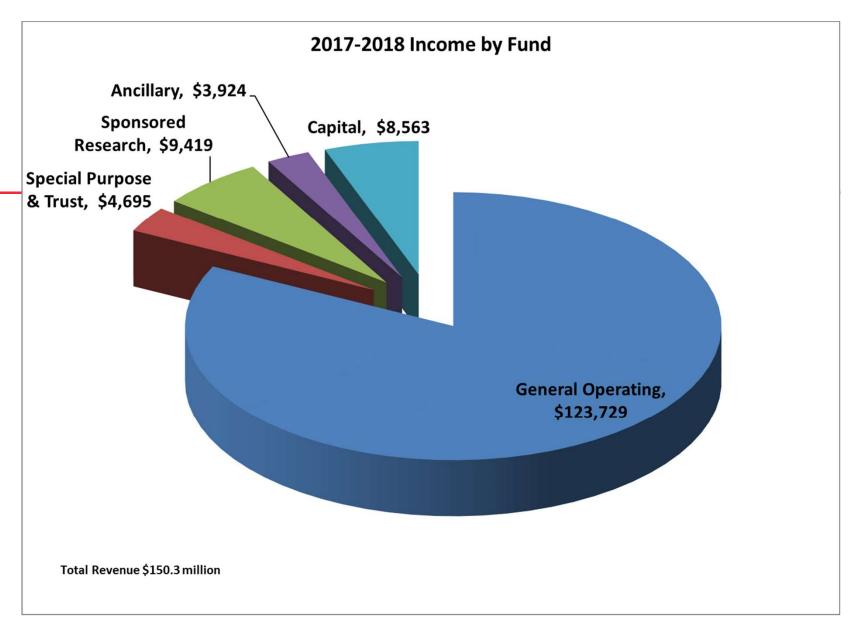
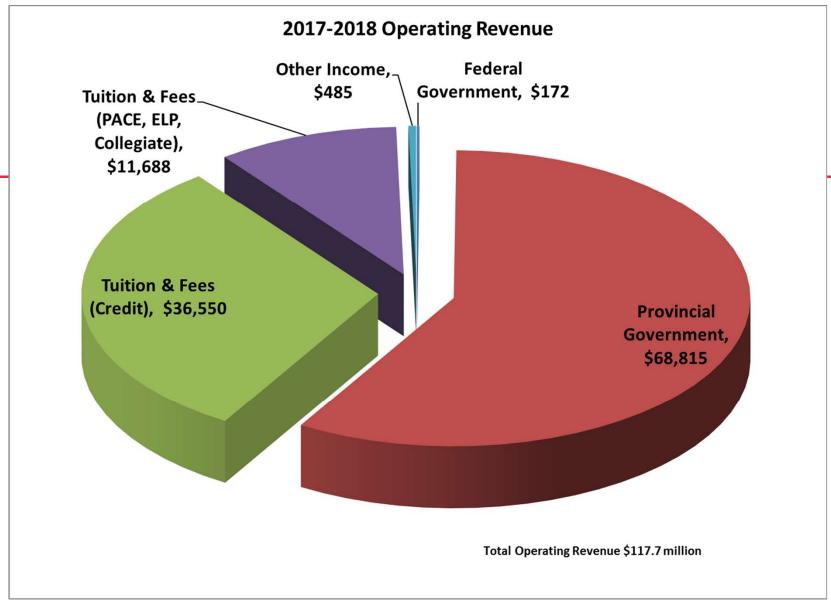

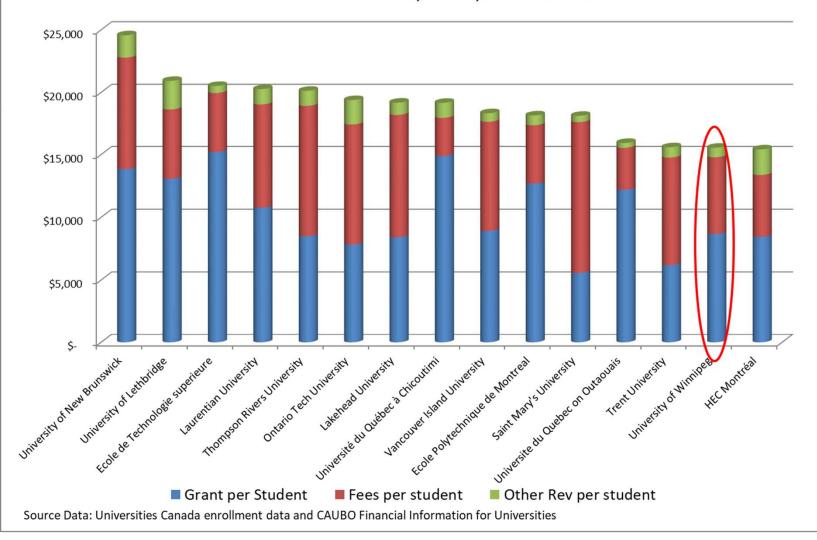






#### Revenue per Student 2017-2018

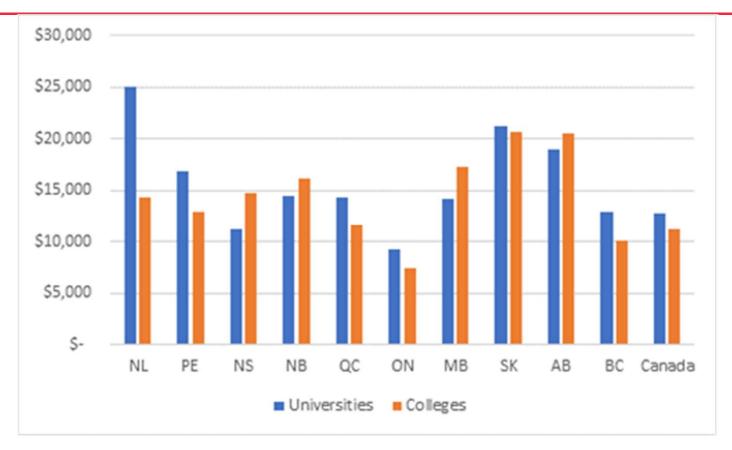
Canadian Universities with 5,000 - 10,000 FTE Students



