General Information:

In April 2014 the University of Winnipeg was granted a three-year Aid to Small Universities grant entitled, "Engaging Marginalized Children and Youth". While this particular project is nearing its completion, SSHRC has supplemented the university with additional funds for the 2017-2018 fiscal year. In keeping with the general theme of engagement, we are issuing this call for Social Science and Humanities projects with a focus on engagement with marginalized communities and/or persons.

- This grant is supplemental funding to assist with a short-term goal or objective, and should not be the sole source of funding for the research project/program. Funds must be spent by March 31, 2018.
- Applicants must be actively engaged in the research project, or, in the case
 of knowledge mobilization activities, nearing/at the end of their research
 project to be eligible for this grant.
- The applicant for the SSHRC ASU Research Special Grant must be a faculty member of the University of Winnipeg; however, the project itself may involve multidisciplinary teams, communication or community engagement specialists, community partners or student community-engaged learning opportunities under the general guidance of the faculty applicant.
- Eligibility and funding priorities are in alignment with the other internal research grants programs funded through the University of Winnipeg Research and Innovation Office. Eligible expenses:

SSHRC ASU Research Special Grants support the direct costs of research, such as:

- Personnel: student research assistants, research coordinators, etc. Wage rates and benefit costs must be verified with Human Resources.
- Travel and Accommodation: for both research and dissemination travel

- Materials and Supplies
- Research Equipment

Ineligible expenses:

- Teaching-related equipment and supply purchases
- Contribution to University overhead or administration fees
