



THE INDIGENOUS POLICE PREPARATION DIPLOMA

The Indigenous Police Preparation Diploma (IPPD) program prepares individuals of Metis, First Nation, or Inuit descent to be successful in meeting the admission requirements of police forces across Manitoba. The IPPD program focuses on the academic preparation, personal wellness, and physical fitness training necessary to meet the rigorous entrance requirements for a career in law enforcement.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

The Indigenous Police Preparation Diploma is an 8 month full time program running from September to April.
