| Dean's Continuing Scholarship Fund | The Dean's Continuing Scholarship Fund supports Collegiate students entering into their second, third, or fourth year of studies. The recipient(s) need a minimum GPA of 3.0. |
| Millennium Entrance Scholarship | Established in 2000, this scholarship is awarded to students with averages over 90% who did not receive the regular Entrance Scholarship. Soon to be renamed the Collegiate 150 Entrance Scholarship. |
| Model School Trust | The Model School Trust is a dedicated fund for the general operations of the Model School at The Collegiate. |

| Carl N. Halstead Memorial Scholarship in History | <p>Mrs. Carl N. Halstead has provided a scholarship to commemorate the long association with The Collegiate and her husband, the late Dean Carl N. Halstead, both as Dean and as Instructor in History.</p> <p>The Scholarship is to be awarded annually to a full-time student at The Collegiate who obtained the highest mark in History 40S. Applicants must be continuing their studies at The University of Winnipeg in any program consisting of at least four full courses (24 Credit Hours).</p> |
| Evelyn V. Mills Prize in Math 40S | This scholarship is given in memory of Evelyn V. Mills, Instructor Emeritus of The Collegiate, who had a strong commitment to the teaching of Mathematics. Awarded to the student who obtains the highest final mark in Mathematics 40S. |

| Howard Mathieson Scholarship | In honour of alumnus and past Collegiate faculty member Howard Mathieson, this scholarship is awarded based on academic excellence and on the potential to excel as an athlete in a recognized sport at The Collegiate. |
| Irene Bennett Memorial Entrance Scholarship | This scholarship commemorates Irene Bennett who managed Tony's Canteen from 1977 to 1992. It will be awarded to a full-course student in Grade 11 with a demonstrated interest in the arts and high academic achievement in a full-course Grade 10 program. |
| John Ting Memorial Prize | This prize was established in recognition of John Ting, a valued Collegiate instructor from 1972 until his death in 2002. John taught Biology and Mathematics. He took a special interest in the international students at The Collegiate since he came to Winnipeg as an international student. This prize will be awarded to the graduating international student with the highest combined mark in Grade 12 compulsory English course and a Grade 12 Science (Biology 40S, Chemistry 40S, Computer Science 40S, or Physics 40S). |
| Lorette Lajoie Collegiate Memorial Scholarship | <p>This scholarship supports returning Collegiate students who are entering grade 10, 11 or 12 with a minimum overall GPA of 75%. Preference is given to Métis or Indigenous students who have made a positive contribution to the culture of the school and developed inclusive relationships with others.</p> <p>Lorette Lajoie worked at The Collegiate from 2016 - 2021 as the office assistant. Lorette filled the office with her contagious energy and smile, and will always be remembered for the positive relationships she built with students. One of Lorette's favorite annual activities was visiting every Folklorama pavilion where a Collegiate student was involved. Lorette's positivity and love for our students will be deeply missed by the Collegiate community.</p> |
| Murray Memorial Prize in English 30S | This prize is in memory of John D. Murray, former Assistant Dean of the Collegiate. Awarded to the student who obtains the highest final mark in English 30S at The Collegiate. |

| <p>The Kathy Cullen (O'Connell) Memorial Award</p> | <p>This award was established in memory of Kathy Cullen (O'Connell), whose career at The Collegiate spanned 29 years, from 1981 to 2010. As the International Student Advisor, and later as the Collegiate Office Manager and Registrar, Kathy reached out to all students in need. Her encouragement, guidance and support enabled many students to achieve their goals. The Kathy Cullen (O'Connell) Memorial Award will be given annually to a new or returning full-time student at The Collegiate in Grades 9, 10, 11 or 12, demonstrating good academic standing. Financial need may be a consideration in the selection process. Preference will be given to a newcomer to Canada.</p> |
| <p>Tomlinson Memorial Scholarship Grade 11 and 12</p> | <p>This scholarship is given out in honour of Dean Lorne Tomlinson. One scholarship is given to the full-course student in Grade 11 with the second highest standing in a complete Grade 10 program. The second award is given to the full-course student in Grade 12 with the highest standing in a full-course Grade 11 program taken at The Collegiate.</p> |
| <p>Wayne Christianson Collegiate</p> | <p>This bursary will support a full-time student with refugee background at The Collegiate and will be awarded annually. Students must demonstrate financial need. This bursary was established through a bequest to The Collegiate from the Estate of Melvin Wayne Christianson. Wayne was an alumnus of The University of Winnipeg (1972 BSC, Physics) and was an instructor at The Collegiate, teaching Chemistry, Physics, Math and Law for 25 Years.</p> |
| <p>William Rutherford Scholarship</p> | <p>In honour of former Dean of the Collegiate William Rutherford, this scholarship is awarded to the new full course Grade 11 student with the highest standing in a complete Grade 10 program at The Collegiate.</p> |

