The FBE tries to make it easy for our students to get involved. We share opportunities in our weekly newsletter, on our social media sites, and on TV monitors throughout the Buhler Centre. The University of Winnipeg events calendar is also a great resource for academic dates, deadlines, health and wellness events and more.

Ask For Help

Student life can be stressful. The University has health and wellness supports available to you. UWinnipeg also tries to keep class sizes small, providing you the opportunity to get to know your professors. Check your course outlines for your instructors' office hours and ask for advice or additional support from them if needed. Form study groups, seek out tutoring (in the FBE, tutoring is run through the Golden Key Honour Society), and be proactive in your education. If finances are of concern, you may wish to look into experiential learning opportunities, like our Co-op Education Program that allows you to gain paid work experience in your field, or get in touch with the Awards and Financial Aid Office to see which scholarships, bursaries and/or awards you may qualify for.
