Web Based Program

Web Based Program courses are available 24/7 and are not normally password protected. The series of lectures stay up and accessible for the entire term. So, you can review them as many times as you wish and as an added feature, you can download the lecture or series of lectures to your portable iPod and study "wherever and whenever" you like. Lectures can be accessed on-campus through the Library or Uplink Computer Lab.

Video on Demand (VOD):

WebCT:

<http://webct.uwinnipeg.ca/> This is another component to the **Web Based Program** courses. You will need to know your Web Advisor username and password used to register for UW courses in order to gain access. Once you have entered your username and password at the link, you should see your course listed in the top left corner under "Courses". It is here that you will get the "official" course outline, course materials, announcements, information and news. Please follow your Instructors' comments (instructions) for discussion, submission of assignments and any tests/exams you need to write.

Student Central Student Central is located on the first floor of Centennial Hall (Ellice Avenue entrance). They will accept course drop requests, take all tuition fee payments, print class schedules, answer questions, and issue Student ID/Library cards. If you are unable to visit the UWinnipeg campus, course drop requests can be submitted by fax at 204.786.8656. Please print your first and last name, your student number, course number, course title, and then sign and date your faxed request.

Textbooks - go to http://www.uwinnipeg.ca/index/bookstore_index to see "what textbooks do I need?"

Access Course - we ask that you access your course and read the course outline carefully. Pay special attention to academic dates and the instructor's directions on submitting papers and assignments.

Test & Exams - test and exams are either online; take home or on-campus. Exam date/time/location is posted on the <http://ddl.uwinnipeg.ca> website. On a case by case basis, we may be able to make alternate arrangements for you to write tests in your hometown. If you live outside of Winnipeg or anticipate difficulties attending a scheduled on-campus exam, you must call Holly Plouffe @ 204-786-9826 (out of town callers may call collect).

E-mail - make sure you have access to your webmail.uwinnipeg.ca e-mail account with the University of Winnipeg. This account will be used from time to time for information purposes, emergency situations etc.

Library Services - get library access and services for distance learners. The University of Winnipeg Library provides services to all students. Growing collections of e-books; online databases and journals provide distant learners with excellent resources accessible from the Library's website. Accessing printable resources is available free of charge.
