Maria Campbell MA HONORARY DOCTOR OF LETTERS

Métis author, playwright, teacher, Elder and community worker Maria Campbell is a lifelong advocate and contributor to Indigenous and Canadian letters, arts, and politics.

In 1973, her groundbreaking autobiographical novel *Halfbreed* told the compelling story of a strong-willed woman who defeated poverty, racism, and alcohol and drug addiction by the age of 33. It is a book about courage, integrity, and healing. It had a momentous impact on Canadian public discourse and culture, marking the emergence of Métis literature, and is still widely read and taught today. Campbell was one of the first Indigenous women in Canada to write the story of her life, illustrating how much of her personal identity was constructed by racist and sexist external forces.

Campbell was born on a trapline in northwestern Saskatchewan, the eldest of eight children; she had to give up school to care for her siblings after her mother's death. She considers herself first and foremost a community worker and organizer, and is a fluent speaker of Michif, Cree, and English, in addition to some Salteaux. Her first book was published in 1969 and her literary legacy includes numerous books such as *Riel's People: How the Métis Lived*, award-winning plays, and contributions to theatre and film. Throughout her life, she has worked tirelessly with community members, political leaders, artists, writers, scholars, feminists, and allies to advocate for women's and Indigenous rights. She is dedicated to helping both women and children, and until 10 years ago, her home was a safe house for both.

In 2008-09, Campbell spent four months at UWinnipeg as the Carol Shields Writer in Residence, where she devoted an extraordinary amount of quality time giving numerous workshops, readings, and talks. She is known for her caring, humorous, and warm presence. Campbell has received many prestigious awards, including a *National Aboriginal Achievement Award* and a *Canada Council for the Arts Molson Prize*; in 2008, she was named to the Order of Canada.

For her pioneering and powerful contribution to Métis literature, and in recognition of her many talents and how she uses them to forge a better future for her community and country, UWinnipeg bestows upon Maria Campbell an Honorary Doctor of Letters.





Albert William McLeod Honorary doctor of laws

Over the past 35 years, well-respected Knowledge Keeper Albert McLeod has worked tirelessly for the rights of Two-Spirit (2S), lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, and queer (2LGBTQ+) people in the local community and across the continent.

McLeod is a status Indian with ancestry from Nisichawayasihk Cree Nation and the Métis community of Norway House. Known as a progressive thinker and visionary, McLeod has led the way for rights and recognition of 2S people in North America since 1986. Recognizing the importance of Elder Myra Laramee's vision of Two-Spirit in 1990, McLeod has worked with LGBTQ Indigenous people across the continent to organize under the name "Two Spirit" to remember the honoured roles of non-binary gender people in pre-contact First Nations, and the important spiritual role they played within their communities. Since then, the movement has grown to involve organizations throughout North America. It has also made an impact on academia that includes research and scholarly books on various aspects of Two-Spirit history, philosophy, and sociology.

McLeod is recognized as a pioneer in HIV education for Indigenous people. His commitment to 2S people and Indigenous people living with HIV/AIDS is evident in the range of service commitments he has made over the years, including an HIV-101 workshop that he developed and delivered. This education program was instrumental in reducing the stigma experienced by families living with HIV/AIDS. McLeod's innovative leadership led to the development of services for impacted communities, including Nine Circles Community Health Centre, Canadian Aboriginal AIDS Network, and Ka Ni Kanichihk's HIV initiatives.

Last year, as an organizing committee member, he played a key role in the success of an historic event hosted by UWinnipeg: *Two Spirit and Queer People of Colour (QPOC): A Call to Conversation with LGBTQ and Allies* (C2C). He also participated on the Advisory Council to help the Government of Canada develop an apology for injustices faced by 2LGBTQ+ communities.

McLeod's work extends beyond the 2LGBTQ+ community. He is also engaged in human rights activism, cross-cultural training, cultural reclamation, and language workshops, and has served as an advisor and activist for Winnipeg's inner-city community.

