INTRODUCTORY COURSES

All minors, majors, and honours in Anthropology require 6 credit hours at the 1000 level: either ANTH-1001(6) **or** [ANTH-1002(3) and ANTH-1003(3)] **or** [ANTH-1005(3) and ANTH-1003(3)]

Note: ANTH-1005(3) is equivalent to ANTH-1002(3). Students may not hold credit for both ANTH-1005 and ANTH-1002. Students may not hold credit for ANTH-1002 and any of: ANTH-1002, ANTH-1003, or ANTH-1005)

2000-LEVEL AND UP COURSES

3-yr ANTH Majors require a minimum of 24 credit hours in ANTH at the 2000-level or above.

4-yr ANTH Majors require a minimum of 42 credit hours in ANTH at the 2000-level or above.

ANTH Honours students require a minimum 48 credit hours in ANTH at the 2000-level or above, of which 30 credit hours must be at the 3000 or 4000 level, with a minimum of 15 credit hours at the 4000-level.

Students may qualify for Winter term courses that require a prerequisite by completing the prerequisite in Fall term (e.g ANTH-1002 for ANTH-2108, etc.)

Many courses at the 2000 level and above are offered every other, or every third year. Students are encouraged to take courses when they are offered to avoid disappointment (courses most likely not to be offered again in 2023/2024 are marked with an asterisk).

METHOD AND THEORY COURSES

All majors and honours in Anthropology require 9 credit hours in Method & Theory, chosen from the following courses.

Minors in Anthropology require 6 credit hours in Method & Theory, chosen from the following courses.

First year students may take ANTH-2200 in the Winter term, provided that they complete the prerequisite (ANTH-1003) in the Fall term.
