This scholarship will be awarded to a student who has completed their final undergraduate or M.A. qualifying year and is planning to enter a graduate program in Humanities with preference given to students showing an interest in Canadian History or Philosophy or the language and literatures of either French or English speaking peoples. This scholarship, named in honour of the late Senator Thomas Crerar, P.C., C.C., L.L.D., is established by a fund created by a bequest of Dorothy Naylor and administered by the Winnipeg Foundation.

Eligibility You may be eligible for this award if you meet the following criteria:

- Accepted to begin first year of a Master's program in Humanities at the University of Winnipeg
- Have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.00 (B)

Application: A completed application package includes the following:

- This completed Application Form (typed only, handwritten applications will not be accepted)
- Official transcripts from all undergraduate and graduate institutions you have attended
- 1 letter of support from the Graduate Program Committee Chair
- 1-2 page personal statement outlining how your program of studies meet the criteria for the award