For his wide-ranging contributions to Two Spirit people and Indigenous people living with HIV/AIDS, as well as for his communitybased advocacy and dedication to human rights for all genders, The University of Winnipeg is proud to present Albert McLeod with an Honorary Doctor of Laws.

Peter Agre, BA, MD HONORARY DOCTOR OF SCIENCE

Known for his brilliance, humour and humility, Nobel Laureate Peter Agre has a long and distinguished career as a doctor, contemporary scientist, researcher, and educator. Agre focuses on the problem of disease in the developing world. A former vice-chancellor at Duke Medical Center, he is presently a distinguished professor and director of the Malaria Research Institute at Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health in Baltimore, where he supervises laboratory research and oversees malaria field research in Zambia and Zimbabwe.

Agre's laboratory became widely recognized for discovering aquaporins, a family of water channel proteins found throughout nature and responsible for numerous physiological processes as well as multiple clinical disorders. This game-changing discovery earned Agre the Nobel Prize in Chemistry with Roderick MacKinnon of Rockefeller University in 2003. Agre's deep love and respect for humanity is reflected in his continued work to improve the human condition. He served as president and chair of the board of directors of the American Association for the Advancement of Sciences, and has traveled to Cuba, Democratic Republic of Korea (North Korea), and Myanmar (Burma) to help promote peace and sustainable development.

Among his many prestigious roles and honours, Agre has been elected to the esteemed National Academy of Sciences, the Institute of Medicine, the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and the American Philosophical Society.

Agre's continued passion for science and research, coupled with his drive to improve lives through informed policy, has played a vital role in public health around the globe. For his significant scientific influence and discoveries, The University of Winnipeg is pleased to award Dr. Peter Agre an Honorary Doctor of Science.





Colin Goff

BA, MA, PhD

CLIFFORD J. ROBSON MEMORIAL AWARD FOR TEACHING EXCELLENCE

Throughout Dr. Colin Goff's 27-year teaching career, he has nurtured students, faculty, and visiting lecturers — and is known for creating a warm, lively, and intellectually engaging space where genuine learning flourishes.

As associate professor, and more recently as chair of the sociology department, he has established (and encouraged other faculty members to create) innovative new courses that reflect current issues, such as *Animals in Society; Green Justice; Globalization and Families;* and the *Sociology of Genocide*. Such innovative courses tap into students' yearning to make a difference in the world by connecting learning goals to social justice issues. In addition to numerous publications, his best-selling textbook, *Criminal Justice in Canada,* is now in its eighth edition.

Dr. Goff has inspired several generations of students by challenging them to explore important theoretical questions with originality and creativity. His lectures are stimulating and well-prepared, with video clips and guest speakers. To better teach modern policing, Goff went with RCMP officers on patrol in First Nations communities in northern Manitoba. To understand Aboriginal policing, he reached out to First Nations Elder Art Shofley, attended sweat lodges, and invited Elder Shofley to share his knowledge with his students. The two became fast friends.

His students describe an atmosphere in which there is always a steady stream of people knocking on Goff's door, and he always takes the time to assist in a highly professional, compassionate, and respectful manner. "Knocking on his door was a pivotal moment for me," said one student who would go on to obtain a PhD. "That door truly opened opportunities for me that I did not know existed beyond the north end of Winnipeg." That memory is echoed by another student who wrote "Dr. Goff was the first professor who gave me the confidence to apply for graduate school. I can confidently say that his have been some of the most influential classes of my university career." Goff emphasizes to all his students that he is "just one email away."

