeches and research talks at various platforms around the world. He is also active in training and supervising graduate students.

For their outstanding contributions as world-class scholars, The University of Winnipeg is pleased to award Dr. Catherine Taylor and Dr. Pradeep Atrey The Erica and Arnold Rogers Award for Excellence in Research and Scholarship.




THE UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG COAT OF ARMS

The Coat of Arms of The University of Winnipeg was officially adopted by the governing bodies of The University during the academic session of 1972-73. The elements found within the Coat of Arms have been associated over the years with both Manitoba and Wesley Colleges, the ancestors of United College. The bunch of grapes in the lower portion of the inner shield derives from the Coat of Arms of Manitoba College. The grape symbol has its origin in the College seal adopted in the charter of 1871. The cross, the lamp and the open book derive from the Coat of Arms of Wesley College, designed in 1897 by Dr. J.H. Riddell. The cross - the symbol of sacrificial service in the interest of humanity - was the basis for his design and upon it he placed a shield - the

symbol of protection. The lamp – the symbol of light – also represents learning, to which the Colleges have been devoted for over a century in the Province of Manitoba. The open book – representing instruction in the way of life and the bringing of understanding to the student – symbolizes knowledge in a general sense, although it may carry overtones of the Holy Scriptures in a more limited interpretation.

The motto, placed upon a scroll below, is the United College motto, here retained: Lux et Veritas Floreant (Let Light and Truth Flourish). The words catch the central import of the lamp (light) and the open book (truth), and express the hope that both may flourish (as the grape) in our country (the cross).





ACADEMIC DRESS

Academic dress originated in medieval times to provide warmth in the damp halls of learning. In its present form it includes a gown, hood (worn over the shoulders) and a cap or mortarboard. All universities have distinctive dress for each degree offered, which explains the variety seen in the academic procession.

The University of Winnipeg academic dress conforms to the North American Intercollegiate Code. All graduates wear a black gown which varies according to the degree conferred. The bachelor's gown is worn closed in front and is distinguished by its pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn either open or closed in front and has closed sleeves with an opening to free the hands. The front portion of the sleeve below the opening has a long semi-circular cut-out. Doctorate gowns also may be worn open or closed. They are faced with velvet.

The edging colour on the hood indicates the faculty in which a degree is conferred: Graduate Studies – red; Science – gold; Education – blue; Arts – white; Business & Economics – brown; Kinesiology – green. The width of edging is determined by the degree: three inches for doctors; two inches for masters and bachelors. Hoods are lined in red with a white chevron

Honorary doctors' gowns are red in colour and are faced with white velvet. They are worn with red Tudor bonnets. The hood colour signifies the honorary degree: white for Laws; golden yellow for Science; admiralty blue for Letters; purple for Divinity. Hoods are lined in red and white – The University of Winnipeg colours. Fellows wear a gown of blue with neither hat nor hood. Members of The University's senior administration wear gowns of varying colours. They do not wear hoods.

THE BANNER

The banner, prominently displaying the Coat of Arms, was unveiled in 1988. The volunteer effort of Pat Corner, Fran Farquhar, Susan Ferguson and Sonya C. Wright took more than 1,000 hours. Over

400 meters of thread and 30 meters of wool material went into the project, using traditional techniques such as quilting, embroidery and crewel.
