INDIGENOUS EDUCATION AWARDS

ABOUT THE AWARDS

The Business Council of Manitoba (BCM) established the Indigenous Education Awards (IEA) program in 2001 in partnership with and funded by BCM members, the Province of Manitoba, the Government of Canada, and The Winnipeg Foundation. The award provides Indigenous students attending university or college in Manitoba with \$3,000 to finance their tuition, academic costs, or alleviate other financial burdens throughout the academic year.

The BCM members founded the IEA and have been funding the program ever since. The BCM and its members believe that education is a fundamental right and crucial for personal growth. Education empowers individuals to achieve success and become leaders in their fields and communities.

WHO QUALIFIES

Students who are of Indigenous ancestry are eligible to apply for the Indigenous Education Award if they meet the following criteria:

- You are a citizen of Canada and permanent resident of Manitoba, having resided in Manitoba for the last 12 months.
- You are already or plan to attend one of the recognized post-secondary educational institutions in Manitoba in any field of study. Please visit our website to see the list of universities and colleges.
- → You plan to maintain a full-time minimum course load of 60%.
- You are in need of financial assistance.

If you have funding from other sources, like band funding, you can still apply for the Award to cover additional costs. We encourage students planning to enroll in a post-secondary program or register for classes next year, including grade twelve students, to apply. You're eligible even if you haven't enrolled yet.

WORK INTEGRATED LEARNING

Over the past two decades, we have identified a critical gap in the IEA program, particularly regarding our commitment to economic reconciliation and the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Call to Action 92.ii., whibusiness and reconciliation. While we have provided educational opportunities through the IEA, we recognized that we lacked the component of creating equal employment opportunities.

A 2021 review of the IEA conducted by the University of Winnipeg found that Indigenous students who received the IEA were 3.6 times more likely to graduate from post-secondary education. However, the review also identified a need for better support in transitioning to employment after graduation.



In 2023, the BCM launched the Work-Integrated Learning (WIL) program to connect IEA and other Indigenous students with work placement and employment opportunities in the province.

Representing over 100 leading businesses across various industries, the BCM created the WIL program to leverage our member network to bridge the gap between post-secondary education and career opportunities. This initiative provides students with pathways to explore diverse career options that align with their academic interests. The WIL program offers a chance to secure paid summer employment while broadening students' understanding of career options and expanding their professional networks.

The BCM is committed to being allies in reconciliation. Through the IEA and WIL programs, we will continue supporting Indigenous students with financial aid for education and securing employment as they define and pursue their future careers.

PARTNERSHIPS

SOUTHERN CHIEFS ORGANIZATION

Southern Chiefs' Organization (SCO), Business Council of Manitoba (BCM), and Province of Manitoba are partnering through the IEA beginning in 2025 for students pursuing careers in the health care field. Each year, up to 30 awards of \$3,000 each will be awarded to recipients from SCO member Nations across a range of careers related to health care.