For his nearly three decades as a motivated, enthusiastic, upbeat, and generous educator and colleague, UWinnipeg is proud to bestow upon Colin Goff the *Clifford J. Robson Memorial Award for Teaching Excellence.*

Beverley Fehr BA (Hons), MA, PhD

THE ERICA AND ARNOLD ROGERS AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH AND SCHOLARSHIP

Beverley Fehr is a well-regarded professor and mentor who possesses a highly impressive record in scholarship. Since graduating from UWinnipeg with the Robson Gold Medal for highest performance in honours psychology, she has continued her trajectory in research excellence. She is an eminent social psychologist with special expertise in the sub-area of close/ interpersonal relationships.

Fehr's master's thesis was described as extraordinary for establishing a new understanding of emotions as fluid prototypes, rather than as rigidly defined categories. Fehr's novel observation was published in the prestigious Journal of Experimental Psychology: General, launching a highly productive program of research on how emotion prototypes influence friendship and romantic relationships. Her doctoral thesis based on this work received the Iowa/International Network on Relationships Dissertation Award. Her 1996 book, Friendship Processes, won major awards and has defined this area of psychology for more than a decade. Her current work is on compassionate love, with a focus on the role it plays in strengthening relationships in which one partner has a severe, chronic illness. She also is conducting research on gender and intimacy in friendships.

Since 1990, Fehr has had continuous support from The Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, receiving \$300,000 in competitive research funding. Her world-class research has been a successful platform that has helped student researchers launch their own careers.

At present, Fehr has 67 publications in prestigious journals along with several book reviews, in addition to her authored books. She is one of the most oft-cited social psychologists in Canada.

Further testament to the respect of her scholarly activities is the multitude of awards and honours that she has received, including Fellow of the Canadian Psychological Association. Fehr also contributes to scholarly editing, graduate supervision, and has been funded by and is a consultant for the Fetzer Institute.

Complementing her scholarly record, Fehr is recognized by her students as an inspiring professor. She received the *Clifford J. Robson Memorial Award for Teaching Excellence* from UWinnipeg in 2015.

Inga Johnson Mychasiw BSW, CACE

ROBIN H. FARQUHAR AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN CONTRIBUTING TO SELF-GOVERNANCE

As the University's Director of Student Support Services, Inga Johnson Mychasiw manages a complex and diverse area that directly impacts how students experience their time at UWinnipeg. Johnson Mychasiw genuinely cares and creates a welcoming space for all students so they may achieve academic and personal success, and she does so with a calm, purposeful confidence that has earned her both respect and loyalty. From orientation to advising, and from campus wellness to graduation, Johnson Mychasiw plays a role in a student's career at UWinnipeg from start to finish.

Johnson Mychasiw has been described as a "servant leader" in the truest sense: one who gives of her time and energy as an employee and volunteer to strengthen the governance of UWinnipeg. She takes on many extra tasks — chairing and serving on numerous committees, including for United Way campaigns, Thrive Week, UWinnipeg Pride, Future Student Night, convocations and community holiday dinners.

She plays an instrumental role in the University's work to address sexual

violence on our campus. She has facilitated the delivery of the Upstander training program which reaches hundreds of students and staff annually. She continues to be part of the sexual violence response team and coordinates or presents at a wide array of orientation sessions across campus. Johnson Mychasiw is particularly passionate about accessibility and wellness services on campus, and capably does media interviews on these topics on behalf of the University. She also was a member of the UWinnipeg bargaining team to negotiate the AESES contract in 2015.

Colleagues attest to a long list of admirable qualities that Johnson Mychasiw possesses: leadership, a positive attitude with a can-do approach, empathy and the ability to mentor and nurture others, efficiency and perseverance, creativity — and collaborative commitment. She is a team-player who sets a positive tone to improve services across the spectrum.

Ken McCluskey BA(Hons), MA, PhD

MARSHA HANEN AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN CREATING COMMUNITY AWARENESS

Ken McCluskey has made exceptional contributions to the field of education locally, nationally, and internationally. As professor and Dean of the Faculty of Education at UWinnipeg, he has devoted his career to finding ways of reducing the barriers that prevent many learners from achieving their full potential. Under his leadership, the UWinnipeg team dedicated to discovering these "Lost Prizes" has inspired many around the world.

