
Local and global dynamics in a Roman frontier settlement:

The military community at Vindolanda in the early 2nd century CE

Elizabeth M. Greene University of Western Ontario

Vindolanda is one of the best-known military settlements in the western Roman empire and has continually produced unique and important discoveries over the past several decades of excavations. This talk focuses closely on the extramural occupation at the site in the early 2nd century CE, where houses of very different style and character stand side-by-side and tell unique stories about their inhabitants. The presentation interprets the architectural styles of these structures and the artifacts found within through a lens of glocalization theory, in order to better understand the local and global forces at work upon a frontier provincial community in the Roman empire.
