Academic Writing

- Need a minimum grade of C+ for the BUS 3000 level course prerequisite

BUS 2000 level prerequisites – minimum C+ grade in the following courses:

- BUS 1201 – Intro to Business 1
- BUS 1202 – Intro to Business 2
- Math 1301 – Applied Math for Bus & Admin or ECON 1201 – Quantitative Methods for Econ & Bus

BUS 3000 level prerequisites

- Requires a combination of BUS 2000 level fundamental classes with a minimum grade of C+ in each of the prerequisite courses.
- BUS 2000 level fundamental classes are BUS 2002 or BUS 2010, BUS 2103, BUS 2210, BUS 2440, BUS 2501.

Accounting Concentration has extra 2000 level prerequisites

- BUS 2002 (not BUS 2010) – Financial Accounting
- BUS 2003 – Managerial Accounting
- BUS/ECON 2819 – Corporate Finance 1
- BUS/ECON 2820 – Corporate Finance 2

Note: *STAT 1301 or STAT 1401 is needed with a C+ for BUS/ECON 2819*

What is the difference between a major and concentration in the Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA)?

- Students in the BBA are doing a major in Business. Within the 4 Year BBA, you can declare 1 or 2 concentration areas.
- The concentration areas (can link to BBA Concentration Area Descriptions pdf file) are:
 - Accounting
 - Human Resource Management & Organizational Behaviour
 - Marketing
 - Operations and Supply Chain Management
 - International Business

Is there a maximum # of 1000 level courses?

- Yes – 42 credit hours
 - 42 credit hours = 14 – 3 credit hours courses
 - Your BBA degree requires 21 credit hours at the 1000 level. These are BUS 1201, BUS 1202, ECON 1102, ECON 1103, ACS 1803, MATH 1301/ECON 1201 and Academic Writing (RHET 1104 or RHET 1105).
 - That leaves you with only 21 credit hours at the 1000 level for requirements like humanities requirement, indigenous course requirement, science requirement, social science requirement and general electives. So be careful when picking your courses. There are courses available at the 2000 level or above that do not need prerequisites.