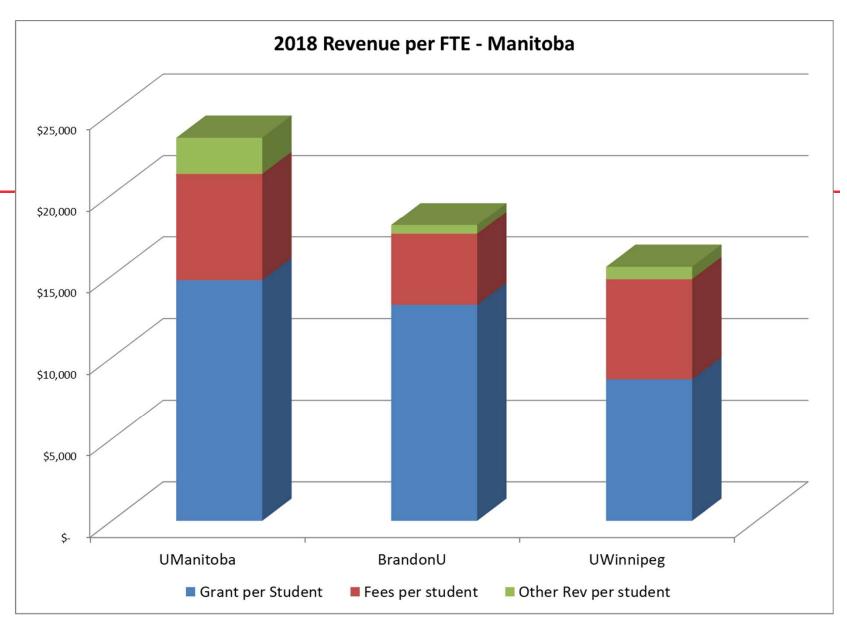


#### **Provincial Government Expenditures per-student, by Institution Type, 2016-17**

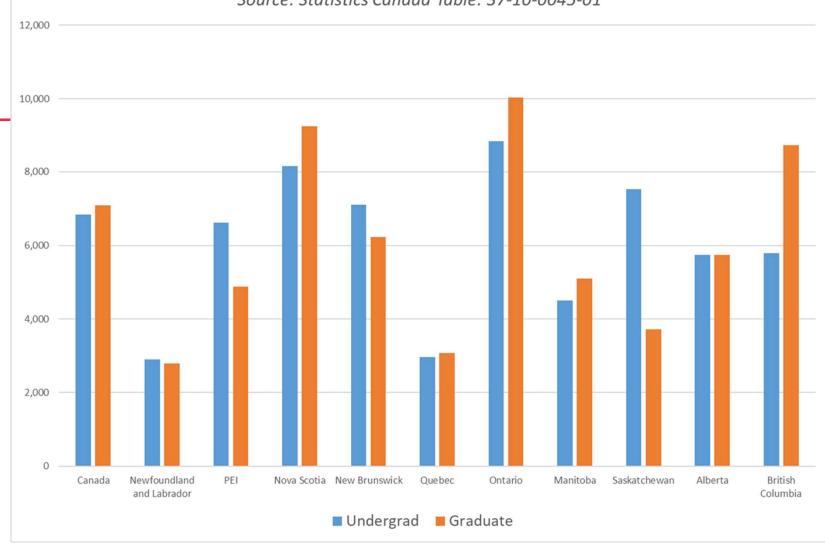




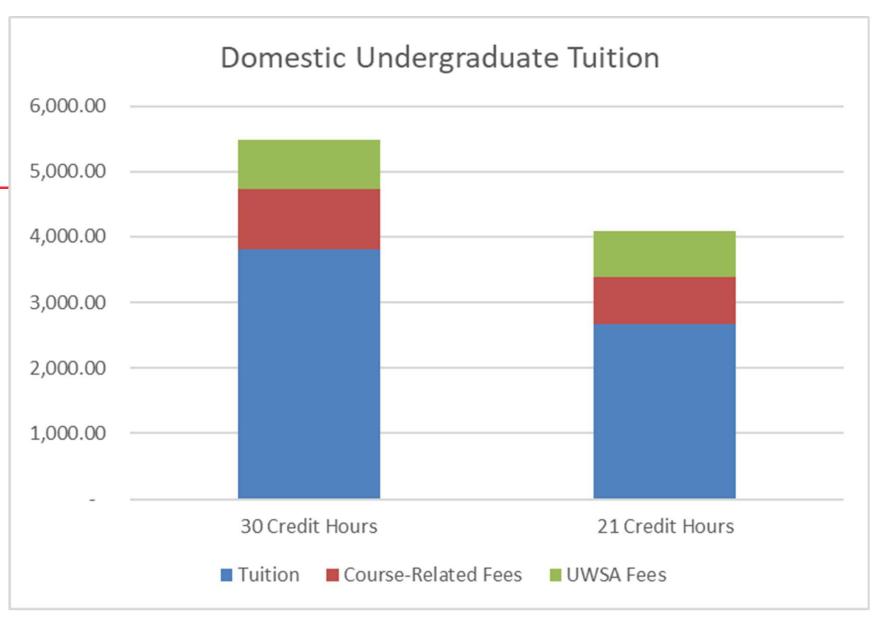


