HONORARY DOCTOR OF LETTERS

Miriam Toews grew up in Steinbach, Manitoba, the second daughter of Mennonite parents, a heritage that has informed much of her work. She is the author of six bestselling novels: *Summer of My Amazing Luck*, *A Boy of Good Breeding*, *A Complicated Kindness*, *The Flying Troutmans*, *Irma Voth*, *All My Puny Sorrows*, and one memoir, *Swing Low: A Life*.

She has won numerous literary prizes including the Governor General's Award for Fiction and the Writers' Trust Engel/Findley Award for body of work. She is also a two-time finalist for the Scotiabank Giller Prize and a two-time winner of the Rogers Writers' Trust Fiction Prize. She has dedicated time to encourage new writers and has appeared as a panelist and presenter at The University of Winnipeg.

Skillfully and with poignancy, Toews draws on her own life to create art and illuminate the dark corners of human experience. Her father, a respected school teacher, committed suicide in 1998. His death inspired Toews to

write a memoir in her father's voice, *Swing Low: A Life*. The book's insight into mental illness won the Alexander Kennedy Isbister Award for Non-Fiction and the McNally Robinson Book of the Year Award. Toews' older sister, Marjorie, who struggled with depression, committed suicide in 2010, almost 12 years to the day after their father. Toews's most recent novel, *All My Puny Sorrows*, explores the heart-wrenching bond between two sisters – one who wants to die, the other who wants desperately for her to live.

Although Toews is a fearless and unflinching writer, she always weaves wry humour and compassion into her narratives. Her characters are deeply human.

For her many accomplishments as one of Canada's most important contemporary novelists, The University of Winnipeg bestows on Miriam Toews an Honorary Doctor of Letters.



Steve Van Bockern

BA (Honours), MEd, EdD

HONORARY DOCTOR OF LAWS

A former teacher and school principal, Dr. Steve Van Bockern is an eminent academic known for reaching out to the community. Van Bockern and his colleagues pioneered the incorporation of Indigenous perspectives and wisdoms with contemporary psychological research. He is renowned for his work with at-risk youth as well as with gifted children.

In 1990, Van Bockern co-authored the book *Reclaiming Youth at Risk: Our Hope for the Future*, which has had a worldwide impact on educators working with marginalized young people. It has sold more than 300,000 copies and has been translated into four languages.

Along with his colleagues, Van Bockern created the not-for-profit organization Reclaiming Youth International in 1997. Currently serving as the organization's Dean, he focuses on strength-based approaches to encourage positive youth development. This methodology is embodied in what has become known as the Circle of Courage™, a model that integrates Indigenous philosophies of child-rearing with contemporary research and the heritage of early pioneers in youth work. It is based on the notion that all youth need a sense of belonging, mastery, independence, and generosity.

The Circle of Courage™ model has been used throughout the world by schools and youth organizations to build caring environments for all children. It provides educators with a variety of skills and techniques to help them manage inappropriate behaviors and crisis situations in a positive manner. The approach gives at-risk, marginalized youth a chance to succeed via guidance, attention and training they otherwise might not have received.

Van Bockern is also a friend to The University of Winnipeg. He has taught courses in the Faculty of Education and has presented at many conferences hosted by the University.

At present, Van Bockern teaches at Augustana College in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. He serves as Dean of the Black Hills Seminars, is a senior trainer for Response Ability Pathways programs, and is co-editor of the journal *Reclaiming Children and Youth*.

The University of Winnipeg is pleased to present Dr. Steve Van Bockern with an Honorary Doctor of Laws for his dedication to helping at-risk youth and for his pioneering work, which is steeped in ideals that echo the University's own values of inclusion, integration of Indigenous perspectives, and community.

William (Bill) Fraser Rannie

FELLOWSHIP IN UNITED COLLEGE

The teaching, research, service and mentorship that Dr. Bill Rannie has provided over his 40-year career at The University of Winnipeg epitomizes what it means to be a professor at the institution. His involvement has spanned the entire scope of the University. He is a dedicated and accomplished scholar, having published many articles in both peer-reviewed journals and non-academic publications.