| Bruce Baragar Memorial Award | This award was established by Dr. Robert Baragar in honour of his brother C.D. Bruce Baragar (1944). It will be granted annually based on financial need to a deserving student. |
| Charlotte Marie Kennedy Memorial Collegiate Scholarship | Established in 1986 by the family and friends of Charlotte Marie Kennedy (1962), this scholarship is awarded annually to a Grade 12 student currently enrolled in a minimum of four courses at The Collegiate who shows high academic promise and financial need. The recipient must have been a full-time Grade 11 student at The Collegiate in the previous year. |
| Derek Wong Memorial Scholarship | Given by family and friends in memory of Derek Wong (1988) who had a strong interest in Leukemia research. This scholarship will be awarded to the top two full-time students who obtain the highest final combined grades in Biology 40S and Chemistry 40S. |
| Howie Goldberg Memorial Award | Established in memory of Howie Goldberg (1984), this award is given to the full-time graduate who intends to register at a Manitoba university and achieves the highest standing in five 40S academic credits, including English 40S. While the scholarship will be announced at Convocation, it will be awarded the following September upon proof of registration at a Manitoba university. |
| Lawrence F. Schmidt Memorial Award | In memory of Lawrence F. Schmidt (1952), this annual award is given with preference to a student who entered The Collegiate on mature status. The student must have completed at least three credits at The Collegiate in any session(s) and demonstrate good academic achievement and effort. |
| Marjorie J. MacDonald Award | In memory of Marjorie J. MacDonald (1935), this award will be granted annually to a deserving student enrolled at The Collegiate based on financial need and high academic achievement in an English course. |

| Murray C. Coppinger Memorial Bursary | This bursary was established by the Coppinger family in memory of Murray C. Coppinger (1969). It is to be awarded annually, at the discretion of the Dean of The Collegiate, to a student or students who are in financial need. Preference will be given to students who have a disability (including physical, medical, learning and psychiatric disabilities). |
| Robert A. Anderson Memorial Scholarship | In memory of Robert A. Anderson (1947), this award will be awarded to the full-time student with high academic achievement and excellent all-round participation in the life of The Collegiate. |
| Roberta Rosenberg Dean's Continuing Scholarship | This scholarship supports returning Collegiate students who are entering grade 10, 11 or 12 with a minimum overall academic average of 80% who have demonstrated an interest in the arts and/or humanities. Preference will be given to students with volunteer activity related to economic and food security issues, or other community involvement targeted at individuals and/or families in need. This fund was established by Ken Rosenberg (1974) in honour of his sister Roberta Rosenberg (1984), who sadly passed away in the late 1980s. Roberta loved the arts, specifically the visual arts, and had an active interest in food security issues. |
| Stewart Family Scholarship for Adult Learners - Collegiate | This scholarship is awarded annually with preference given to a student who entered on Mature Status, who has completed at least 3 credits at The Collegiate in any session(s), and who demonstrates good academic achievement and effort. The Stewart family established this fund in memory of Henry Rieff Stewart, who graduated from The Collegiate in 1948 and attended United College from 1948 to 1950, and in memory of E. Jocelyn Stewart who attended The University as a mature student starting in 1970. |
| The Janice Raleigh Memorial Bursary | Established by Don Raleigh in 2006, in honour of his wife, Janice (Pitlabo) Raleigh (1953). This bursary will provide support to Collegiate students, or to those applying to The Collegiate, who have demonstrated financial need. |

| Class of '83 Scholarship | This scholarship is awarded on the recommendation of The Collegiate Awards Committee to a full-course Grade 12 student with high academic achievement in a full-course Grade 11 program. |
| Collegiate Alumni Association Endowment Fund | As we celebrate The Collegiate's 150th Anniversary and look towards the future, the Collegiate Alumni Association has established an endowment fund, which will be used to sustain a strong and active Association in perpetuity. Any unused funds from a given year will be donated towards Collegiate awards and bursaries. | Collegiate Alumni Association Prize | Awarded to the full-course graduate who was registered as a full-course student in Grade 11 during the previous Winter Session, and who showed a significant improvement from Grade 11 to Grade 12. |
| Collegiate Alumni Entrance Scholarship | This scholarship is awarded based on academic excellence and financial need to students entering Grade 10, Grade 11, and /or Grade 12 in The Collegiate. |
| Collegiate Alumni Medal | Awarded annually to the full-course student who achieves the highest standing in Grade 11, and who has completed at least four credits in the Fall/Winter Regular Session. |
| Collegiate Student's Association (77/78) Scholarship | This Scholarship is awarded annually on the recommendation of The Collegiate Awards Committee to a Grade 12 student registered for at least four credits in The University of Winnipeg Collegiate. |

