A completed PhD in Criminology, Criminal Justice, Psychology (with an emphasis on Forensic Psychology) or a related discipline is required. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

The Department is a small unit of six faculty committed to a broad and inclusive approach to the study of criminal justice and is interested in fostering both critical and applied scholarship. The Department services over 350 majors, is active in research and places a strong emphasis on teaching. The Department seeks candidates with a demonstrated ability or potential for excellence in teaching and scholarship. A commitment to collegiality and self-governance is also important. We plan to expand the scope of our offerings and invite applications from scholars who can teach and conduct research in areas such as forensic psychology, criminal intelligence analysis or crime analysis. However, applicants with other specialties will also be considered. The successful candidate will be expected to teach in their area(s) of expertise, as well as Introduction to Criminal Justice.