Highly regarded as a teacher — both by his colleagues and his students — Rannie aims to make learning interesting and relevant to his audience. His broad expanse of knowledge and desire to share it with others is evident by the number of different courses he has taught, using concepts and ideas that resonate with his students. Rannie's principle fields of research and teaching were hydrology, fluvial geomorphology, physical geology, and arctic environments, and he continues to make substantial scholarly contributions.

Rannie's greatest strength is his ability to understand and communicate with his

colleagues, regardless of their discipline. He served as Chair of the geography department for 16 years and was always a cohesive presence, known for his administrative leadership, thoughtful deliberations, insightful comments and diligent attention to detail.

Rannie has served on countless committees, within and beyond his own department. He was a most able and collegial Chair of the informal Chair's Caucus, while in his more formal roles — such as representative of the Senate on the Board of Regents — he was an equally effective participant. Rannie's inclusion was sought after by many committees, and he strove to make the University a better place.

For his longstanding commitment to UWinnipeg, characterized by his intellectual contributions and truly exceptional service to both his department and the overall institution — while being active in all aspects of academic life — The University of Winnipeg honours Dr. Bill Rannie with Fellowship in United College.

FELLOWSHIP IN UNITED COLLEGE

Dr. Robert J. (Bob) Young is Professor Emeritus of History at The University of Winnipeg. The excellence of his scholarship and teaching has been acknowledged frequently in the past 40 years by his peers at the University and among scholars in the international academy. Young represents the very best of UWinnipeg with regards to its espousal of scholarship, fluent and comprehensible teaching, and a deep commitment to intellectual inquiry as the basis of a making a better world.

Young has been a tireless advocate for UWinnipeg's core values and has worked for many decades to strengthen and support them. The ideal of living in a university community of engaged learners has informed his own post-retirement practice on campus, whether as teacher in our High School Enrichment or Seniors programs, or as an activist in the UWinnipeg Club or the Retirees Association.

Young is a prior recipient of the Clifford J. Robson Memorial Award for Teaching Excellence, the Erica and Arnold Rogers Award for Excellence in Research and Scholarship, and in 1996 he was named Canadian Professor of the Year. He is the author of ten books, including prize-winning biographies of two French political and diplomatic figures. His most recent, *Premonitions of War: The Winnipeg Free Press in the Hitler Years*, was published this year and is being used to generate funds for UWinnipeg Scholarships — including those of the UWinnipeg Alumni Association.

Young's award-winning career as a teacher and scholar includes a distinguished record of serving the University as a mentor to innumerable students and colleagues. His dedication has been of extraordinary impact to the UWinnipeg community. The University of Winnipeg honours Dr. Robert J. Young with Fellowship in United College.

Annabelle Mays

BSc, BEd, MEd, PhD

DEAN EMERITA

Dr. Annabelle Mays is known as the founding Dean of the Faculty of Education. Her tenacious leadership and vision have left an indelible mark on the faculty. She was instrumental in designing UWinnipeg's teacher education program and her advocacy was critical to its evolution from a small entity within the Faculty of Arts and Sciences to an independent faculty offering diverse programs and initiatives.

Under her guidance and via skillful negotiation with the Government of Manitoba, Mays brought full certification of teacher education to UWinnipeg in 1998. She recruited excellent faculty members — a core strength of UWinnipeg's Bachelor of Education program, which is considered to be among the best in North America.

Mays established a partnership with Red River College's Teacher Education Programs and oversaw the introduction of two important access programs at UWinnipeg. The pre-existing Winnipeg Education Centre (WEC) B.Ed program was enhanced and launched by the University in 1998 and the new innovative Community-Based Aboriginal Teacher Education Program (CATEP) saw its first intake of students in 2005. These progressive initiatives target inner-city

mature students and offer supports to enable success while pursuing a degree in education.