The Faculty of Education has grown through McCluskey's vision, with innovative programs designed to address the needs of underserved and marginalized populations. The popular post-baccalaureate program offers specialization areas such as sustainability, counselling, and inclusive education. Working with the Winnipeg Education Centre, McCluskey has encouraged the very successful Community-based Aboriginal Teacher Education Program, which nurtures and supports Indigenous educational assistants as they become teachers in their own right, and he helped establish the Immigrant Teacher Education Program to make it possible for internationally trained teachers to gain a professional foothold in Manitoba.

McCluskey was instrumental in headquartering the World Council for Gifted and Talented Children at UWinnipeg for five years, and every summer since 2013 his team has attracted 200 educators to campus for *Lost Prizes Seminars* centred around the themes of diversity, at-risk youth, and the importance of nurturing creativity. McCluskey has also worked to give students the opportunity to complete practica in many countries, including Thailand, China, and Germany. Many return to teach in Manitoba schools with an enriched knowledge of cultural diversity.

A prodigious writer, McCluskey has more than 100 published journal articles and chapters, and more than 20 books to his credit, including Lost Prizes: Talent Development and Problem Solving with At-Risk Students. He has also generated millions of dollars in grants and contracts. delivered more than 225 keynote and invited addresses worldwide, and received numerous awards, such as the International Centre for Innovation in Education's first International Creativity Award presented by Princess Sumaya bint Hassan of Jordan and the prestigious Albert Einstein Medal for Distinguished Achievement from Ulm University, Germany.

For his transformative educational leadership, the development of innovative programs, and his lifelong dedication to youth, UWinnipeg presents Ken McCluskey with the Marsha Hanen Award for Excellence in Creating Community Awareness.





Shannon Sampert, BA, MA, PhD

MARSHA HANEN AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN CREATING COMMUNITY AWARENESS

Shannon Sampert is a political analyst and media specialist who serves as a bridge between the academy and the community. As a former journalist, she explores the intersections of media, politics, and gender. In her role at The University of Winnipeg teaching politics and in the Masters in Public Administration program, she has inspired countless students to pursue advanced degrees in political science and related areas, or careers in politics and the civil service. In particular, Sampert is a sought-after media commentator during Canadian elections and for her expertise in areas such as political communications and sexism in politics.

Recently, Sampert took a leave from UWinnipeg to serve as the first and only female op-ed editor at the daily *Winnipeg Free Press*. She actively sought out academics to feature in the editorial pages on all manner of topics — from climate change and housing strategies to Indigenous issues. When Sampert returned to UWinnipeg, she took on the position of director and editor-in-chief of the Evidence Network, working with academics from across Canada to ensure their voices are heard in major media outlets. In the past year, more than 1,000 Evidence Network op-eds appeared in major Canadian publications, including *Maclean's, the Globe and Mail, Huffington Post,* and *Policy Options*. This dedicated service expands citizens' awareness and understanding of public policy issues and helps foster informed debate. She co-hosted a popular webinar for academics on how to write an impactful op-ed, and continues to write a bi-weekly column for the *Winnipeg Free Press*.

Sampert is generous with her time, as a speaker who meets with a wide diversity of community groups and organizations, including Equal Voice Manitoba, which helps women who are interested in entering politics understand how the media works. She provided assistance to Canada Beyond 150, a group of early-career federal civil servants who met in Winnipeg to work through issues such as feminism, reconciliation, and the environment.

Leathers was also involved in the decisions to provide Eco-Grant funding for studentled projects to build rooftop produce gardens, develop a seed library, and establish a plastic bag recycling program on campus.

Beyond his work as GESA president, Leathers has been a strong proponent for

studentengagementinand public awareness of sustainability issues. Recently, he was a panellist at the University's 2018 Grass Routes sustainability festival and last summer, he helped communicate UWinnipeg field research to members of the public at FortWhyte Alive.

