Leona Josie Hill

Honorary Doctor of Laws

For more than a quarter of a century, Josie Hill has made an enormous contribution to Winnipeg's inner city. Credited as a champion of a distinctively Aboriginal way of doing community-based work, she has proven that cultural sensitivity is essential in community work.

Hill has built an exceptional record in the areas of Indigenous leadership, advocacy and community development. She exemplifies change and advocates for social justice for inner-city and low-income communities and is one of the founding members of Ma Mawi Wi Chi Itata Centre (Ma Mawi), Canada's first major urban native child and family support program. With her commitment and vision she has formed networks to address pressing issues in Aboriginal child welfare and the need for more culturally appropriate emergency foster care, resulting in help for hundreds of families in crisis.

She has worked collaboratively with other agencies in establishing the Aboriginal Visioning for Selkirk Avenue, Community Lead Organizations United Together, The

North End Community Wellness Centre and is often sought out as an advisor to guide others to work effectively within Aboriginal and inner-city communities.

Hill has pioneered the concept of a community taking charge of its challenges and creating opportunities. She empowers those who experience barriers in our society by opening doors and welcomes their participation. Hill is incisive on issues arising in inner-city neighbourhoods and is a collaborative problem solver. She is a mentor that has earned numerous awards recognizing her commitment to community and our city including the YWCA Women of Distinction Award and the Original Women's Network Aboriginal Women's Recognition Award.



Robert McDonald, DLitt, DSc

Honorary Doctor of Science

The host of CBC's *Quirks & Quarks*, Bob McDonald is one of Canada's best-known science journalists and author although his academic background includes theatre, English and philosophy. His contribution to science literacy and his appreciation for science fosters public engagement. He has played a prominent role in promoting science and technology in Canada and has built a career around making science accessible to Canadians of all ages. He makes science fun and fascinating.

McDonald presents a wide range of topics and scientific disciplines with genuine enthusiasm. He generates awareness and curiosity while providing accurate information. McDonald is a regular science commentator on *CBC News Network* and science correspondent for *CBC TV's The National*.

He is known among young aspiring scientists as the host of CBC TV's children's science program *Wonderstruck* and was awarded the Gemini for best host in a preschool, children's or youth program or series in 2008. He is also the author of two books based on the program, *Wonderstruck I* and *Wonderstruck II*.

In 2000, McDonald launched his book, *Measuring the Earth with a Stick: Science as I've seen it*, a collection of essays reflecting on his 25 years as a science journalist. It was short-listed for the Canadian Science Writers' Association Book Award.

He has earned several prestigious awards in recognition of his ongoing promotion of science including the 2001 Michael Smith Award for Science Promotion; 2002 Sandford Fleming Medal, The Royal Canadian Institute and the 2005 McNeil Medal for the Public Awareness of Science, Royal Society of Canada.





Hon. Gary Doer, LL.D

Honorary Doctor of Laws

Gary Doer is an ardent promoter of Manitoba and an unwavering supporter of The University of Winnipeg.

Doer has spent his career in public service as union leader, head of the New Democratic Party of Manitoba, Member of the Legislature, Premier and now, Canadian Ambassador to the United States, representing Canadians on the world's stage.

Sworn in as Manitoba's Premier in 1999, Doer's government blended the traditional NDP emphasis on social programs with an economic policy of balanced budgets.

He was instrumental in promoting and developing Manitoba's vast hydro resources and in 2005, Premier Doer was recognized by *Business Week* magazine as one of the Top 20 world leaders on climate change and clean energy development.

Doer has demonstrated a personal commitment to expanding education opportunities and strengthening education and skills training. Under his premiership, the University College of the North was created and his government introduced a tax rebate for students.

He also understood the unique role that The University of Winnipeg is playing in downtown revitalization and outreach to under-represented groups of students including refugees and new immigrants, inner-city and Aboriginal youth.



Premier Doer's government helped make UWinnipeg's Science Complex and Richardson College for the Environment a reality with a donation of \$25-million to the University's A World of Opportunity Capital Campaign. The Manitoba government has since provided \$7-million in additional support for University laboratories, including a vivarium and greenhouse facilities.

His government was instrumental in providing funding for the repair of historic Wesley Hall and the revitalization of Spence Street for campus and community use. These contributions have allowed UWinnipeg to realize the most ambitious redevelopment in its history.

Doer has also served on numerous community boards, including the Manitoba Special Olympics, the Winnipeg Blue Bombers and Prairie Theatre Exchange.

He is married with two daughters, both of whom currently attend classes on the UWinnipeg campus – one at the Collegiate and the other at The University of Winnipeg.

