1. Observing: Looking and Listening



Summary

Penguins are torpedo shaped flightless birds who live in the southern regions of the world. There are 19 species. The smallest species is the little blue penguin and the largest is the emperor penguin. Their height ranges from 10 to 44 inches in height and 2 to 90 lbs. in weight. They are carnivores who eat krill, squid and fish. Two common myths are they can only be found in Antarctica and in cold climates. In fact, they are found in every southern continent in the southern hemisphere and can be found in warm climates near the equator.