| David Bruce Pitblado Memorial Collegiate Bursary | Janice (Pitblado) Raleigh (1953) and Sandra and Jim Pitblado established this bursary in memory of David Bruce Pitblado. This bursary will provide support to current students, or to those applying to The Collegiate, who demonstrate financial need. |
| Dean's Bursary Fund (In Honour of Dean Lorne Tomlinson) | The Dean's Bursary Fund (In Honour of Dean Lorne Tomlinson) provides support to Collegiate students, or to those applying to The Collegiate, who have demonstrated financial need. The fund was established by alumnus Dr. James D. MacDonald (1964). |
| Douglas Family Bursary | Mr. Bryce W. Douglas (1963) established this bursary to support students in financial need who otherwise would not be able to attend The Collegiate. |
| Jeffrey and Andrew Walker Collegiate Award | This award was established by Acision Industries Inc., to commemorate Collegiate alumni Jeffrey Walker (2009) and Andrew Walker (2012), and their wish to thank The Collegiate for the contribution that it has made to their lives. The award will be given annually to the most improved student among the graduating class. The award will be used towards the purchase of books at The University of Winnipeg Bookstore. |
| John De Jong Collegiate Alumni Scholarship | Established by Daisy (De Jong) Webster (1928) in memory of her father, John De Jong, this scholarship is awarded to a full-course Grade 12 student who completed a full-course Grade 11 program with high academic achievement and who intends to enter university. |
| Leonard Asper Family Collegiate Bursary | Created by Leonard Asper (1982), founding member of The University of Winnipeg Foundation Board of Directors. This Bursary will provide support to The Collegiate students, or to those applying to The Collegiate, who demonstrate financial need. |
| Marion (Prober) More Collegiate Memorial Bursary | Established by the Prober Family in honour of their mother Marion (More) Prober, this award will be made annually based on financial need to a deserving student. All three of Mrs. Prober's sons attended The Collegiate. |

| The Adrienne and Brian Katz Family Collegiate Scholarship | The Adrienne and Brian Katz Family Collegiate Scholarship is awarded annually to two returning, engaged, and well-rounded students, one in grade 11 and another in grade 12, who demonstrated good citizenship, leadership, and high academic promise (average of 85% or higher) during their previous year at The University of Winnipeg Collegiate. The recipients must have been full-time students in their previous year and currently enrolled in full-time studies at The University of Winnipeg Collegiate. This Scholarship will be awarded in the fall of their Grade 11 and Grade 12 year. This award will be divided equally between the two students who meet the above-noted criteria. |
| The Ross Robinson Family Collegiate Bursary | Established in 2011, the Ross Robinson Family Collegiate Bursary will annually support students who otherwise could not afford to attend The Collegiate. This gift will be matched dollar for dollar by monies from the Collegiate Leadership Matching Fund. Ross Robinson graduated from the Collegiate in 1967. |