#### Domestic Tuition 2018-2019

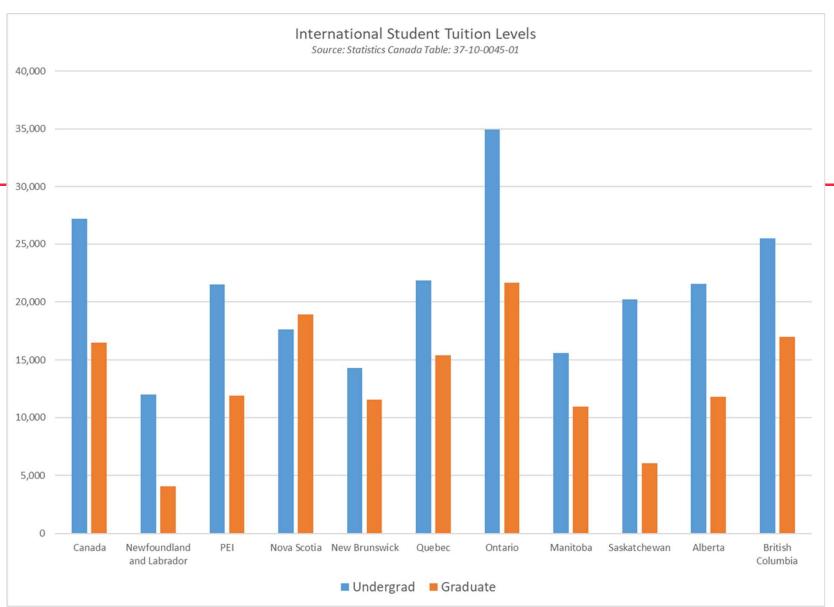

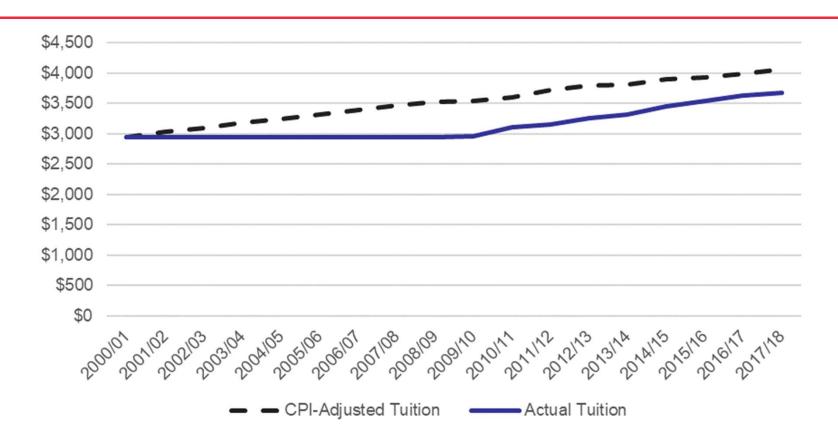




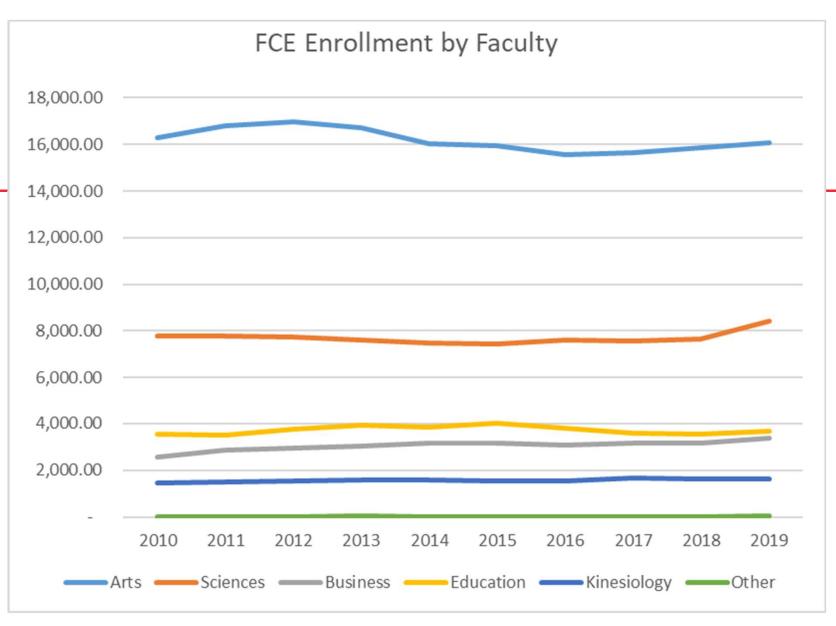




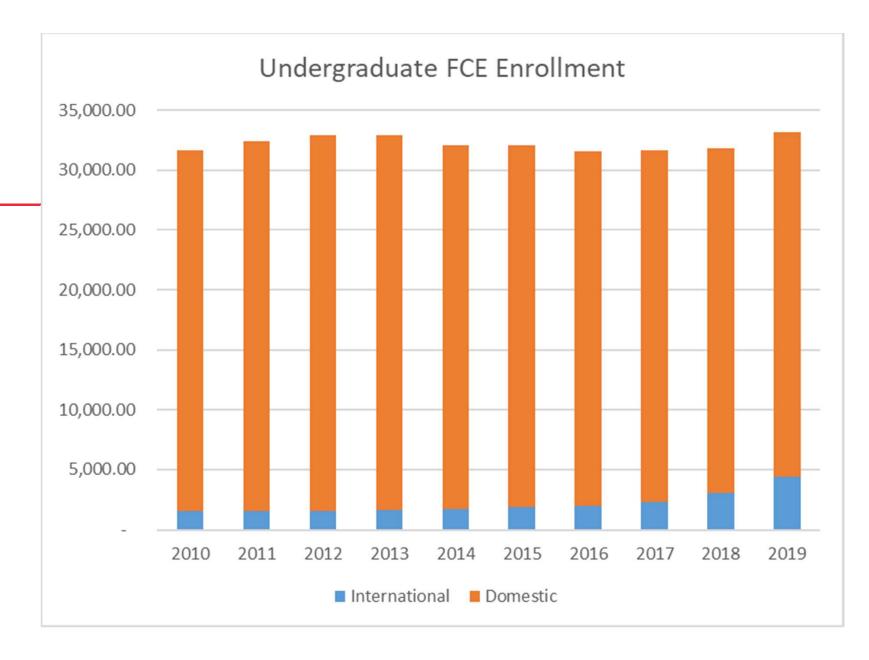
## **Tuition Increases versus Inflation**



