

GESA Eco-Grant

The Eco-Grant is an annual award that is made possible through the fundraising efforts of The University of Winnipeg Geography and Environmental Student Association (GESA).

Purpose and Objectives

The purpose of the Eco-Grant is to encourage the development of sustainable projects either on or off campus, and to support environmental stewardship within the University of Winnipeg community. The objective of the Eco-Grant is to fund projects, research and/or travel that will:

- Positively impact the sustainability of The University of Winnipeg and/or local environmental efforts.
- Empower individuals to engage in sustainable projects on campus and in the wider community.
- Increase environmental stewardship within the campus and local community.
- Encourage individuals to initiate and execute their ideas.

Eligibility

Eligibility varies between categories. The following University of Winnipeg affiliated individuals (or a group consisting of affiliated individuals) are eligible to apply for funding:

- Current students (undergraduate or graduate)
- Alumni
- Faculty
- Individuals who are conducting research under the supervision of a University of Winnipeg faculty member

Categories

Applications must fulfill the conditions of the Eco-Grant Category that is being applied for.

1. **Sustainability Project:** Projects under this category will promote sustainability on campus or within the wider community. Past projects have included rooftop gardens, plastic bag recycling and campus beehives. Open to all eligible applicants.
2. **Research Award:** For research in either the physical or social sciences that will promote environmental sustainability. Limited to research being conducted by a current student, or by an individual under the supervision of a University of Winnipeg faculty member.
3. **Travel Award:** For travel-related costs for attending a relevant conference or other professional development event that will equip the applicant to make subsequent contributions to environmental sustainability. Limited to students and alumni.

Grant Information

- A total of \$1500 will be granted towards funding the selected application(s).
- The Eco-Grant Committee, composed of GESA members, will choose the recipient(s).
- Finalists may be interviewed by the Eco-Grant Committee.
- Please note that campus based and student projects will receive priority.
- Recipients agree to any conditions/restrictions imposed by the Eco-Grant Committee.
- Recipients must provide an update on their projects within one year.

- Justification as to how this project will promote sustainability on campus or within the wider community, and how it fulfills the purpose and objectives of the Eco-Grant.

Part 4: Estimated Costs and Timeline

Provide a summary of the following:

- The total estimated cost of the project.
- How much each component will cost, supported by receipts or quotes.
- How the grant money will be used.
- Any other funding sources you have obtained or applied for.
- A timeline that details when each part of the project is expected to take place.
