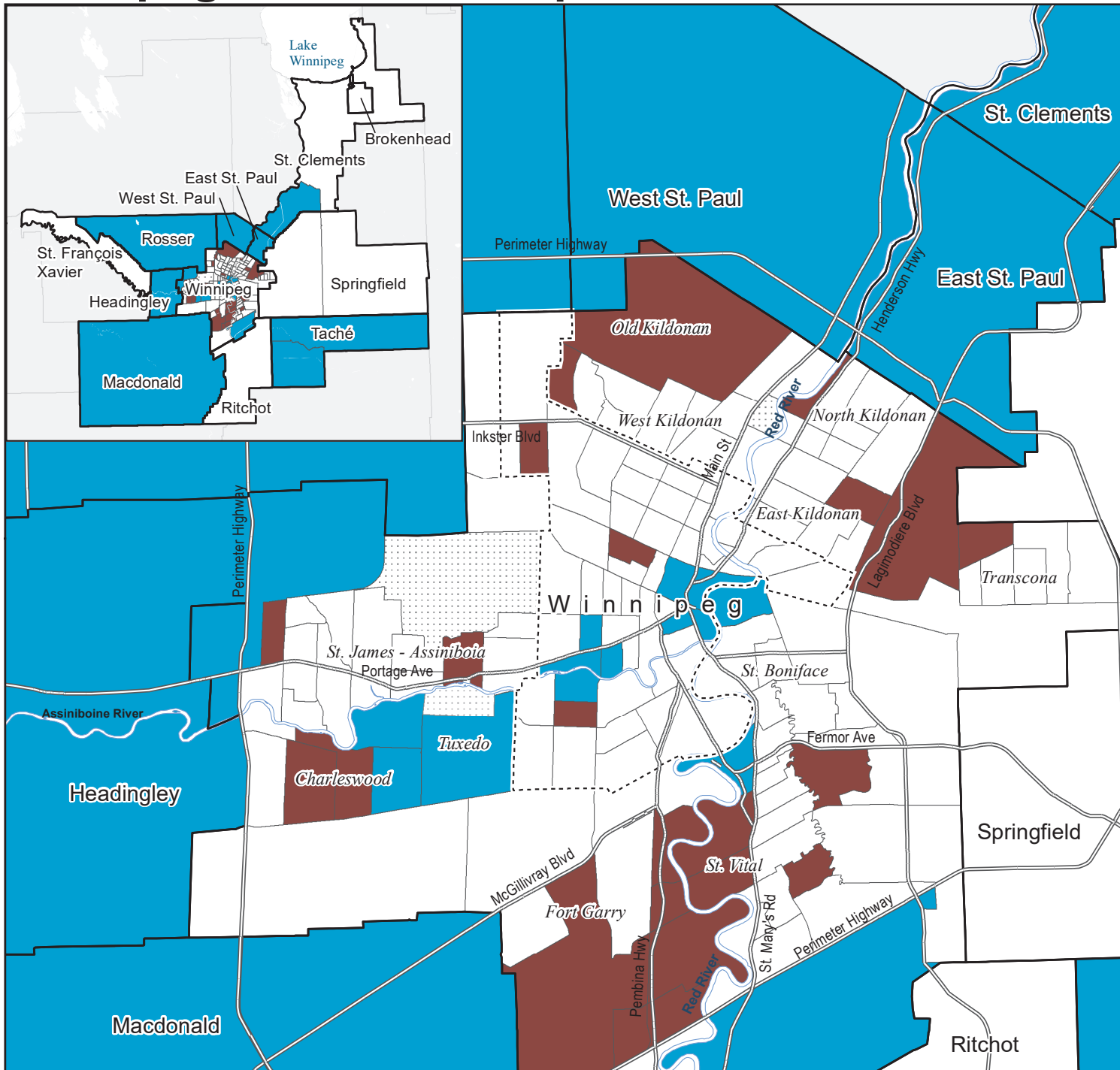


# Change in Neighbourhood Income Over Ten Years, 2005 to 2015

## Winnipeg Census Metropolitan Area, +/-10% Change



**Change in census tract average individual income compared to Winnipeg CMA average, 2005 to 2015**

- Upward Trend: 10% or More (22 CTs; 13% of the CMA)
- Little Change: Less than 10% (121 CTs; 73% of the CMA)
- Downward Trend: 10% or More (23 CTs; 14% of the CMA)

Individual income for persons 15 and over, from all sources, before-tax.

Change is in terms of percentage points. The 2015 average individual income of the census tract is divided by the metropolitan area average for that year and the same is done for 2005. The difference (2015 minus 2005) is multiplied by 100 to produce the percentage point change for each census tract.

Census tract boundaries are held constant to Census 2006 (166 CTs with income data).
