STUDY SKILLS WORKSHOPS

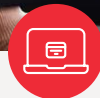

ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

The University of Winnipeg upholds principles of academic integrity and seeks to ensure that students do not commit acts of academic misconduct. We strive to maintain an environment in which academic integrity is understood and valued and serves as the basis for student learning. It doesn't matter whether you're in a chemistry lab, working on an English essay in the library, or working online with a group to complete an assignment. Academic integrity is important in all academic departments and methods of learning.

Academic misconduct includes, but is not limited to, plagiarism and cheating.

ACTS OF PLAGIARISM MAY INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- › Not giving recognition to the author for phrases, sentences, thoughts, or arguments incorporated into student work
- › Submitting the same work for evaluation to more than one course without the consent of each instructor to do so
- › Not using quotation marks or referencing appropriately
- › Two or more students submitting identical or virtually identical work for evaluation when the work was intended to be completed individually

ACTS OF CHEATING MAY INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- › Communicating with others at a test/exam with the purpose of obtaining, exchanging, or imparting information related to the test
- › Consulting with unauthorized sources to obtain assistance, including, but not limited to, written, digital, and/or other aids not approved by the instructor
- › Copying another person's answer
- › Obtaining a copy of the exam or test or questions from the exam or test before they are officially available
- › Purchasing essays, or other assignments in whole or in part, and submitting these works for evaluation as one's own

We encourage appropriate student conduct and, when necessary, we identify and regulate student academic misconduct that infringes on the culture of academic integrity upon which the University is built.

The University of Winnipeg takes academic misconduct seriously and has tools and policies ensuring that academic integrity is maintained throughout the institution. Consequences for academic misconduct may include loss of marks on an assignment/test/exam and/or loss of marks in a course, suspension, and/or expulsion from the University.

TIPS TO MAINTAIN ACADEMIC INTEGRITY:

- › Don't wait until last minute to complete assignments.
- › Properly cite your sources.
- › Express original ideas and opinions.
- › Speak with your professors regarding expectations and requirements.
- › Know University policies and regulations (Academic Calendar, Regulations & Policies, 8a).

Rules may be different, or even contradictory, to your past experiences — **always double check!**

TECHNOLOGY ON CAMPUS

WIFI

To login to the Eduroam (education roaming) wireless network, use your WebAdvisor user ID and password. Set-up instructions for mobile devices: uwinnipeg.ca/uw-wireless

WEBMAIL

Check your University Webmail account regularly. This is how the University will notify you about important information such as fee owing, openings on waitlists, new sections/labs, cancellations, or other changes to courses.

WEBADVISOR

Use WebAdvisor to update your personal contact information, access your T2202A tax forms, and check your (unofficial) transcript. To change your address (or phone number or email), log in to WebAdvisor, select *Current Students*, and then, under *Academic Profile*, select “Address Change”.

FORGOT YOUR WEBADVISOR USER ID OR PASSWORD?

Click on *Log In* at the top of WebAdvisor, select *What's My User ID?* or *Forgot My Password*, and follow the prompts. You'll be asked for your seven-digit student number.

NEXUS

To access your course materials online (handouts, assignments, updates, etc.), go to nexus.uwinnipeg.ca and log in with your WebAdvisor user ID and password. Note: Not all courses are hosted on Nexus, so check your course outlines or ask your instructors. Assistance: nexus@uwinnipeg.ca

COMPUTERS ON CAMPUS

Work stations are located in the Library and the Uplink Computer Common. You first need to activate or “claim” your University computer account to be able to log in. Go to myidm.uwinnipeg.ca to set up your account ahead of time. You will need your WebAdvisor user ID and password. Detailed instructions: uwinnipeg.ca/claim-id-process

PRINTING AND PHOTOCOPYING

Printers, copiers, scanners, and Equitrac pay stations are available in the Library (including colour) and at the Uplink Computer Common (4th floor, Centennial Hall). You will need your printing ID (your student number) and your Equitrac printing password (emailed to you through Webmail). The UWSA offers printing and copying services from your USB drive at the UWSA Info Booth (1st floor, Centennial Hall).

UWSA HEALTH PLAN

The UWSA Health Plan is an extended healthcare plan provided through Green Shield. Students taking nine (or more) credit hours in a single term and all international students on study terms longer than six months are automatically enrolled in the plan. Part-time, PACE, First Nations, and graduate studies students are not automatically enrolled, but are able to opt-in.

U-PASS

The U-Pass is a universal public transit program in which students receive a Winnipeg Transit bus pass at a highly-reduced rate.

In Fall and Winter Terms, undergraduate students taking nine credit hours (or more) and all full-time graduate studies students are automatically charged a mandatory U-Pass fee of \$136.25 per term. Students pay this fee with their other tuition fees. Handi-Transit Services accepts the U-Pass.

Once registered for classes, students can pick-up their U-Pass from the Info Booth located on the first floor of Centennial Hall. Students will need their UWinnipeg student ID. Once a student's U-Pass has been registered online, it will renew in future terms if they continue to register in nine credit hours or more.