As a student, his research has focused on issues of nutrient pollution in Winnipeg and across North America. His honours thesis looked at the impact of freezethaw cycles on phosphorous release from cattails in Manitoba; and he is co-author of a report to the Department of Fisheries and Oceans on water flow and zebra mussles in Western Canada.

He graduates from UWinnipeg this spring with a double BSc (Honours) in biology and geography and is set to begin a master's program at Wilfrid Laurier University this fall.

Tanis Kolisnyk ba, cms, ma stars of spence street prize

Kind, caring, knowledgeable, and dedicated — these are just a few of the ways Tanis Kolisnyk is described by her UWinnipeg colleagues. During her 15 years with the University, Kolisnyk has helped thousands of students achieve their academic goals with thoughtful guidance and support. She has been an integral resource for students in the awards and financial aid office, the Aboriginal Student Services Centre (ASSC), and, currently, in the academic advising department.

As a recruiter with ASSC, Kolisnyk went on no fewer than 500 trips to meet potential students in remote Manitoba communities. Whenever students chose to attend UWinnipeg, she went above and beyond to make sure they had the academic, personal, and cultural supports they needed to find success.

She has brought that same level of care into her work as an academic advisor. Kolisnyk is well-versed in every aspect of the university experience and assists students from registration to graduation and beyond. She also provides counselling to students in the Youth in Care Tuition Waiver program and the Walls to Bridges program, which connects incarcerated and campus-enrolled students via classes taught at the Women's Correctional Centre and Stony Mountain Institution. Through this work, Kolisnyk has helped marginalized students see a future at UWinnipeg.

Kolisnyk knows the resolve required of an adult learner, having completed a UWinnipeg Master of Arts in Theology degree in 2015. She is a musician, church organist, and an ordained Anglican deacon who often delivers blessings at campus events and convocation ceremonies.

An advocate for community-building on campus, she is also a proud and active member in her local Indigenous community and serves on the Manitoba Metis Federation ANCR Board and the Louis Riel Institute board of directors.

For her significant and continued dedication to student success, UWinnipeg is proud to award Rev. Tanis with the 2018 *Stars of Spence Street Prize.*

Linda Dietrick BA, MA, PhD FELLOWSHIP IN UNITED COLLEGE

Linda Dietrick is an internationally recognized German Studies scholar, researcher, and teacher who served The University of Winnipeg with distinction until her retirement in 2016. She is highly esteemed by her colleagues and all levels of administration for her commitment to the University and to her field of German Studies.

After joining UWinnipeg in 1989, Dietrick made many significant contributions to administrative service while compiling a substantial record of teaching and scholarship within Canada. Her work stands out as original and innovative; her literary research brought due recognition to many female German writers.

Dietrick has devoted her career to UWinnipeg, improving governance for her colleagues, her department, those in her faculty, and the wider campus community. She has held a number of positions with responsibility, leading with civility and integrity — and especially professionalism.

Dietrick served as Chair of the Department of Modern Languages and Literatures; Acting Dean of Arts; and Acting Dean of the Library. While leading the modern languages department, she oversaw the renovation and beautification of the departmental common room, language lab, and office corridor, which features a cheerful colour installation by the same artist (Rodney LaTourelle) who designed the one in the Centennial-Duckworth corridor. Dietrick was asked to chair a task force (2009-11) that brought forth a wide-ranging report that reviewed first-year offerings, staffing, delivery, and pedagogical issues.

Perhaps her most indelible mark has been on the UWinnipeg library. Dietrick was a member — and served as chair — of the Senate Library Committee for many years, working tirelessly on behalf of faculty to provide support and input on matters related to the library and its operations. She played an integral role in shaping and maintaining a strong culture for books at UWinnipeg, finding a graceful balance of tradition and technological change in the digital age. Understanding the library's importance as a learning commons for students, she advocated strongly for resources to improve its materials, technology, and study spaces.

