**1HOPE WINNIPEG PROMOTES HOPE, HARMONY, IN DOWNTOWN FLASH MOB**

Winnipeg- Hope and harmony came together today in the city's core when hundreds of people gathered for a Flash Mob to raise awareness for a charity known as 1Hope Winnipeg.

The Flash Mob took place at Portage Place over the lunch hour and featured local hip hop artists Sadie and Bubba B, as well as people of all ages and walks of life. Surprised shoppers looked on and in some cases

joined in, as the unexpected sight of people singing and dancing drew onlookers to centre court. The three minute Flash Mob can be seen on [YouTube](#).

1Hope Winnipeg represents five outreach ministries: West Broadway, St. Matthew's Maryland, Oak Table, North End Stella and Rainbow Ministry. Each ministry serves people living with mental illness or addictions, people without a place to call home, or people shunned by others based on race, income and/or sexual orientation.

"Music can bridge so many boundaries. It seemed like a great fit to get the message across that we can all give back," said Michael Wilson, 1Hope Winnipeg spokesperson. "Whether you are 14 or 84, you can create change in your city. The first step is getting involved. Sometimes it's as simple as being part of something that speaks to you and showing your friends."

The Flash Mob danced to 'My World' – an original song produced by two-time Grammy nominee Fresh I.E. and recorded by hip hop artist Sadie and Bubba B. especially for 1Hope Winnipeg. All proceeds from its sale will be donated directly to 1Hope Winnipeg to help ensure the important outreach done by the missions can continue.

"I am grateful for all the gifts in my life and I want to give back," said Sadie, who is also a radio personality at Streetz FM. "Nothing could be more satisfying than the thought of my music sparking change or hope in someone's life. That's what it's all about."