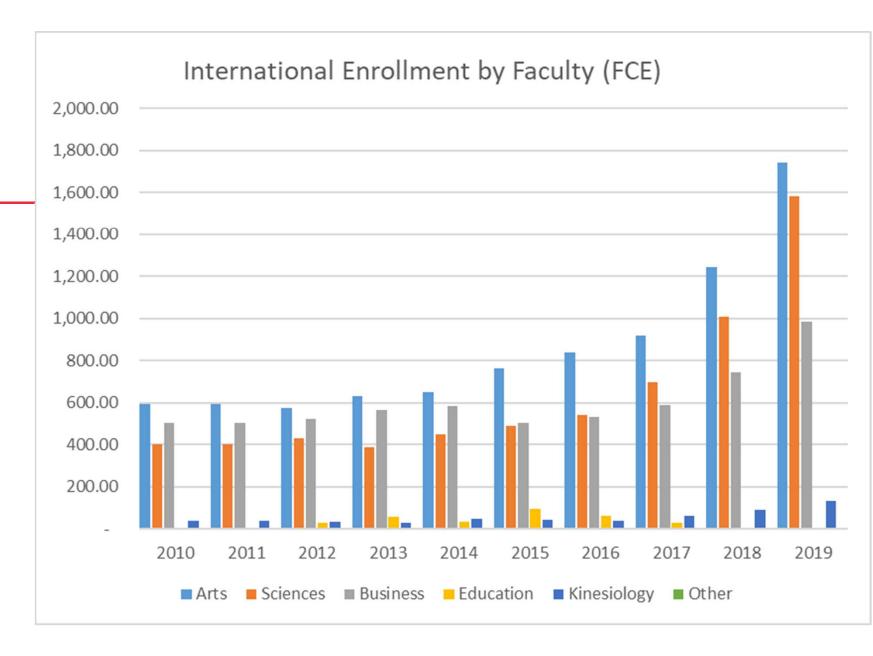






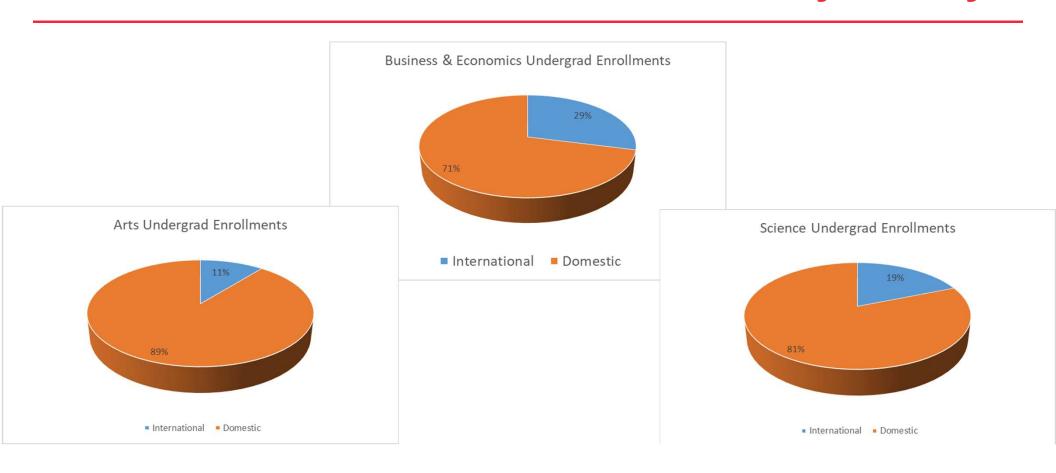




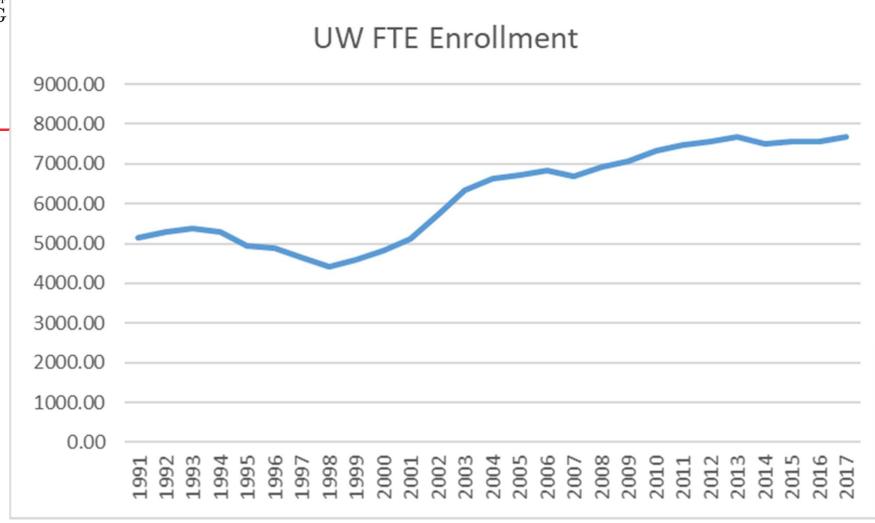




## International Enrollments as % of FCEs by Faculty



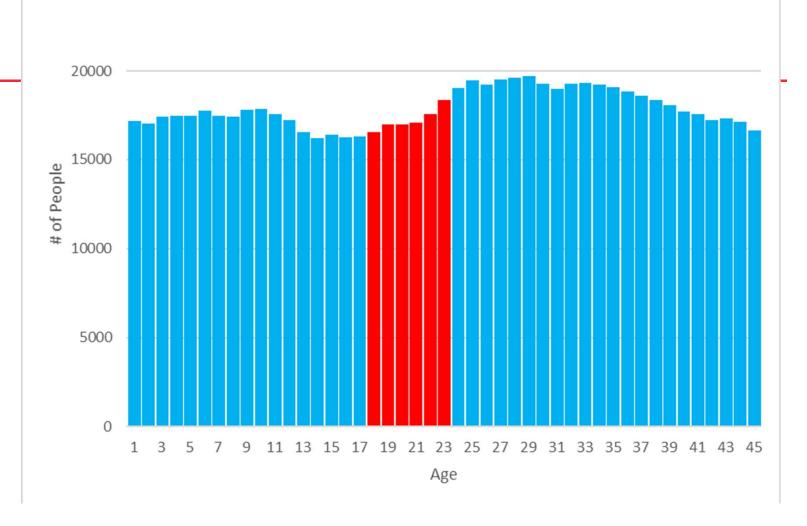




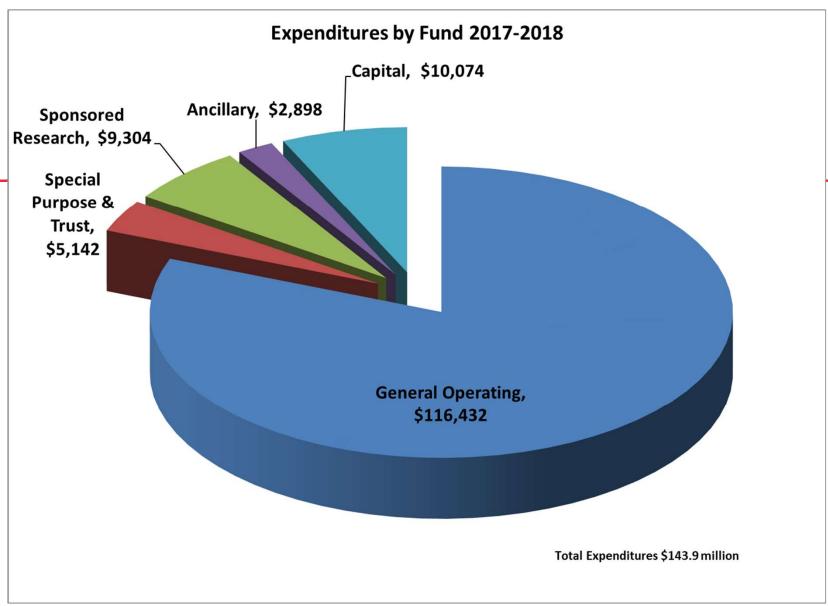

## 2018 Manitoba Population by age

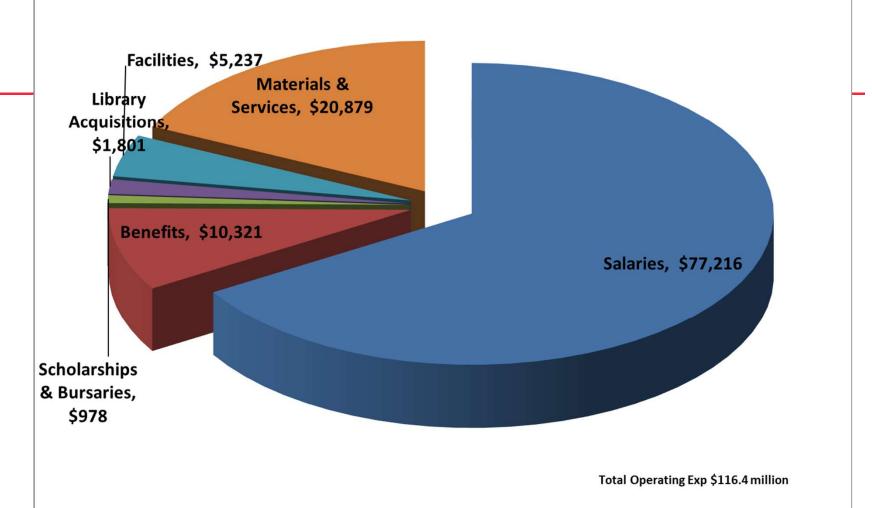




