A Strong Economic Engine Powering Winnipeg's Downtown

Downtown has always been Winnipeg's centre for economic activity. Before the COVID-19 pandemic, Winnipeg's downtown core experienced nearly two decades of renewal. More people now live downtown, making it a vibrant place to live, study, and work. The pandemic has threatened this newfound vibrancy, reducing the number of people who come downtown daily to work and socialize. In September 2021, UWinnipeg was among the first universities and large employers to safely reopen.

UWinnipeg is committed to bringing people back downtown in even greater numbers in 2022.



UWinnipeg draws people into the downtown in multiple ways:



 Many UWinnipeg students live on campus, downtown, or in the surrounding neighbourhoods.



 We draw students, faculty, and staff who live all over Winnipeg and the surrounding areas to work and attend classes.




 Students from 78 countries are enrolled at UWinnipeg. Many of them live in the downtown area.



 Events held on campus attract diverse community members and visitors. Events generated \$8.2M in economic impact in 2019.



Returning to In-Person Learning and Teaching

Online learning is here to stay, but overall, UWinnipeg students are ready to get back on campus. UWinnipeg is returning to in-person operations, while following public health guidelines to keep faculty, staff, and students safe.



The pandemic has not slowed down enrolment. Demand for post-secondary education remained strong as UWinnipeg was able to successfully transition to online teaching and learning.




Enrolment at UWinnipeg has grown substantially since 2000 and remains strong, even during the pandemic. The average number of students each year over the past decade is 9,501.

UWinnipeg Alumni are Vital to the Manitoba Economy

UWinnipeg graduates earn more income over the course of their careers than Manitobans with high school diplomas.
