CHARACTER OF THIS CLASSIFICATION LEVEL

The Physical Plant Department is responsible for the entire physical facilities of the University, including all buildings and grounds, furnishings and fixed equipment.

In positions at this level, incumbents perform all duties of a Journeyman (M/F) Carpenter under direction from the Assistant Director of Physical Plant.

CHARACTERISTIC DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Under direction from the Assistant Director, consults with departments/units, determines what is required, designs products and estimates cost of completion dates.
- 2. Adapts, repairs and restores furniture, woodwork, facilities and fixtures.
- 3. Renovates areas by removing, renovating and/or installing walls, floor structures, ceilings, facilities and fixtures. Works in conjunction with other Plant trades on selected special projects as assigned.
- 4. Designs, constructs, and installs a variety of items including: shelving, cupboards, display cases and counters.
- 5. Prepares cost estimates of individual jobs and assists with cost estimates of major projects.
- 6. Works in cooperation with and assists the Utility Worker/Locksmith in cutting keys, and installing and repairing locks, in conjunction with external locksmiths.
- 7. Prepares and installs wood and bronze letter signage and assists in production/installation of acrylic and other signage as required.
- 8. Performs functions of a glazier when necessary, including installing and repairing windows.
- 9. Supervises any staff assigned to carpentry projects.
- 10. Maintains workshop and work areas in a clean and safe condition.
- 11. Is responsible for security, maintenance and repair of all tools and equipment.
- 12. Assists in evacuations, according to procedures, in a safe and responsible manner, whenever necessary.
- 13. Performs other related duties as required or assigned.