| Beck McIntosh Family Model School Bursary | <p>This bursary will be awarded to a student at the Model School at The Collegiate who demonstrates financial need. The bursary is renewable for three additional years.</p> <p>Lorraine Beck is an '86 UWinnipeg graduate raised by hard-working parents who instilled the importance of education in their children despite leaving school at a young age. Craig McIntosh believes in education and earned his B.Comm, CMA and FCMA. He grew up in Virden and followed his childhood entrepreneurial dream by acquiring and building a successful plastics company. The couple encourages their children, Kaitlyn and Thomas, to recognize the value of learning. They wish to help others overcome their barriers by helping them on their journey, so they too can use the power of education to build a career of their choice, and participate fully in their community.</p> |
| BMO Financial - Model School Bursary | BMO Financial Group has created a unique and innovative bursary program aimed at providing seamless, 5-year renewable funding for students with financial need attending the Model School at The Collegiate who intend to pursue post-secondary studies. | Collegiate Entrance Scholarship - Grade 10 | This scholarship will be awarded to the full-course Grade 10 student with the highest standing in a complete Grade 9 program. |
| Collegiate Entrance Scholarship Grade 11 | This scholarship will be awarded to the new full course Grade 11 student with the highest standing in a complete Grade 10 program. |
| Collegiate Entrance Scholarship Grade 12 | This scholarship will be awarded to the full-course student in Grade 12 with the highest standing in a Grade 11 full-course program taken at a school other than The Collegiate. Only students with Manitoba academic credentials are eligible to apply. |
| Collegiate Faculty Award | Presented to a graduating Grade 12 student who has made outstanding contributions to The Collegiate. |
| Collegiate International Scholarship | The Collegiate International Scholarships are automatically offered to qualifying international students who have received an Official Acceptance Letter to the Collegiate's Grade 9, 10, 11 or 12 program (including UWinnipeg Pre-University Pathway Program and University Foundation Program). To qualify, students must achieve an overall 80% average or higher on their top five academic courses (including Math and English) in the previous grade level. |
| Collegiate Silver Jubilee Entrance Award | These awards will be offered annually to new students who apply before March 31 to register for a minimum of five full course equivalents (30 credit hours) in the Fall/Winter session. To be eligible for consideration students must have a minimum average of 85%. Financial need of the student may be taken into consideration in the selection process. |
| Dean's Medal | Awarded to a full-course graduate with high academic achievement and involvement in extra-curricular activities, who has completed at least 4 credits in the Fall/Winter Session. |
| Governor General's Medal | Awarded annually to the full-course graduate who achieves the highest standing in Grade 12 in a program leading to admission to university and who has completed at least 4 credits in the Fall-Winter Session. |

| Grace Little Collegiate Bursary | The Grace Little Collegiate Bursary was established to help students who might not otherwise be able to enjoy the opportunities provided by a quality education. Awarded annually to a new or returning full-time student at The Collegiate in Grades 9, 10, 11 or 12. Applicants must demonstrate good academic standing and plan to continue to university. Financial need will be a consideration in the selection process. Preference will be given to Indigenous students and newcomers to Canada. This award is renewable for up to four years. To renew, students must enroll in full-time studies and maintain a 60% average (C). |
| John Bulman Collegiate Scholarship | This scholarship is awarded to a Collegiate student continuing from Grade 11 who is actively involved and committed to the life of The Collegiate and/or the community. |
| Leonard Krueger Scholarship | This scholarship will be awarded annually to two graduates in Grade 12 at The Collegiate who received the highest academic standing in that year and who will continue their studies at The University of Winnipeg. |
| Pinnacle Staffing Model School Bursary | <p>This bursary was established by Pinnacle Staffing to support a Model School graduate who is attending the University of Winnipeg. Recipients must demonstrate financial need and have previously been enrolled in The Model School Program at The Collegiate.</p> <p>Pinnacle Staffing believes that the pathways to education are important to maintain, and they want to ensure our youth have the greatest chance to succeed by providing them with the best opportunities possible.</p> |
| President's Medal | Awarded annually to the full-course student who achieves the second highest standing in Grade 10 and who has completed at least four credits in the Fall/Winter Session. |

| Shanker Memorial Prizes | <p>These prizes have been established by Dr. Prem Shanker in memory of his parents, Dr. Vishnu and Vachan Shanker. Awarded to two students, one from any university course and another from The Collegiate, who have written the best essays promoting dialogue, understanding, and mutual acceptance between two or more religious traditions.</p> <p>Preference will be given to essays which consider both Eastern and Western religious traditions, or which promote the idea of non-violent ways of bringing about social change. A student may submit the paper for consideration, or a teacher may forward the submission to the Chair, Department of Religious Studies, on or before April 1.</p> |
| The R.O.A. Hunter Collegiate Alumni Award | Awarded to a student with good academic performance and active participation in The Collegiate athletic programs. |
| United Church of Canada Entrance Bursary | This Bursary, established by the United Church of Canada, will be awarded on the recommendation of the Dean of The Collegiate, to a student of academic promise with financial need. |
| University Medal | Awarded annually to the full-course graduate who achieves the second highest standing in Grade 12 in a program leading to admission to university and who has completed at least 4 credits in the Fall/Winter Session. |
| UWinnipeg 50th Anniversary Collegiate Scholarship | This scholarship is intended to reward high academic achievement among our returning students in grades 10, 11, and 12. The scholarship will be awarded to the three students with the highest overall averages in each grade. |
| Wesley Medal | Awarded annually to the full-course student who achieves the second highest standing in Grade 11, and who has completed at least 4 credits in the Fall/Winter Session. |
