Riverview's 388 beds serve a variety of programs such as: Chronic Care, Geriatric Medicine, Traumatic Brain Injury & Stroke rehab, Palliative Care, Personal Care, Respiratory Care, Day hospital and Special Needs for the cognitively impaired. The Centre's nine-month Chaplain Residency focuses on pastoral competencies related to end-of life and rehab care. ## Courses

Course Tuition Fee (per unit) \$1070.00 + UWSA incidental student fees. International Students have an additional surcharge. **Please see Theology website for additional information about student fees.**

**FULL TIME** or “intensive” Units require that students attend full-time from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily, five days a week for 11 weeks. (400 hours minimum). Some weekend assignments will also be expected of participants.

**EXTENDED UNITS** normally consist of two days per week for thirty weeks (400 hours minimum). They provide participants with a unit of training equal to the full-time unit.

**RESIDENCY** is a full academic year of training (3 back to back full time units) open to applicants who have one unit of Supervised Pastoral Education and the first year of a master’s level theology degree. A limited number of bursaries are available.

## Application Procedure

Contact the Supervisor in the SPE Learning Centre of your choice. Contact information is outlined in this brochure.

1. Request an application for the CPE program from the Theology office, Room 1B01, U of W. On Line CPE application:

Click on “forms” in left margin then look for “SPE” application under *Miscellaneous Application Forms* near bottom of page.

2. Send the completed CPE application form to the SPE Centre(s) to which you are applying. Application for individual units should be submitted at least 3 months prior to the beginning of the program.

3. Since only a limited number of participants can be accepted, applications will be dealt with in order of receipt. A review committee will accept and invite a limited number of applicants for a personal interview to be held at a mutually convenient time. Students applying to more than one centre will be interviewed jointly whenever possible.

## Registration Procedure

1. Upon acceptance into the program, complete the course registration form and, if needed the “Application for admission to the University of Winnipeg” form available from the Theology office, University of Winnipeg, 515 Portage Ave., Winnipeg, MB R3B 2E9 or on-line from the Faculty of Theology home page under forms.

# Supervised Pastoral Education For Pastoral Ministry CPE & Related COURSES 2010-2011

## In Manitoba

The purpose of programs in Supervised Pastoral Education is to assist the provider of spiritual care to become more effective in the practice of ministry. This form of theological education includes developing a better understanding of people, their difficulties and deeper spiritual experiences and achieving greater self-awareness in relation to spiritual care.

This experientially-based approach provides:

- \* intensive involvement with people in crisis
- \* supervised pastoral calls
- \* clinical conferences with other professionals
- \* seminars, reading, worship
- \* theological reflection

These programs are designed for all persons interested in providing spiritual care, such as clergy, religious volunteers, and theology students. Opportunities are available for qualified participants to move toward certification as a Specialist in pastoral practice and/or a teaching supervisor.

This training is in accordance with the standards of The Canadian Association for Pastoral Practice and Education.\* Academic credit is available upon application to qualified students through the Faculty of Theology, The University of Winnipeg. The CPE Supervisors are part of the Department of SPE within the Faculty of Theology.