In Mays' decanal and other administrative roles, she was collaborative and set a strikingly positive tone within her faculty and the University. Generous with her expertise and time, Mays possessed the rare ability to motivate faculty to engage in research, connect with community and make a real difference in people's lives. Her encouragement and support of faculty members and students spurred many on to major accomplishments of their own.

Mays retired in 2008 after serving the University in numerous capacities, including as Associate Dean of Arts and Science. During retirement she continues to act as a Senior Scholar and until recently led UWinnipeg's Contact-to-Contract Program, in which she delivered guidance on career success to senior students. In 2009, she was admitted to Fellowship in United College.

Mays' vision, leadership and superb administrative skills have left a lasting legacy that continues to influence the direction of this institution. The University of Winnipeg honours Dr. Annabelle Mays as Dean Emerita.



Michael Collins McIntyre

BA, PhD

DEAN EMERITUS

A highly accomplished administrator, researcher and professor, Dr. Michael McIntyre is noted for his outstanding contributions while serving as Assistant Dean from 1978 to 1982, and Dean of Arts and Science from 1982 to 1992.

During the decade McIntyre served as Dean, virtually the entire University fell under the umbrella of the Faculty of Arts and Science. He impressed his colleagues with his ability to not only balance his many responsibilities — which included oversight of the University's academic programs and its faculty, teaching, and his own research program — but to maintain an active role as a leader. Remarkably, in addition to performing duties that today are shared among several different positions, McIntyre gained national attention for the establishment of UWinnipeg's Centre for Academic Writing and developed an accessibility program for those with physical disabilities.

McIntyre also boosted the arts presence on campus by fostering the evolution of Theatre from a program to a department, and by establishing In-Residence programs for writers, directors and playwrights. Working collegially with the departments, he was able to foster research capacity in the sciences.

McIntyre rejoined The University of Winnipeg's psychology department in 1975 after earning his PhD in neuropsychology at the University of Minnesota and completing his post-doctoral fellowship at Cornell University, New York. After his final term as Dean, he returned to the Department of Psychology.

McIntyre retired in 2014, the same year he was recognized with the Robin H. Farquhar Award for Excellence in Contributing to Self-Governance. In 2005, he was awarded the Clifford J. Robson Award for Excellence in Teaching.

McIntyre is currently Research Program leader with the Compassion Project at the St. Boniface Hospital Research Centre. His impressive legacy of research includes more than 40 refereed journal articles and 55 conference presentations and informal publications. He has also served as an Affiliated Scientist and Program Leader of the Functional Neuroimaging Program at the National Research Council of Canada, and has supervised doctoral and post-doctoral students in psychology, neuropsychology, neurophysiology, linguistics, radiology, and physics.

The University of Winnipeg honours Dr. Michael Collins McIntyre as Dean Emeritus.

Mark Golden

BA (Honours), MA, PhD

PROFESSOR EMERITUS

Described as “Canada’s foremost Classics scholar” by The Globe and Mail, The University of Winnipeg’s Mark Golden is considered to be an unrivalled contemporary expert in the field of social history of Ancient Greece, and in many ways has shaped the direction of the discipline.

Described as generous, Golden is a favoured professor known for stimulating the interests and refining the academic skills of his students. His insightful works enlighten a broad readership while challenging and advancing the understanding of his colleagues in the field. His book *Children and Childhood in Classical Athens* is now in its second edition; he has six other books or edited volumes to his credit, not to mention some 48 journal articles and book chapters. In 1998, The University of Winnipeg awarded Golden the Erica and Arnold Rogers Award for Excellence in Research and Scholarship.

His reputation as a scholar is further evidenced by numerous invited distinguished lectureships, including the Stubbs Lecturer,

University of Toronto and the Edson Memorial Lecturer, University of Wisconsin.

