Theology 2012 - 2013

Mission Statement: The Faculty of Theology is committed to excellence in theological education within a liberal arts University. We welcome all those who wish to study theology and we seek to empower leaders for religious and social service by providing a safe and respectful environment for critical reflection that is contextual and global in scope and values social and ecological justice. We are shaped by the historic contributions of the United Church of Canada and its commitment to the social gospel movement, liberation theology, and whole world ecumenism.

GRADUATE DEGREES

Masters of Divinity: A three-year (90 hrs) professional degree primarily for those who are preparing for a vocation in Christian ministries in church or chaplaincy settings. Courses offered by a multi-denominational faculty along with those made available through the various teaching institutions of the Winnipeg Theological Cooperative make the program attractive to students in many traditions. A three-year baccalaureate degree from a university is required.

Master of Arts (Theology): A two-year (60 hrs) academic thesis degree for those interested in graduate-level theological study that includes research, writing, and preparation for doctoral study and academic teaching. A four-year baccalaureate degree from a university with a minimum B average is required.

Masters of Arts in Spiritual Disciplines and Ministry Practices: A two-year (60 hrs) academic degree where extensive practical training in spiritual care can be substituted for a thesis. It is designed for those pursuing vocation in spiritual direction or chaplaincy. A four-year baccalaureate degree from a university with a minimum B average is required.

Masters of Sacred Theology: A one-year (30 hrs) academic thesis degree for those wishing to specialize in theological study or develop more effective leadership in ministry. It also provides excellent preparation for doctoral study. A Masters of Divinity degree (or its equivalent) from a graduate university with a minimum B average is required.

CERTIFICATE AND DIPLOMA PROGRAMS

Diploma in Indigenous Spiritual and Pastoral Care: A two year (36 hrs) professional diploma designed primarily for Indigenous people to receive accredited training in spiritual care for Indigenous people in various settings such as hospitals, justice centres, and not-for-profit organizations. A High School diploma (or its equivalent), or two years of related work experience, is required.

Certificate in Theology: A ten-course plus practicum non-academic program for those interested in furthering their understanding of faith and developing abilities in voluntary service. No academic requirements.
