Conferences

Indigenous Languages

Senate approved three Indigenous Language Certificates, launched in the Fall.

Land-based language learning grants

As part of its response to 1) the Calls to Action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada and the need to preserve, revitalize and strengthen Aboriginal languages (Calls 13-16); and 2) the United Nations General Assembly of the Decade of Indigenous Languages (2022-2032), the Faculty of Arts is launching an Indigenous Land-Based Language-Learning Fund. This fund will support Indigenous students or faculty members who wish to enhance their language skills via land-based learning, "providing culturally relevant education, promoting opportunities for inter-generational knowledge transfer, and creating safe spaces for healing and learning" (Canadian Commission for UNESCO, https://en.ccunesco.ca/idealab/indigenous-land-based-education).

Support for this fund comes from a bequest to The Faculty of Arts from Susan Buggey a 1962/63 graduate of The United College. The direction of the fund was agreed upon by consultation between the Dean of Arts and the Chairs of the Departments of History and Geography, and the Director of the Institute of Urban Studies, as directed by Ms. Buggey. Susan Buggey was quite dedicated to historic landscape conservation and cultural landscapes and we believe this fund would please her. The Dean of Arts reserves the rights to alter the intent of this fund in the future if it no longer meets the needs of The Faculty and would again consult with the Chairs of History and of Geography at that time.

Land-based language learning grants

Applicants must be Indigenous full-time faculty members or Indigenous full-time students at the University of Winnipeg.

The land-based course or program will normally be a "language camp"-type, multi-day immersion experience where learners enhance their language proficiency in an environment connected to Indigenous culture, traditions, and values. While the program need not be university-affiliated, students could see if they are eligible for transfer credit at the University of Winnipeg.