Rais A. Khan, BA (Hons), MA, MA, PhD

Fellowship in United College

Rais Khan has had a long and distinguished career that spans over four decades in the department of politics at The University of Winnipeg and has made significant contributions to the University's governance and to his field of study. With his tireless dedication and his breadth and depth of knowledge, he has influenced several generations of students and colleagues.

During his tenure as professor, Khan has diligently contributed to the Senate and the Board of Regents. He has taken on key leadership roles and served on more than 80 University committees including those dealing with curriculum, personnel policy, merit, promotion, tenure, appeals, Faculty-Board relations and the committee to draft The University of Winnipeg Act.

His peers have recognized Khan with numerous awards including his nomination for the Robin Farquhar Award for Excellence in Contribution to University of Winnipeg Self-



Governance (1986). He was elected to the College of Fellows; The International Association of Middle Eastern Studies (1986); he earned the British Council Commonwealth Universities Interchange Fellowship, (1976-77); the Asia Foundation Graduate Fellowship (1961-62); the First Arnold Schiff Memorial Award, the University of Michigan (1962) and the Fulbright Smith-Mundt Scholarship (1960-61).

Khan is highly regarded among his colleagues for his work ethic, for his teaching, research and scholarly activity. His exemplary career deserves the recognition that a United College Fellow designation bestows.



Hon. Raymond E. Wyant, BA (Hons), LLB

Fellowship in The University of Winnipeg

The Honourable Raymond Wyant, former Chief Judge of the Provincial Court of Manitoba, has devoted countless hours of public service and creative energy to The University of Winnipeg and the broader community.

He served on the University of Winnipeg Board Of Regents for almost a decade, from 1992 to 2002, and was Chair of the Board from 2000 to 2002. He actively served on every standing committee of the Board including, Finance, Audit, Nominating, Property and Physical Planning and External Relations. In addition, Judge Wyant Chaired the Human Resources Committee; the University Affairs Committee; the Tenure and Promotions Committee; the Executive Committee and the Table Officers Committee; the Search Committee for Dean of Arts and Science; the Farquhar Award Committee and the Presidential Search Committee.

Throughout this period, Judge Wyant was a Crown Attorney and served as Acting Deputy Director of Prosecutions on

several occasions. He won the 2006 United Nations Public service Award for Improving Delivery of Service for leading an innovative, coordinated approach to processing domestic violence cases that earned national and international attention.

He is also a tireless community volunteer, having coached and managed neighbourhood softball, ringette, soccer and hockey teams for many years.

For his many years of wise counsel and sound advice, we recognize Judge Raymond Wyant with Fellowship in the University of Winnipeg.



Jeff Martin, BSc, MSc, PhD

The Erica and Arnold Rogers Award for Excellence in Research

Jeff Martin is an outstanding young nuclear and particle physicist who has already made a major impact in his field of study. Martin's research in experimental nuclear physics is oriented towards searching for fundamental physics discoveries beyond the so-called "Standard Model" of particle physics. Since joining The University of Winnipeg, Martin has been responsible for five significant projects:

- The development of a new ultracold neutrons (UCN) source in Canada
- The first measurement of neutron beta-asymmetry using UCN
- Research and development towards the measurement of the proton's weak charge
- The development of an accurate electron beam polarimetry for the Q-weak experiment
- A determination of the contribution of strange quark-antiquark pairs to the electromagnetic form factors as part of the G0 experiment

Martin is also part of the Prairie Isotope Production Enterprise (PIPE), which is a not-for-profit corporation based in Manitoba with the goal to develop a reliable supply of the medical isotope Technetium-99m (Tc-99m) for Canadian patients.

In June 2009, Martin was successful in a project grant competition that gave him \$4.225-million from the Canada Foundation for Innovation's New Initiatives Fund, the largest research grant of ever awarded to a Manitoba academic, for creating the world's highest-density source of ultracold neutrons. This ground-breaking project will enable a class of precision experiments on the fundamental interactions of the neutron to be conducted with higher precision than ever before.

Martin is not only a researcher of prominent importance; he has served as mentor to several post-doctoral, PhD, Masters and Honors students. He has also provided guidance to summer research students.

The University of Winnipeg is pleased to recognize Dr. Martin with The Erica and Arnold Rogers Award for Excellence in Research.





Donna Young, BPE, MHK, PhD

Clifford J. Robson Memorial Award for Excellence in Teaching

Donna Young, associate professor of biology at The University of Winnipeg, is celebrated for delivering an education that meets high academic standards, with an enthusiastic teaching style that is friendly and engaging.