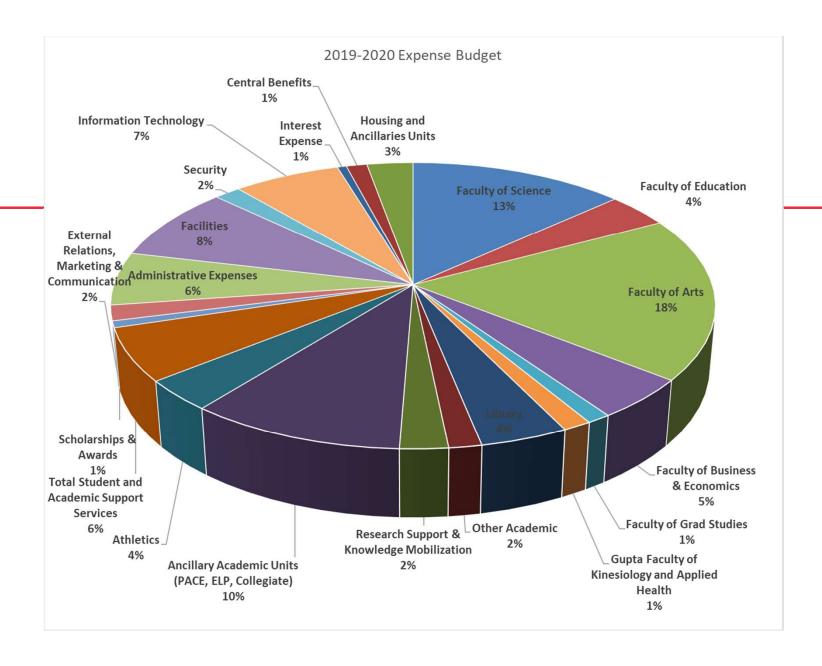




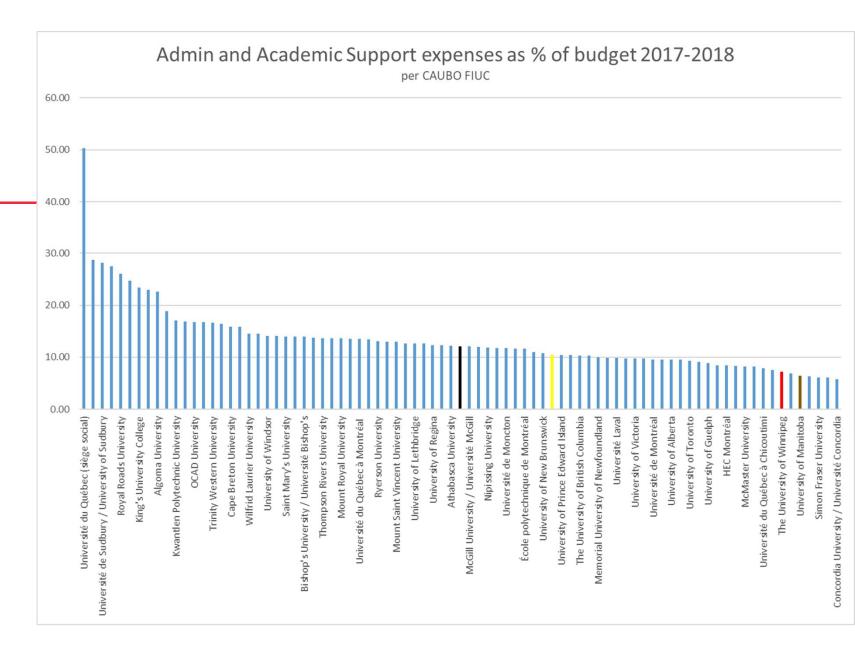








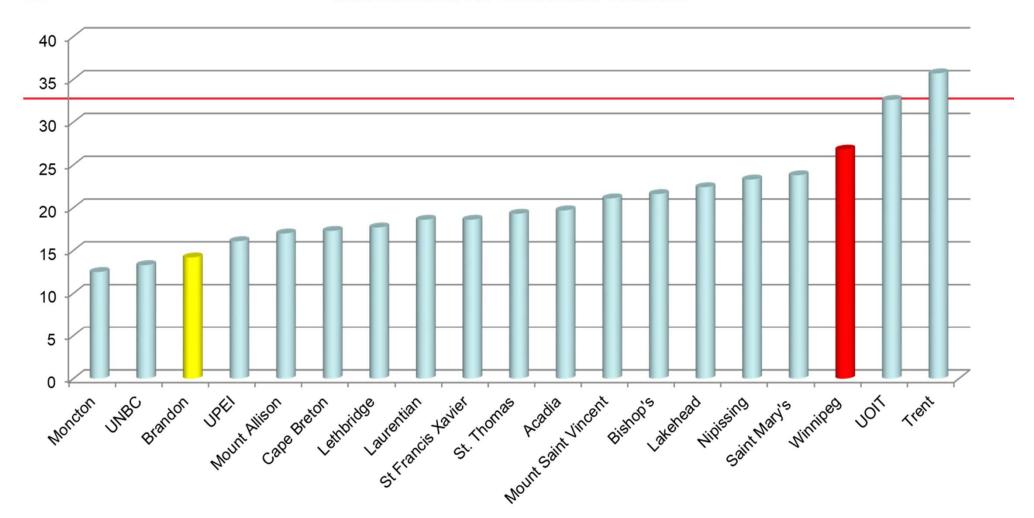






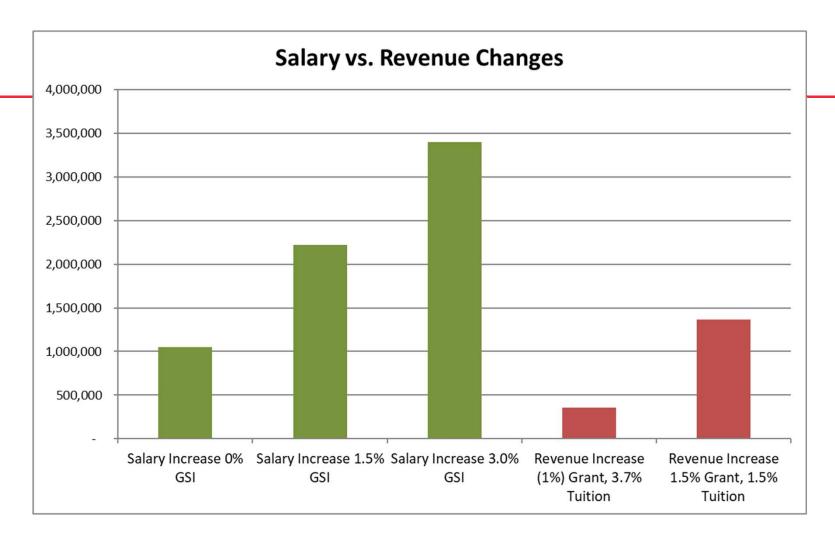
#### **Student Faculty Ratio - Primarily Undergraduate**

# WINNIPEG Structural Deficit (2017-2018 Example)





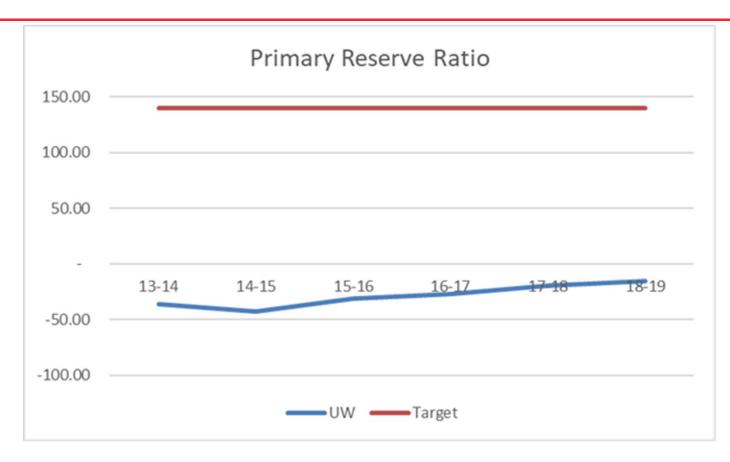
## **Composite Financial Index (CFI)**

<u>Composite Score</u> the four ratios listed below can be weighted and combined to provide an overall score indicating the health of each entity. The components of the 2018 calculation are included below. The maximum Composite score is 10; a score of 3 is often said to be the minimum threshold of financial health.

