The Collegiate provides a stimulating environment with dedicated teachers and a diverse and talented student body. Our academically inclined students all benefit from a flexible timetable and the ability to select their own classes and teachers. The Collegiate provides an excellent transition to any post-secondary environment.

Post-secondary Scholarships

Individualized, practical support is provided to students applying to universities. This service includes academic advising; preparation of an academic resume; preparation of entrance scholarship/ university applications; coordination of paperwork and deadlines; and editing of draft scholarship applications.

Seamless Admission

Collegiate students are the only students in Manitoba to be offered seamless admission to the University of Winnipeg. All Collegiate students who meet entrance requirements for the University of Winnipeg will receive an acceptance offer in January. The University processes seamless applications and Collegiate registrations before those of all other high schools in the province. Our students receive their first choice in University course selection and timetable options. Collegiate students do not pay the application fee when applying to the University of Winnipeg.

Scholarships

There are entrance scholarships ranging from \$100.00 to \$1000.00 are available.

Bursaries

\$100,000 is awarded annually to students through the bursary program.

Collegiate Programs

Timetable

The Collegiate and the university have similar timetables which do not follow the six day cycle. Courses are held Monday, Wednesday, and Friday for 75 minutes or Tuesday and Thursday for 110 minutes.

International Program

This year, international students from approximately 20 countries are attending the Collegiate. Through the International Student Program our Canadian students have an opportunity to participate in Student Exchange Programs, house our international students through the Home Stay Program and participate in our working adventure in Costa Rica.

Music Partnership Program

Besides offering a slate of academic courses The Collegiate also offers music courses in collaboration with The Manitoba Conservatory of Music.

Accelerated Status

Grade 10 and 11 students can plan their high school academic program so that first year university courses can be incorporated into their Grade 12 curriculum.

Opportunities

Extra-Curricular Activities

Collegiate students are able to participate in a wide range of extra-curricular activities:

Sports

Basketball, Badminton, Cross Country, Golf, Mountain Bike Racing, Soccer, Track and Field, Ultimate, Volleyball

Other Activities/Student Clubs

Biotechnology Challenge, Choir, Coffee House, Debating, Drama Club, Graduation Committee, International Student's Organization, Math Contests, Mindscape: Literary Magazine, Reach for the Top, Robotics Club, Student Council, United Nations, Yearbook, Social Justice, Video Creations.

Tutor

There is a certified teacher available to tutor students on an individual or group basis throughout the day.

Computers

Our wireless campus give students access to computers in every classroom and public space in the building. Students can access e-mail, net-storage, classroom sites and library holdings 24 hours a day from their own homes.

Career and Educational Counselling

The deans and our scholarship officer help students plan for the future. They help students to complete applications for post secondary institutions and apply for scholarships.

following options:

Accelerated Status

With 22 credits and one grade 12 level course, students may apply to take a partial first year Arts and Sciences program at the U of W while still completing high school.

Concurrent Status

For concurrent status, a student needs three or fewer high school credits to fulfill regular university entrance requirements. The student will be required to register for these high school credits at The Collegiate.

Mature Status

Applicants must be 19 years of age and will need to complete eight credits. This may vary based on individual transcripts.

Regular Status

High School Students planning to graduate from the Collegiate are granted regular status.

Visiting Status

Many students come to The Collegiate to pick up single courses not offered at their home schools. Marks are transferred out to the home school.

Dual Credit Courses

Dual credit courses challenge our students to complete university-level work. Accelerated students acquire a first year University credit as well as a high school credit for dual credit courses. These first year university courses are offered by Collegiate instructors within the regular Collegiate timetable. Dual credits are fully recognized as University credits. We offer Calculus 42U, Human Geography 42U, Women's Studies 42 U, Intro to Computing 42U and Conflict Resolution 42U

Application

Complete the application form and submit it along with a transcript of grades and the application fee. Grade 9 and 10 applicants are also required to have an interview with a Collegiate Dean. There are no entrance exams.