For her longstanding commitment and contributions to the institution, The University of Winnipeg honours Dr. Linda Dietrick with Fellowship in United College.





Janet Walker BA DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI AWARD

Janet Walker completed her Bachelor of Arts degree in English in 1978. True to her love for and commitment to The University of Winnipeg, she has maintained a close connection throughout her life to her alma mater.

Active in the UWinnipeg Students' Association, Walker served as a student representative on UWinnipeg's Board of Regents. After graduation, she held several positions at the University - in student recruitment and awards, public relations, communications, and fund development. She was elected as a support staff member of the Board and later as a community representative, appointed by the United Church. Her vision and strategic planning were instrumental in creating The University of Winnipeg Foundation: her work as UWinnipeg's director of advancement - in collaboration with the University's Chancellor, Board of Regents, and the Council on Post-Secondary Education solidified the early years of the Foundation.

From 2003 to 2012, Walker served as executive consultant and acting campaign director to The Foundation, and played a key role in the successful "A World of Opportunity" capital campaign, which raised over \$135 million for U Winnipeg.

An experienced not-for-profit executive and fundraising professional, Walker has provided strategic planning, revenue development, group facilitation and communications support to clients in the arts, tourism, education, urban development, and health sectors through her former Winnipeg-based management consulting practice. She also served as executive director of the Health Sciences Foundation and of Tourism Winnipeg.

Walker's experience with The University of Winnipeg's Oral History Centre — working on life story interviews and studies in history and memory — led her to a new career. In 2014, she was appointed president and CEO of Canada's National History Society, an organization that promotes the discovery and understanding of our nation's history through its magazines (*Canada's History* and *Kayak: Canada's History Magazine for Kids*) and website, as well as through the Governor General's History Awards and student-based education initiatives.

Walker volunteers on the board of the Winnipeg International Writer's Festival; as co-chair of the National Conference of the Association of Healthcare Philanthropy; as council member for the Winnipeg Chamber of Commerce; and for the Canadian Cancer Society, National Communications Strategy Committee.

Jillian Sunderland BA (Hons)

VALEDICTORIAN

Jillian Sunderland has a passion for equality and social justice with a proven record of academic excellence. Post high school, Jillian attended Ryerson University in Toronto, to pursue her interest in fine art before returning to Winnipeg for her studies.

At UWinnipeg, Jillian discovered sociology and began to understand her unique circumstance: growing up as a biracial female in a predominantly white neighbourhood. During that time, she experienced bullying and racial/gender discrimination, but through her studies discovered the emancipatory potential of knowledge.

Jillian has a particular interest in exploring the intersecting oppressions of race, gender, and class. This has led to her analysis of Canada's welfare system, the rise of populist-right parties, and the resurgence of white supremacy that has fueled a rising tide of hate and facilitated the rearticulation of white masculinity as the dominant organizing factor of society.

She is an ardent social activist and contributor to social change. During her studies she found time to volunteer with North Point Douglas Women's Centre; the Newcomers Employment and Education Development Services; and Inspire Community Outreach. This past year she co-founded UWinnipeg's Sociology Action Students Group, whose goal is to engage in critical praxis and activism for grassroots organizations to help create change.

Jillian has earned numerous awards and scholarships, including the 2018 Gold Medal for Achievement in Honours Sociology, the Dr. Dan A Chekki Prize for Excellence, the Clem Wyke Prize in English, and the UWinnipeg Retiree's Association Scholarship.

This fall, she will attend McMaster University to complete an MA in sociology. Jillian has been awarded the prestigious 2018 Canada Graduate Scholarship by the Social Science and Humanities Research Council of Canada, a scholarship from the National Endowment Fund, and a generous teaching assistant position to help facilitate her studies. Her future plans include a PhD and the desire to teach and create a more inclusive society.