Professor and Chair of Biology Edward Byard describes her as “a professor with integrity who respects her students. She remains current in her field of study and is versatile. She is always utilizing contemporary teaching technologies and maintains an open-door policy. Donna is always willing to take on extra classes because her care for her students is genuine.”

Young ensures her students understand the material while developing a relationship that permits her to counsel and advise them, which she describes as a privilege. She has created and designed two courses that students constantly seek out and are continuously waitlisted.

Her students describe her as “always positive, creative and fair.” Her classes are always lively and inclusive, and are among the most popular in Biology.

Young is a consummate researcher who shares her knowledge. She has trained and mentored numerous undergraduate students, giving them valuable hands-on research experience. Young serves as an excellent role model for her students and her colleagues.



The Clifford J. Robson Memorial Award for Excellence in Teaching is earned by gaining the respect, support, admiration and recognition of students. Young has earned this acknowledgment, a testament to her commitment, care and dedication to her students and her field of study.

Alan Wiebe, BA, BEd, MEd

Clarence Atchison Award for Excellence in Community Service

Alan Wiebe joined the Faculty of Education in 2004 and took up the challenge of providing mentorship opportunities through outreach to the community. In his unique role as Mentorship Program Coordinator, Professor Alan Wiebe has devoted his talent and energies to creating projects that reach specific “at-risk” youth, including Aboriginal teens, war-affected youth, economically disadvantaged young people, talented but troubled students and youth in the criminal justice system.

Wiebe has been instrumental in building UWinnipeg into a leader in Canada and into being the only place in Manitoba that recognizes mentoring and provides credit for it as a skill within the teaching degree program.

“Mentoring is about developing a non-judgmental relationship,” said Wiebe. “We go on a journey together with students and they set their own goals. Achieving those goals is success. For students who are at risk of disengaging, mentoring is an approach that works.”

Wiebe’s community outreach initiatives include working with recent immigrant children in partnership with the Spence Neighbourhood Association; mentoring newcomers at Daniel MacIntyre Collegiate and at UWinnipeg’s Global Welcome Centre; helping at-risk street youth on Selkirk Avenue and at Sisler High School. Currently in development, the mentorship program will be adapted to

assist incarcerated youth at the Manitoba Youth Centre.

In July 2008, the book *Mentoring in a Canadian Context* was released by four UWinnipeg professors (Alan Wiebe, Ken McCluskey, Philip Baker and Kevin Lamoureux) outlining the belief that all children deserve to be engaged, challenged and supported, and that teachers can play a vital role in preventing youth from falling between the cracks.

“Many youth don’t have a sense of belonging at home or in school,” said Wiebe. “Kids who are not connected to their worlds are vulnerable. They need to feel they have something to give.”

Internationally, Wiebe has presented at The World Council for Gifted and Talented Conferences in Vancouver (2009) and Nairobi, Kenya (2010). He also presented at the International Centre for Excellence in Education in Ulm, Germany (2009).

The University of Winnipeg is proud to present Alan Wiebe with the Clarence Atchison Award for Excellence in Community Service.





Nick Ternette, BA

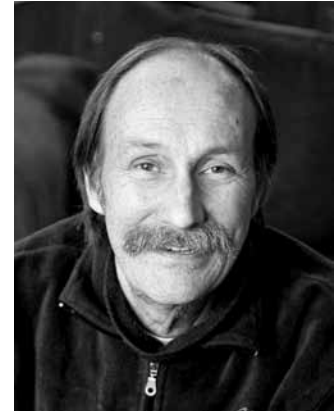
The Distinguished Alumni Award

Political activist, social advocate, journalist and volunteer. Nick Ternette has dedicated much of his life to the fight for fair treatment and justice for all. For 40 years, he has challenged social norms and all levels of government through direct, participatory democracy, and in the process successfully refuted the notion that only politicians and insiders can participate in political debates and influence their outcomes.

Born in Germany in 1945, Ternette immigrated to Canada at the age of ten. He grew up in Winnipeg's West End. As a student at The University of Winnipeg he served as the assistant editor of *The Uniter* and became actively involved in the University community. He graduated in 1967 and maintained a strong connection to the University. In 2007 he was the organizer for the 40th reunion celebration of the Class of '67. He has also been a visiting lecturer in the faculties of Sociology and Education. A proponent of oral history, he has recorded his personal recollections at The University of Winnipeg.

For many years, Ternette has worked at Winnipeg Harvest in the areas of public education and advocacy and as a hands-on team member, preparing food hampers for families in need. With his insight and knowledge, he has made the lives of low-income people better.

