3. The thesis topic will be chosen in consultation with the department advisor and will normally be taken in the final year of study.
4. A minimum GPA of 3.0 (B) in the major courses is required to register for 4000 level courses.
5. **Cross-Listed Courses:** Students may complete the following courses to obtain credit towards a Major in another department: CLAS-2000(3), CLAS-2002(3), CLAS-2003(3), CLAS/PHIL-2011(6), CLAS-2020(6), CLAS/KIN-2060(3), CLAS-2070(6), CLAS-2091(6)/HIST-2104(6), CLAS-2092(6)/HIST-2105(6), CLAS/HIST-2096(6), CLAS/THFM-2405(3), CLAS/HIST-3006(3), CLAS-3211(3)/HIST-3903(3), CLAS/ENG-3754(3), 3755(3), 3756(3).

No more than 42 credit hours below the 2000 level may be used for credit toward the degree. Of these, no more than 6 credit hours may be below the 1000 level.

Residence Requirement ☐

Minimum 60 credit hours must be taken at the U of W, a minimum 30 of which must be in the Major subject. 2nd degree students must complete a minimum of 30 credit hours at or above the 2000 level.

Academic Performance Requirement ☐

A C (2.0) Grade Point Average is required on those courses used towards fulfilling the Major requirements (effective Sept/88) and those used to fulfill the degree (120 credit hours). Students with transfer credits must attain a C (2.0) Grade Point Average on those courses taken at the U of W that are to be used towards graduation.