Tim Ireland BSc Kinesiology (4 year)

VALEDICTORIAN

A former Wesmen basketball player and active member of the campus community, Tim Ireland is looking forward to what the future holds - for himself and his classmates.

"The world needs people who will do what they love and make an impact. Seek out environments that you're valued in because I see so much worth in every student I've come across," said Ireland when asked for his message to fellow graduates.

He is graduating from The University of Winnipeg with a BSc in kinesiology and a major in exercise science. Ireland is headed to the University of Alberta later this year to pursue a Master's of Science in Physical Therapy with a goal of working in the field of neural rehabilitation. He hopes to improve the quality of life for those living with chronic neurological diseases and damage, such as multiple sclerosis, concussions, and spinal injuries.

Ireland is also the Crohns and Colitis Canada National Youth Engagement Lead and has volunteered as a coach with the Special Olympics East Kildonan Sharks Swim Team.

Of Filipino descent, Richard-Anthony Aquino is the first child in his family to be born in Canada. He says that growing up in Winnipeg's inner city, witnessing youth at risk and economic disparity, instilled in him the importance of an education, a strong work ethic, and an openess to diversity.

Aquino obtained a rewarding job as a lead designer with the Government of Canada, but after a number of years, felt he was hitting his career ceiling and needed a degree to advance further. In 2014, Aquino took a leave of absence to continue his studies on a full-time basis in the Faculty of Business and Economics where he was recognized for his persistence and hard work. Throughout his time at UWinnipeg, he has excelled, earning numerous prestigious scholarships and awards, including the Buhler Business Administration Major Scholarship and the Gold Medal for Highest Achievement in a Major.

Aquino says the best part about his years at UWinnipeg was being surrounded by collaborative, intelligent students, supportive professors, and a sense of belonging. "The people are amazing and I had so many resources and supports available to me as a student."

Marsha Hanen OC, BA, MA, PhD NAMING OF MARSHA HANEN WAY

The University of Winnipeg has renamed a prominent corridor on campus to recognize the distinguished legacy of Dr. Marsha Hanen — the University's first female President and Vice-Chancellor.

During her decade of service to UWinnipeg, Dr. Hanen advanced the institution's growth and development strategy, bolstered the University's reputation as a strong undergraduate school, and laid the groundwork for many campus landmarks.

Some of her accomplishments include the signing of The University of Winnipeg Act, the establishment of a full Bachelor of Education program, and the opening of both the Bulman Student Centre and the acclaimed Eckhardt-Gramatté Hall.

She also initiated the process of closing Spence Street to vehicle traffic and secured the purchase of the former Salvation Army Citadel on Balmoral Street, which later became home to the University's Department of Theatre and Film. Her vision and forethought have allowed UWinnipeg to grow and expand in the years since her tenure. Former colleagues and faculty members describe her as an open and honest leader with a high level of integrity. She actively included the campus community in decision-making and worked to promote interdisciplinary collaboration among academic departments.

She has continued to give back to the UWinnipeg community through The Marsha Hanen Global Ethics and Dialogue Fund, which supports faculty research; and the Marsha Hanen Award for Excellence in Creating Community Awareness, which recognizes faculty and staff working to expand understanding of, and respect for, UWinnipeg.

Dr. Hanen is a member of the Order of Canada and an esteemed academic. She has applied her love of philosophy to many different areas of study, including law, science, ethics, feminist theory, liberal arts, education, research and privacy.

IN MEMORY OF BARRY ANDERSON

CONVOCATION TRADITION



ACADEMIC DRESS

Academic dress originated in medieval times to provide warmth in the damp halls of learning. In its present form it includes a gown, hood (worn over the shoulders) and a cap or mortarboard. All universities have distinctive dress for each degree offered, which explains the variety seen in the academic procession.

