The Department of Rhetoric, Writing, and Communications at the University of Winnipeg invites applications for a one-year term position at the rank of Assistant Professor. The successful candidate will have an innovative research portfolio and be expected to teach a 3.5 FCE undergraduate course load, including first-year writing courses, and contribute to department governance through committee membership. Subject to budgetary approval, this appointment will be effective August 1, 2016.

Areas of specialization are open, but may include the following expertise: rhetoric and composition, technical and professional writing, and teaching English as an additional language. Candidates should have a PhD in rhetoric, composition, communication, or any combination of these areas. Priority will be given to candidates with an established record of research and publication and a commitment to excellence in undergraduate teaching. We are especially interested in candidates with non-academic work experience in professional writing and editing.