His contributions to The University of Winnipeg over the course of more than thirty years have been remarkable in all areas. Golden has successfully combined excellence in research and teaching with a strong commitment to institutional governance. He has served as a Senate Faculty Representative on the Board of Regents, was a regular member of Senate and worked tirelessly to maintain the library as a key intellectual centre of the institution.

He is seen as a moral compass and a stout defender of the principles of academic freedom. His persistent appeal for equity within the institution has pushed the Faculty Association to take up larger causes.

Mark Golden exemplifies the best of The University of Winnipeg and is considered a true “citizen of the University”; the institution recognizes him as Professor Emeritus.



Eric (Ric) Moodie

BSc, MSc, PhD

PROFESSOR EMERITUS

Dr. Ric Moodie has established a distinguished career at The University of Winnipeg. In his more than three decades of dedicated service, he has made significant contributions to the Department of Biology. His notable excellence in scholarship and his commitment to students have made him a highly respected scholar, teacher and colleague at UWinnipeg.

Moodie's career is exemplary in the UWinnipeg tradition of carrying out excellent research in a primarily undergraduate setting. His performance allowed him to secure competitive National Research Council (NRC) and Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC) funding for 18 years, a considerable achievement for a scholar at an undergraduate university.

In addition to his NRC and NSERC research, Moodie carried out work for Manitoba Hydro — investigating walleye culture systems for northern communities — and filed a patent application for a fish feeder that he developed with colleague Gavin Baird. His work is recognized internationally.

Moodie's teaching is well-received and he continuously involves his undergraduate students in his research and publication.

Colleagues and students note his low-key manner, along with his calm and meticulous preparation for classes.

Moodie was integral in establishing the Biology Honours Thesis course, which left a legacy in the department. His evolution of this course has become a model for other departments that wish to revamp honours programs. Moodie's genuine commitment to and concern for his students has created generations of highly qualified researchers in the field of biology and beyond.

He is held in high regard as a collaborative researcher. Scrupulously honest, thorough and detailed in his approach to science, Moodie is enthusiastic about the subject matter and possesses encyclopedic knowledge of his field. He is considered a mentor to young faculty members and his students.

Moodie has conducted innovative work throughout his career, which has contributed greatly to the biology department's success and reputation of excellence in scholarship that reflects proudly on the institution. The University of Winnipeg honours Dr. Ric Moodie as Professor Emeritus.

Richard J. Staniforth

BSc (Honours), PhD

PROFESSOR EMERITUS

Dr. Richard Staniforth arrived at The University of Winnipeg in 1975 with an international academic background and quickly established himself as an outstanding botanist. Throughout his 32 year-career, he provided significant contributions to teaching and research. Of particular note is Staniforth's work on arctic plants in Churchill and his vast knowledge of Manitoba flora. He taught both ecology and botany courses and developed the course Flora of Manitoba. He remains research-active in retirement.

Housed within the Richardson College for the Environment and Science Complex is a room called the Richard J. Staniforth Herbarium. When Staniforth arrived at UWinnipeg, only a few plant specimens in a couple of small cabinets existed. He made it his mission to properly collect, catalogue and store more than 6,500 herbarium specimens over the

decades, resulting in a major contribution to Manitoba botany. The Staniforth Herbarium is officially listed with the International Taxonomic Union and remains a major research and teaching resource.

Staniforth has more than 30 peer-reviewed publications to his credit, has presented at numerous conferences, and has supervised many graduate and undergraduate students. His enthusiasm for plant biology and ecology is contagious and clearly attracted many outstanding students. In 2006, he received UWinnipeg's Clifford J. Robson Memorial Award for Excellence in Teaching.

For his distinguished career in both teaching and research, The University of Winnipeg recognizes Dr. Richard J. Staniforth as Professor Emeritus.