The University of Winnipeg academic dress conforms to the North American Intercollegiate Code. All graduates wear a black gown which varies according to the degree conferred. The bachelor's gown is worn closed in front and is distinguished by its pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn either open or closed in front and has closed sleeves with an opening to free the hands. The front portion of the sleeve below the opening has a long semi-circular cutout. Doctorate gowns also may be worn open or closed. They are faced with velvet.

The edging colour on the hood indicates the faculty in which a degree is conferred: Graduate Studies – red; Science – gold; Education – blue; Arts – white; Business & Economics – brown; Kinesiology – green. The width of edging is determined by the degree: three inches for doctors; two inches for masters and bachelors. Hoods are lined in red with a white chevron.

Honorary doctors' gowns are red in colour and are faced with white velvet. They are worn with red Tudor bonnets. The hood colour signifies the honorary degree: white for Laws; golden yellow for Science; admiralty blue for Letters; purple for Divinity. Hoods are lined in red and white – The University of Winnipeg colours. Fellows wear a gown of blue with neither hat nor hood. Members of The University's senior administration wear gowns of varying colours. They do not wear hoods.

INDIGENOUS GRADUATION STOLES

Destiny Seymour is an Anishinaabe interior designer who is creating her own textiles that are reviving local Indigenous pottery and bone tool patterns from Manitoba. These ancient patterns have been dated from 400 to over 3,000 years old. Indigo Arrows is a company founded by Destiny that turns these textiles into modern home goods.

Destiny was approached to design custom graduation stoles for the Indigenous graduating students of The University of Winnipeg.

Each linen stole is handmade and block printed in Winnipeg. The pattern design is inspired by the repeated and delicate pattern stamping found on local Indigenous pottery, with colours reflecting The University of Winnipeg.



THE UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG COAT OF ARMS

The Coat of Arms of The University of Winnipeg was officially adopted by the governing bodies of The University during the academic session of 1972-73. The elements found within the Coat of Arms have been associated over the years with both Manitoba and Wesley Colleges, the ancestors of United College. The bunch of grapes in the lower portion of the inner shield derives from the Coat of Arms of Manitoba College. The grape symbol has its origin in the College seal adopted in the charter of 1871. The cross, the lamp and the open book derive from the Coat of Arms of Wesley College, designed in 1897 by Dr. J.H. Riddell. The cross — the symbol of sacrificial service in the interest of humanity - was the basis for his design and upon it he placed a shield - the symbol of protection. The lamp — the symbol of light — also represents learning, to which the Colleges have been devoted for over a century in the Province of Manitoba. The open book — representing instruction in the way of life and the bringing of understanding to the student — symbolizes knowledge in a general sense, although it may carry overtones of the Holy Scriptures in a more limited interpretation.

The motto, placed upon a scroll below, is the United College motto, here retained: Lux et Veritas Floreant (Let Light and Truth Flourish). The words catch the central import of the lamp (light) and the open book (truth), and express the hope that both may flourish (as the grape) in our country (the cross).



TEACHING OF THE STAR BLANKET

Across many Indigenous Nations, the foundational understanding is that we are all related. This understanding includes our relationship to all beings everywhere — and to all things, from the earth to the sky and beyond. In this understanding is that we are beings that come from the stars and our relationship extends to this dimension. The teachings and gifts of the Star Blanket extend from this understanding.

The teaching of the Star Blanket is different across nations. Though the purpose remains the same, it is a healing modality.

From the Ojibwe comes the story of a young baby that had an incurable illness. Her family took her to a medicine woman, who after four days was given the teaching to make a Star Blanket and wrap the little one in it. It was the star people that would do the healing. After four days of ceremony, the little girl was unwrapped.

From the Dakota comes the teaching that the blanket represents the star that we come from, and to be wrapped in the blanket reconnects to our original home and a place of safety.

From the Cree, comes a similar teaching, though the points of the star are different.

Today, the Star Blanket is often used as a gift of honour and recognition of relationships. How honourable it is indeed to be given a gift that reconnects the recipient to the spirit of all things.