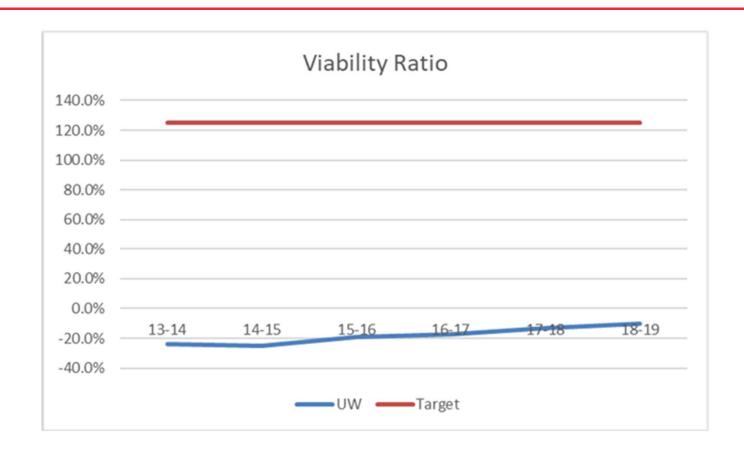


## **Primary Reserve Ratio**



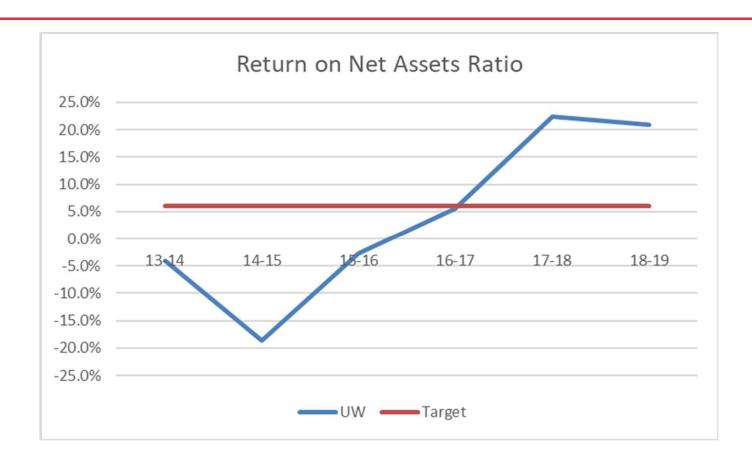


## **Viability Ratio**



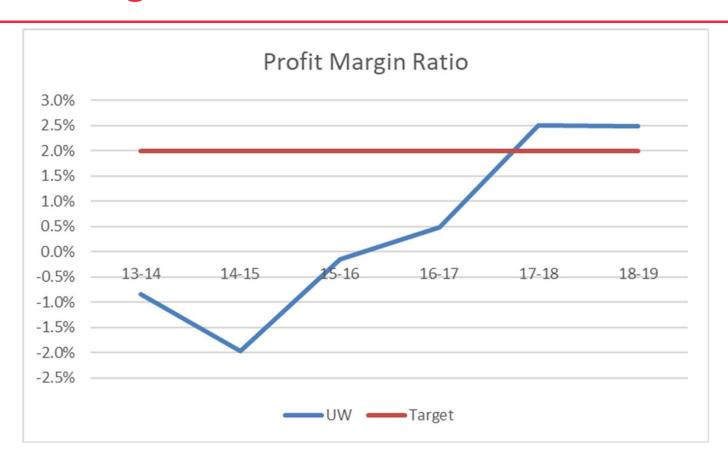


## **Return on Assets Ratio**



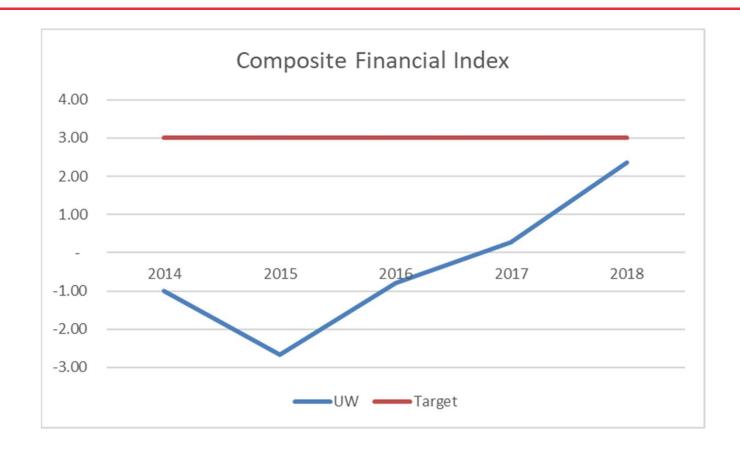


## **Net Operating Revenues Ratio**



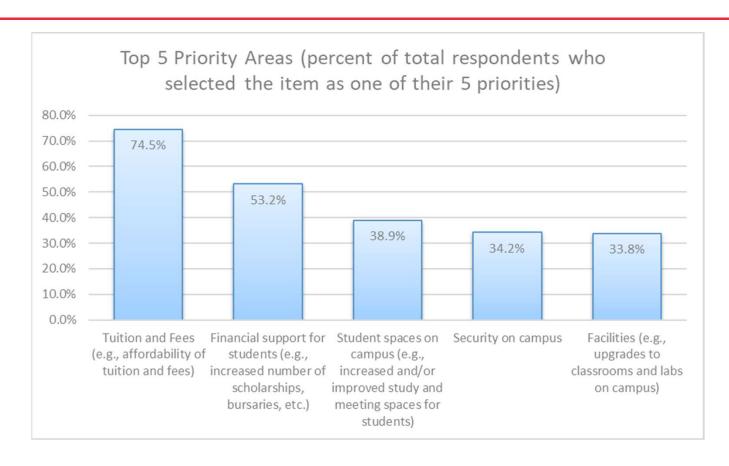

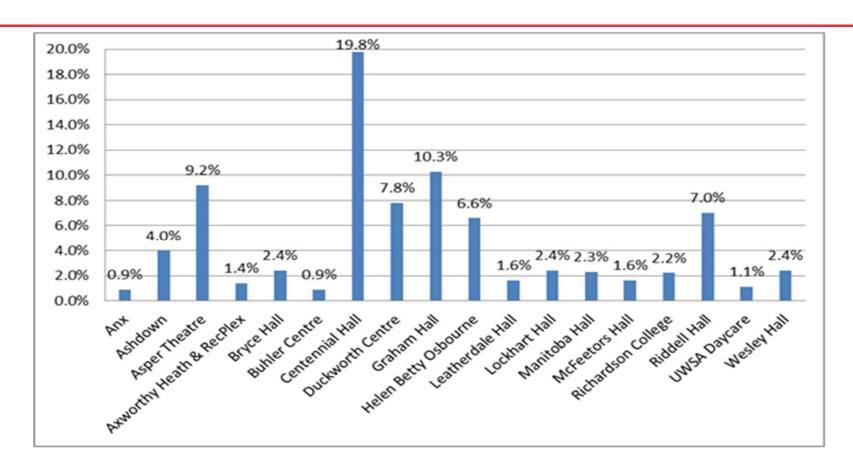

## 2019-2020 Budget

- Operating Grant cut 1%
- Tuition increase of 3.7% on average, one half of legally permitted increase. Some programs increased more, some less based on how our fees compare to the broader market. Average student cost increased \$120.