The Honourable JoAnne Buth

THE UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG ALUMNI ASSOCIATION'S DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD

JoAnne Buth has long been a passionate public servant, leader, and advocate for Canada's agriculture sector. She has led departments in Manitoba Agriculture, Soils, and Crops, and spent five years as the President of the Canola Council of Canada (after eight years as Vice-President). In recognition of her expertise in the agriculture sector and her service to the community, Prime Minister Stephen Harper appointed Buth to the Canadian Senate, where she sat for two years with the Conservative caucus, representing Manitoba.

Buth is currently the CEO of the Canadian International Grains Institute (CIGI), a Winnipeg-based organization that works with the agricultural community worldwide in the promotion and utilization of Canadian field crops. CIGI's mission is to create a global advantage for Canadian field crops through the delivery of technical expertise, support and customized training to the domestic industry and customers around the world.

Buth's passion for agriculture took root at The University of Winnipeg, where she graduated in 1976 with a Bachelor of Science degree in biology. She went on to complete a Master's in Science in entomology from the

University of Manitoba. Since then, she has spent nearly four decades working in various capacities in the agriculture sector, becoming one of the faces of Canadian agriculture worldwide. Buth believes it is important to keep a focus on agriculture and where our food is coming from in Canada, as she stated upon assuming the leadership of CIGI: "This opportunity represents coming home to me as I come back to work in an industry that is so critical to Canada and to Canada's reputation internationally".

Buth has served on many agriculture advisory committees in both private industry and government, including the Canada Grains Council and the Entomological Society of Manitoba. She has also served a variety of community organizations such as the Golden Prairie Arts Council, which promotes arts and cultural activities in rural Manitoba. For all of her service to farmers, the wider community and Canada's agriculture sector — a cornerstone of Manitoba's economy — The University of Winnipeg Alumni Association is honoured to present JoAnne Buth with the Distinguished Alumni Award.

Dave Dorning

CAMPUS SUSTAINABILITY RECOGNITION AWARD

An elite athlete, skilled bicycle mechanic and mature student in the Department of Kinesiology, Dave Dorning has consistently gone above and beyond the expectations of his part-time position as the general coordinator of the UWSA Bike Lab, making a significant contribution to UWinnipeg's culture of campus sustainability. In his position Dorning has served as an invaluable mentor, safety educator and advocate for environmentally sustainable transportation.

Dorning began working at the UWSA Bike Lab in 2012, bringing his wealth of knowledge about cycling and repair and his connections within Manitoba's cycling and sports communities, immediately contributing to the success of the newly established active transportation hub. An invaluable mentor, in 2013 Dorning worked extensively to develop a comprehensive bicycle mechanic training program for Bike Lab volunteers. By building the capacity of students to act as lead mechanics in the Lab, Dorning's program was instrumental in ensuring the Bike Lab could better meet its goals of staying open longer hours to provide support to students, faculty, staff, and community members interested in adopting cycling as a commuting option.

CLIFFORD ROBSON AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING

Dr. Beverley Fehr has inspired a generation of young scholars with her passion for social psychology, offering lively and engaging courses at The University of Winnipeg for almost 30 years.

As a full professor in the Department of Psychology, she receives course evaluations that are among the best in her profession — with numerous students indicating they entered top graduate schools as a direct result of her mentorship. Fehr weaves story-telling and humour into her lessons and is widely respected as a powerful motivator.

Her research specialty is interpersonal relationships, and she has built a network of meaningful relations at UWinnipeg. Fehr creates an atmosphere in her classrooms infused with kindness, compassion, and deep personal respect. She always makes time to meet with students outside of class hours to offer guidance, and many return after graduation to further seek her advice.

Fehr's generosity of spirit extends to academic opportunities for her students. There are 25 student co-authors on her papers and even more referenced in her presentations. This is a truly extraordinary contribution to student career development and experience.

Fehr is the Canadian author of *Social Psychology*, now in an unprecedented sixth edition, which captures the excitement of social psychology for students in Canada by presenting the field in a Canadian context. She is routinely called upon to lecture at other universities and at international conferences.

