

2025 UNIVERSITY OF WINNIPEG CHAIR CHAIR

<u>Tenured faculty members</u> are invited to submit proposals for The University of Winnipeg's Chancellor's Research Excellence Chair. Candidates for the Chancellor's Research Excellence Chair must be well-established scholars with an exceptional record of research excellence.

MANDATE

The awarding of a Chancellor's Research Excellence Chair is intended to acknowledge and advance the scholarly activity by faculty who have made exceptional contributions to research in their field.

ELIGIBILITY

Candidates should be researchers who:

- Have demonstrated sustained research excellence:
- Have demonstrated international recognition in their fields; and
- Have attracted, developed and retained trainees, students and researchers.

TERM

The Chair will be awarded annually to an internal candidate for a non-renewable term of three years.

CONTRIBUTION

Holders of the Chair will be expected to contribute to public lectures and or research events in support of their ongoing research. This will be coordinated and supported by the Research Office.

AWARD

The award includes a research grant of \$25,000 distributed over the three-year term.

APPLICATION

Interested faculty are invited to submit a three-page proposal outlining their research contributions and activities to be carried out during the award. Nominations and self-nominations will be accepted for consideration. A Tri-Agency CV, along with two external letters of support that adhere to the UW"s COI Policy, should be included. Applications will be evaluated by the Vice-President, Academic and Vice-President, Research and Innovation, in consultation with the Research Nomination Committee. A recommendation for appointment will be made to the President, who will announce the result of the search process by June 1, 2025.

The deadline for proposals is Tuesday, April 1, 2025.