In addition to writing a weekly column, Ternette has been a radio and cable-access television host, and associate editor of *Canadian Dimension* and *City Magazine*. As a journalist, he has been a dedicated analyst of the municipal political scene, and through his experiences as a candidate, he illuminated the political process for a wide audience.



In 2009, Ternette became gravely ill. He spent several months in the hospital and lost both legs to amputation necessitated by flesh-eating disease. After his rehabilitation and release he adjusted to using a wheelchair. In a candid series of articles, he shared these experiences with Winnipeggers.

In 2010, after countless speeches at City Hall, Ternette announced his retirement from city politics. He continues to publish his own weekly electronic newsletter *The Ternette Report* and is working on a variety of projects, including an autobiography. He remains an advocate for those whose voices may otherwise not be heard.

Soma Café

Campus Sustainability Recognition Award

Soma Café, managed by The University of Winnipeg Student's Association, pioneered the use of compostable take-out containers and local-sourcing of food on campus, making a significant contribution to the environmental sustainability of The University of Winnipeg. By attracting volunteers from the community to help bake goods made from local gardens, providing student jobs, serving fair-trade coffee, and regularly donating products to events that take place on campus and in the community, Soma has also contributed to the social sustainability of The University of Winnipeg.

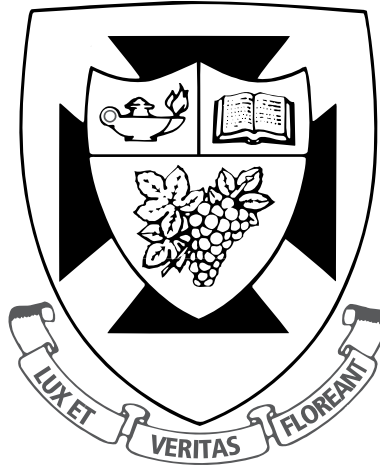

The University of Winnipeg Coat of Arms

The Coat of Arms of The University of Winnipeg was officially adopted by the governing bodies of the University during the academic session of 1972-73. The elements found within the Coat of Arms have been associated over the years with both Manitoba and Wesley Colleges, the ancestors of United College. The bunch of grapes in the lower portion of the inner shield derives from the Coat of Arms of Manitoba College. The cross, the lamp, and the open book derive from the Coat of Arms of Wesley College, designed in 1897 by Dr. J.H. Riddell. The cross, the symbol of sacrificial service in the interest of humanity, was the basis for his design and upon it he placed a shield, the symbol of protection. The lamp, the symbol of light, also represents learning, to which the Colleges have been devoted to for over a century in the Province of Manitoba. The open book, representing instruction in the way of life and the bringing of understanding to the student, symbolizes knowledge in a general sense, although it may carry overtones of the Holy Scriptures in a more limited interpretation.

The motto, placed upon a scroll below, is the United College motto, her retained: Lux et Veritas Floreant (Let Light and Truth Flourish). The words catch the central import of the lamp (light) and the open book (truth), and express the hope that both may flourish (as the grape) in our country (the cross).



Academic Dress

Academic dress originated in medieval times to provide warmth in the damp halls of learning. In its present form it includes a gown, hood (worn over the shoulders), and a cap or mortarboard. All universities have distinctive dress for each degree offered which explains the variety seen in the academic procession.

University of Winnipeg academic dress conforms to the North American Intercollegiate Code. All graduates wear a black gown which varies according to the degree conferred. The bachelor's gown is worn closed in front and is distinguished by its pointed sleeves. The master's gown is designed to be worn either open or closed in front and has closed sleeves with an opening to free the hands. The front portion of the sleeve below the opening has a long semi-circular cut-out. Doctorate gowns also may be worn open or closed. They are faced with velvet.

The edging colour on the hood indicates the faculty in which a degree is conferred: Theology – red; Science – gold; Education – blue; Arts – white. The width of edging is determined by the degree: three inches for doctors; two inches for masters and bachelors. Hoods are lined in red with a white chevron.

Honorary doctors' gowns are red in colour and are faced with white velvet. They are worn with red Tudor bonnets. The hood colour signifies the honorary degree: white for Laws; golden yellow for Science; admiralty blue for Letters; purple for Divinity. Hoods are lined in red and white, The University of Winnipeg colours. Fellows wear a gown of blue with neither hat nor hood. Members of the University's senior administration wear gowns of varying colours. They do not wear hoods.

The Banner

The banner, prominently displaying the Coat of Arms, was unveiled in 1988. The volunteer effort of Pat Corner, Fran Farquhar, Susan Ferguson, and Sonya C. Wright took more than 1,000 hours. Over 400 meters of thread and 30 meters of wool material went into the project using traditional techniques such as quilting, embroidery, and crewel.