For her outstanding contributions to the ethos of The University of Winnipeg, both inside and outside the classroom, Dr. Beverley Fehr receives the Clifford Robson Award for Excellence in Teaching.

David Fitzpatrick

ROBIN H. FARQUHAR AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN CONTRIBUTING TO SELF-GOVERNANCE

Dr. David Fitzpatrick has quietly and tirelessly contributed his knowledge and considerable administrative skills to strengthen The University of Winnipeg over the last quarter-century. His extraordinary list of accomplishments includes serving on 70 University committees — more than 20 of which he chaired, including the President's Task Force on Athletics and Academics (2008-2010). This task force resulted in numerous recommendations that led to creation of the new campus and community Health & RecPlex as well as the Gupta Faculty of Kinesiology and Applied Health, with Fitzpatrick serving as its first Dean.

Colleagues describe Fitzpatrick as a dedicated and collegial mentor who models self-governance. He understands — and more importantly, acts on — the principle that the collective institutional good is a value more dear than the good of any individual part.

Fitzpatrick joined UWinnipeg in 1990 and in 2002 was appointed Coordinator of the Physical Activity and Sport Studies program. It was under his leadership that the program was officially recognized as the Department of Kinesiology and Applied Health in 2003 and he was appointed the first Chair. He was the Dean of the Faculty of Arts from 2007-

2012, and has served as Dean of the Gupta Faculty of Kinesiology and Applied Health since its inception in 2012.

He led tremendous changes as the department grew into a full-fledged faculty and the RecPlex on Spence Street swung open its doors in September 2014. This facility leaves a lasting legacy for students and neighbourhood residents who now have an accessible and safe place to learn and play. Fitzpatrick chairs the unique Community Access Advisory Committee to ensure that community programming remains a vital part of the RecPlex mandate. He is also integral to the renovation of the Duckworth Centre and development of the Great-West Life Healthy Campus and Research Centre, opening up new academic and research opportunities for faculty and students.

Much of his work has been accomplished behind the scenes in an unassuming fashion. Fitzpatrick has, without fuss or fanfare, gotten much done in the past two and a half decades. For his unwavering dedication, The University of Winnipeg is proud to present Dr. David Fitzpatrick with the Robin H. Farquhar Award for Excellence in Contributing to Self-Governance.

Michael MacKinnon

BA, BSc, MA, PhD

THE ERICA AND ARNOLD ROGERS AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH AND SCHOLARSHIP

Dr. Michael MacKinnon is known for his remarkable productivity and exemplary performance as an internationally-recognized researcher and scholar in the field of zooarchaeology. Colleagues note MacKinnon for the quality, breadth and value of his research contributing to a greater understanding of ancient Mediterranean societies. While many scholars who work in related fields focus on either physical or textual evidence, MacKinnon's interdisciplinary aptitude for data synthesis paints the richest picture possible and gives context to what he discovers through faunal analysis.

MacKinnon has published two monographs, one of which earned him the coveted International Association for Classical Archaeology Publication Prize in 2002. He has authored or co-authored 18 peer-reviewed book chapters, 23 peer-reviewed journal articles, 11 book reviews, 42 technical reports and 48 peer-reviewed conference poster or paper presentations. He has been invited to tour as an Archaeological Institute of America National Lecturer six times, and has delivered lectures to audiences that range from second-graders to graduate students at Harvard.

While the volume of his research output is commendable, the depth and excellence of MacKinnon's work has enhanced his distinguished reputation. He is known in the field as an efficient and accurate investigator, and in academia as a curious and insightful scholar. MacKinnon is also the vice-president of the Winnipeg Society of the Archaeological Institute of America.

MacKinnon began his career at UWinnipeg in the Department of Anthropology in 2001, rising to the rank of professor in the Department of Classics in 2014. He has served as a Malcolm H. Wiener Visiting Research Professor at the American School of Classical Studies at Athens (2010-2011), a Rome Scholar at the British School at Rome (2002) and a Postdoctoral Research Fellow at Boston University. He has also instructed at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and the University of Alberta.

