



Advanced Placement & International Baccalaureate

Information for Future Students

The University of Winnipeg acknowledges the hard work required for students to be successful in Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate courses. The University will take AP and IB courses into account when considering: (1) Admission Requirements; (2) Proof of English Language Proficiency; (3) Scholarships and (4) University Credit. Please review this document for further information.

1. Admissions Requirements

Students applying to The University of Winnipeg must complete and submit an online [Application for Admission](#). Candidates must meet the following Admission Requirements:

- Be a high school student with standing in at least 30 Manitoba high school credits
- Have completed five credits at the grade 12 level, designated A, S, U or G level (of which three must be 40S)
- Present at minimum one credit of core English (one of Comprehensive Focus, Literary Focus or Transactional Focus 40S) and one credit of Mathematics 40S (Pre-Calculus, Applied, or Essential/Consumer)
- Have an average of at least 65% on the best three 40S courses including both core English 40S and Mathematics 40S, plus one other 40S credit from a different subject area.

Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate courses can count towards your admission requirements and average calculation.

2. English Language Proficiency

If a student's primary language is not English, they may be required to demonstrate [English language proficiency](#) to be admitted.

You may request a waiver of the English Language Proficiency Requirement by achieving a grade of 4 or high on the IB Higher Level English course, or a grade of 4 or greater on the Advanced Placement English examination (Language Composition; Literature and Composition).

3. Scholarships

Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate Transfer Credit Scholarship

Students who are admitted to the University of Winnipeg directly from high school, and who choose to transfer Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate examination results as credit towards their undergraduate studies, will receive a scholarship according to the following values and criteria:

- \$250 for each AP exam result of 5
- \$150 for each AP exam result of 4
- \$250 for each IB exam result of 7 on higher level papers
- \$200 for each IB exam result of 6 on higher level papers and 7 on standard level papers
- \$150 for each IB exam result of 5 on higher level papers

How to apply: submit a completed Request for University Credit form no later than October 31 (annual deadline). You may submit a request for transfer credit after October 31 but you will not be considered for the scholarship, so apply early!

Eligibility Notes:

- This award cannot be held in conjunction with the International Baccalaureate Entrance Scholarship or the Advanced Placement Program Entrance Scholarship (see below).
- Students who receive a Special Entrance Scholarship may also receive this scholarship.

Advanced Placement Program Entrance Scholarship (value: \$2,250)

These Scholarships are awarded to students who are entering The University of Winnipeg as an Advanced Placement Program National Scholar. Students must write five Advanced Placement final examinations and obtain an average of at least 4.0 on these examinations.

How to apply: you will be automatically selected for this award once Admissions receives your final examination results and your eligibility is confirmed.

Eligibility notes:

- These scholarships may not be held in conjunction with a Special Entrance Scholarship.

International Baccalaureate Entrance Scholarship (value: \$2,250)

These scholarships are awarded to students who are entering The University of Winnipeg for the first time based on the International Baccalaureate Diploma. Students must achieve their International Baccalaureate Diploma with a grade total of at least 30, including the extended essay and the Theory of Knowledge course, and with no grade below 4 on the three higher level and three subsidiary level papers.

How to apply: you will be automatically selected for this award once Admissions receives your final examination results and your eligibility is confirmed.

Eligibility notes:

- These scholarships may not be held in conjunction with a Special Entrance Scholarship.

4. University Credit

Students may be granted university level credit for select AP and IB results in which they meet the University's minimum grade requirement. The minimum AP result required is 3 and the minimum IB result is 4. However, some courses may require a higher minimum score as determined by the university department that offers the awarded credit. The university credit and assigned grade must be authorized

by the school or faculty to which the student has been admitted as being appropriate for inclusion in that particular degree or diploma program.

Grades will be assigned to the university credit on the following scales:

AP Result	UW Assigned Grade
AP Exam 5 & 95% in course	A+
5	A
4	B+
3	B

IB Result	UW Assigned Grade
7	A+
6	A
5	B+
4	B

AP and IB courses will be considered for transfer credit or advanced standing to a maximum of 30 credit hours. Please refer to the Transfer Credit and Advanced Standing Policy documents for further details. The course equivalencies are reviewed on a regular basis and are subject to change. Students with an AP or IB examination that does not appear on the current equivalency chart may request that the course be reviewed for transfer credit. Accepting university credit is voluntary and students may elect to decline the credit.

How to Apply for University Credit

Students who would like university credit for their AP or IB course(s) must first submit an Application for Admission. As soon as they receive final AP and/or IB results, they must fill out and submit the *Request for University Credit for Advanced Placement Courses* form or the *Request for University Credit for International Baccalaureate Courses* form. Ensure that these forms are accompanied by an official copy of the AP and/or IB results (hard copy or electronic version).
