Eligibility Criteria

Nominees must have:

- a) completed a minimum of 18 credit hours and a maximum of 93 by August 31 in the Integrated B.Ed./BA, B.Ed/BPHE, or B.Ed./BSc Program (including students in WEC, CATEP and RRC Programs)
 - b) a GPA of 3.0 or higher
 - c) demonstrated qualities of leadership verified by a letter of reference

Application Instructions

I. Description of Leadership Qualities and Accomplishments (maximum 500 words or 2 pages)

Write a one to two page statement of your leadership qualities using your high school and/or university activities and accomplishments to support the self-assessment.

For the purposes of this scholarship, leadership activities are generally those that are being performed for the betterment of a group or community. Leaders see a need and take the initiative to make something happen. They speak for or influence others on a particular need or issue and motivate change.

Examples of students who score high in leadership are those who:

- a) may have served on students committees. For example, they were on the high school Safe Grad Committee or they belong to a university Students' Association.
- b) may serve in some capacity on a community board or committee. For example, they serve on the board of their local Community Club.
- c) may have created or organized events, clubs or projects. For example, they created and managed a fundraising project.

- d) act as a mentor or role model for others in a formal capacity. For example, they present publicly on behalf of a group they belong to.
- e) have actively developed their skills through leadership programs and training and/or had their leadership skills recognized in some official way. For example, they have been chosen by their peers to represent them.

II. Leadership Reference Letter (maximum 500 words or 2 pages)

This letter should be written by someone who can attest to your leadership qualities and verify your activities and accomplishments. Candidates should not submit reference letters from immediate or extended family members. The reference letter should be included with your application. It should be in a sealed envelope with the signature of the referee written across the flap of the envelope once sealed.

Note: Extraneous items will be disregarded and discarded.