For his continued dedication to illuminating undiscovered secrets of the classical world and his efforts to share his profound knowledge, The University of Winnipeg is honoured to present Dr. Michael MacKinnon with the Erica and Arnold Rogers Award for Excellence in Research and Scholarship.



Jehu Peters

VALEDICTORIAN

A passionate educator and eloquent communicator, Jehu Peters is graduating from UWinnipeg's five-year integrated Bachelor of Education/Bachelor of Science program. He majored in math, with a minor in physics. The son of a teacher, Peters drew on his own experience as a peer tutor in high school when he decided to pursue a career in the field of education. He came to The University of Winnipeg highly motivated to learn, having spent a year in the work force after graduating as an honour roll student from the International Baccalaureate program at Miles MacDonell Collegiate.

Studious and dedicated, Peters continued to work as a tutor throughout his undergraduate career, and as a teaching assistant. He has also served as a mentor and tutor in the Student Success Initiative at Elmwood High School, and is currently working as an instructor for students in UWinnipeg's Access Education Programs.

His many accomplishments include co-authoring a paper that has been accepted (currently in revision) by the journal *The Mathematics Teacher*, which outlines a project Peters undertook with students at Children of the Earth High School. Utilizing

Gephi, a network visualization tool, Peters traced the close connections between the First Nations communities the students came from, and discovered 90% of them belonged to the same large super cluster network of communities. Peters is also proud of how well his three-person math problem solving team performed at the 18th Annual NCS/MAA Team Contest in 2013, earning an impressive tenth place finish out of 83.

The awards Peters has earned include the Joyce Aitken Scholarship in Education, Academic Proficiency Scholarship (Winnipeg Rh Institute), Evelyn Mills Memorial Scholarship, Dr. Jessie Blackwood Lang Scholarship, Allan J. Ryckman Memorial Scholarship, R. Fletcher Argue Scholarships and the Patty Kirk Scholarship in Education.

While Peters is readying himself to begin his career as a teacher, he also has his sights set on graduate studies in math education. A meticulous problem solver, he would like to gain practical experience in the classroom prior to attempting pedagogical research that would involve more rigorous testing of educational theories.

Heather Whittaker

BSc

VALEDICTORIAN

Considered one of the top undergraduate students in Canada working in biomedical research, Heather Whittaker is described as “dynamite” and “explosively bright”. She is a resourceful, driven, award-winning student with a passion and curiosity for neuroscience — particularly the physiology of the aging brain. She plans to become a practicing physician involved in clinical research, and wants to have direct involvement in the care of people with dementia.

Whittaker has spent her last two summers engaged in undergraduate research with a focus on Alzheimer’s disease. She is currently working with Dr. Melanie Martin, Chancellor’s Research Chair and Associate Professor of Physics at UWinnipeg, to develop new magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) methods for earlier diagnosis of Alzheimer’s, a disease which afflicts nearly 300,000 Canadians. Whittaker has published a paper with Martin and has a second one in the works, to be published in the fall.

Whittaker discovered her path by volunteering at Grace Hospital, which she still finds time for once a week. At Grace she

works with mostly older adult patients, many of whom have cognitive deficits, including dementia. This is where she observed how challenging it is to cope with such disorders, both for patients and their families. The experience sparked her interest in the aging brain and led her to a volunteer position with the Alzheimer Society of Manitoba.

Whittaker has earned more than a dozen awards and scholarships. Her long list includes the prestigious Isbister Undergraduate Scholarship; Gold Medal for Achievement in a Major (3-Year), Biopsychology; Chancellor’s Gold Medal for the Highest Standing in Science (a medal for overall achievement in a 3-Year degree); and the Governor General’s Silver Medal.

This fall, Whittaker heads to Europe to begin her Master’s Degree and continue her research in clinical neuroscience at University College London, a world-class dementia research centre.