TIPS FOR YOUR FIRST YEAR

PLAN AHEAD

Use WebAdvisor's Student Planning module to map out your term-by-term degree timeline. Check your degree and major requirements and your progress towards graduation. Request a review of your plan from an Academic Advisor. View alternative degree programs in which you may be interested.

PARTICIPATE IN CLASS

Optimize your success in courses by engaging in class discussions, creating study groups, reviewing your notes prior to class, and reading ahead to get your brain anticipating the next topic. Talk with your professors — they are real people who want to support your learning. The more you engage in your courses, the more you'll get out of them.

TAKE CARE OF YOURSELF

As best you can, take care of all aspects of your health and well-being (eg. nutritionally, emotionally, psycho-spiritually, mentally, socially, fitness-wise, work-wise, etc.) You need to be healthy and energized to be productive and successful in your studies. Take time for yourself. Turn off your phone. Get some sleep. Spend time with people who care about you. Play intramurals, musical instruments or go to a meditation session. It is common to feel stressed and overwhelmed, so don't be afraid to ask for help! Keep in mind the list of support services available in this resource guide.

FIND YOUR BALANCE

DATES

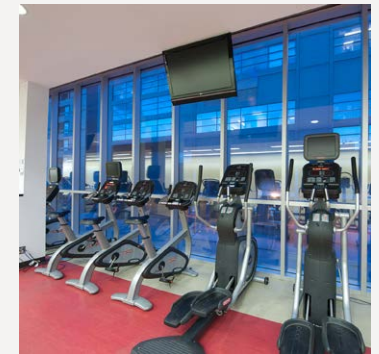

FEE PAYMENTS

GYM

HOUSING

Campus Living offers a variety of housing and meal plan options for students living on their own, married, or with families, including furnished dorms and unfurnished apartments.

INDIGENOUS CONTENT

JOBS

UWinnipeg uses your webmail account as our primary source of communication. Check your account regularly so that you do not miss any important information.

ONLINE COURSES

Access online or video-on-demand (VOD) courses through Nexus. Your login is the same as your WebAdvisor login. Nexus can be accessed once the term begins.

PREPARATION (INSTEAD OF PROCRASTINATION)

Planning out time to work on your assignments and papers will reduce your stress levels and help you get better grades. There are free workshops on effective time mapping, note-taking techniques, test/exam-taking strategies, and more. uwinnipeg.ca/study-skills-workshops

QUEUE ONLINE

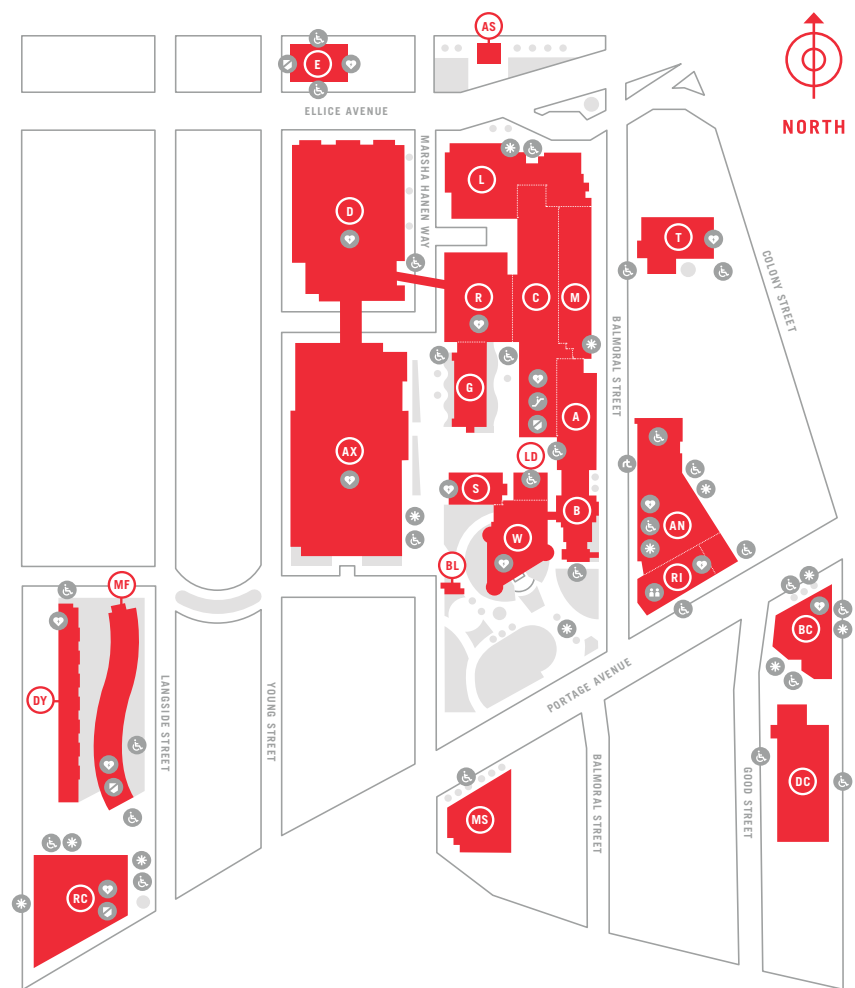
