English as an Additional Language Teacher Certificate Program (EAL TCP)

Program Content:

- 100 hours of TEAL theory and methodology and ten hours of EAL classroom observation (part time includes five courses, four of which are 25-hour courses)
- 10-hour supervised practicum

The EAL TCP is an intensive program, and students should be prepared to spend evenings and weekends working on course readings and assignments. Our part time option is designed to meet your needs by offering more flexibility and convenience.

Schedule

Full time:

(Schedule subject to change with notice; a detailed schedule will be available closer to the program date.)

Weeks 1 – 6

Tuesday – Friday,
9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.
(4:00 p.m. on some days)

Weeks 7 & 8

Hours vary (completion of 10-hour practicum teaching)

During weeks 1 – 6, students may have to do observation of EAL classes in the evenings and on weekends.

During weeks 7 – 8, students may have to do practicum teaching in the evenings and weekends. Practicum may take place at the University of Winnipeg and possibly other locations.

Part time:

Each course will run once a week, either on one evening or on a Saturday morning for eight weeks.

Usually classes are three hours long with an exception of two classes that are three and a half hours.

Practicum

Ten hours of supervised teaching with experienced teachers provide students with an opportunity to learn and practice teaching while networking with teachers in the EAL field.

Tuition

Full time: \$2,000 Canadian

Part time: \$500 Canadian per course (\$2500 total):

*The cost of course textbooks and workbooks are not included in the tuition.

**The University of Winnipeg alumni discount does not apply to the EAL TCP.

Requirements for Admission

1. Completion of senior matriculation (Grade 12) **and**
2. Successful completion of a minimum of 45 credit hours of university education (or with special permission by Program Director). A completed undergraduate degree is preferred.

Trainees who are non-native speakers of English must prove proficiency in English by submitting official documentation for one of the English proficiency tests before they commence the program.