Catherine van Reenen

VALEDICTORIAN

Catherine van Reenen is graduating with a 4-yr Bachelor of Arts degree from the department of Rhetoric, Writing and Communications with a strong interest in religion, culture and philosophy.

She credits her superb professors for her “successful, challenging, and exciting academic career” at UWinnipeg and she particularly values the lively and interdisciplinary field of rhetoric and communication. She feels her degree gives students “the analytical and practical skills to navigate the sometimes messy and often strange territory of our mediated world with patience, ingenuity, and finesse—even when we find ourselves without a map”.

This fall, van Reenen enters an MA program in Media Studies at Concordia University. ACADEMIC DRESS

Academic dress originated in medieval times to provide warmth in the damp halls of learning. In its present form it includes a gown, hood (worn over the shoulders) and a cap or mortarboard. All universities have distinctive dress for each degree offered, which explains the variety seen in the academic procession.

The University of Winnipeg academic dress conforms to the North American Intercollegiate Code. All graduates wear a black gown which varies according to the degree conferred. The bachelor's gown is worn closed in front and is distinguished by its pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn either open or closed in front and has closed sleeves with an opening to free the hands. The front portion of the sleeve below the opening has a long semi-circular cut-out. Doctorate gowns also may be worn open or closed. They are faced with velvet.

The edging colour on the hood indicates the faculty in which a degree is conferred: Graduate Studies – red; Science – gold; Education – blue; Arts – white; Business & Economics – brown; Kinesiology – green. The width of edging is determined by the degree: three inches for doctors; two inches for masters and bachelors. Hoods are lined in red with a white chevron.

Honorary doctors' gowns are red in colour and are faced with white velvet. They are worn with red Tudor bonnets. The hood colour signifies the honorary degree: white for Laws; golden yellow for Science; admiralty blue for Letters; purple for Divinity. Hoods are lined in red and white – The University of Winnipeg colours. Fellows wear a gown of blue with neither hat nor hood. Members of The University's senior administration wear gowns of varying colours. They do not wear hoods.

THE UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG COAT OF ARMS

The Coat of Arms of The University of Winnipeg was officially adopted by the governing bodies of The University during the academic session of 1972-73. The elements found within the Coat of Arms have been associated over the years with both Manitoba and Wesley Colleges, the ancestors of United College. The bunch of grapes in the lower portion of the inner shield derives from the Coat of Arms of Manitoba College. The grape symbol has its origin in the College seal adopted in the charter of 1871. The cross, the lamp and the open book derive from the Coat of Arms of Wesley College, designed in 1897 by Dr. J.H. Riddell. The cross – the symbol of sacrificial service in the interest of humanity – was the basis for his design and upon it he placed a shield – the

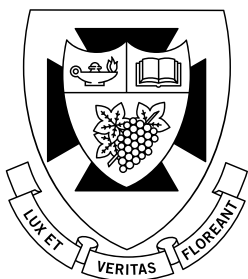
symbol of protection. The lamp – the symbol of light – also represents learning, to which the Colleges have been devoted for over a century in the Province of Manitoba. The open book – representing instruction in the way of life and the bringing of understanding to the student – symbolizes knowledge in a general sense, although it may carry overtones of the Holy Scriptures in a more limited interpretation.

The motto, placed upon a scroll below, is the United College motto, here retained: *Lux et Veritas Floreant* (Let Light and Truth Flourish). The words catch the central import of the lamp (light) and the open book (truth), and express the hope that both may flourish (as the grape) in our country (the cross).

THE BANNER

The banner, prominently displaying the Coat of Arms, was unveiled in 1988. The volunteer effort of Pat Corner, Fran Farquhar, Susan Ferguson and Sonya C. Wright took more than 1,000 hours. Over

400 meters of thread and 30 meters of wool material went into the project, using traditional techniques such as quilting, embroidery and crewel.