- 10% international enrollment increase, 1% decline in domestic undergraduate enrollment
- Adopted PSAS Accounting Standards (cost of \$750,000)
- Increased student bursaries
- Invested in positions to support international students and students at risk of leaving
- Approved 16 tenure track and 7 term positions, increasing FTEs by 5 (restoring to the level of the prior year)
- Pension Expense increased from \$750,000 to \$3 million
- Increased research grant funding by \$40,000 (\$20,000 for internal grants, \$20,000 for matching external grants)

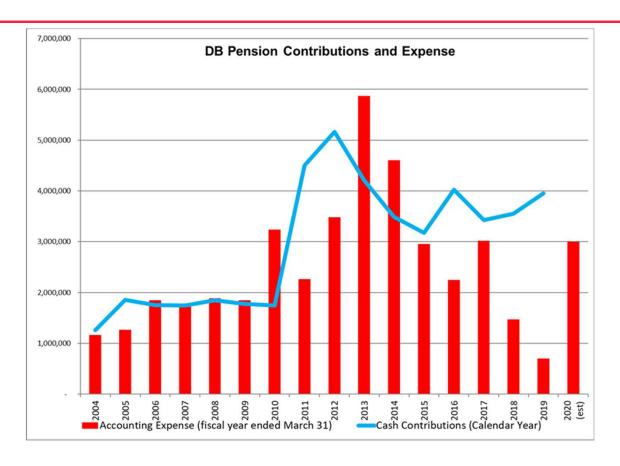
