General Information:

- Funding for this award is provided through the University of Winnipeg’s EDI Institutional Capacity-Building Grant. The EDI Grant was awarded by NSERC and is designed to support the Federal Government’s commitment to tackling challenges encountered by underrepresented groups in Canadian research institutions. The EDI Grant Project Team has proposed that a portion of the project funds be allocated in the form of a grant to support UWinnipeg academic researchers engaged in EDI-related work and help further the overall aims of this Project. Research results may be used in the EDI Institutional Capacity-Building Grant final report.
- Six (6) University of Winnipeg - EDI Research Awards will be awarded. Three awards will be announced following each intake.
- Research proposals should focus on issues of equity, diversity and inclusion related to academic researchers at UWinnipeg and specifically engage at least one of the following areas:
 1. cultural sensitivity and anti-bias training program for academic researchers;
 2. formal mentorship programs for academic researchers; and/or
 3. the application of an EDI lens to university policies and processes in the context of academic hiring and advancement.
- Applicants for the University of Winnipeg - EDI Research Award must be a UWFA RAS member.
- Research supported by this award must be completed by February 28, 2021.
- Awardees will be expected to provide a final report (2000-3000 words) to the EDI Grant

Project Team and make a brief presentation to the UWinnipeg community.

- Awardees will need to comply with all University of Winnipeg policies and procedures regarding use of funds, reporting and ethics certification. Please see the Research Policies and Procedures Manual for additional information (<http://uwinnipeg.ca/research/research-manual.html>).

Eligible expenses:

- Personnel: wage rates and benefit costs must be verified with Human Resources
- Materials and supplies
- Data set access
- Knowledge Mobilization activities such as: events and community engagement; translation fees; publication/reprint

Ineligible expenses:

- Conference travel
- Teaching-related equipment and supply purchases (e.g. laptops).
- Contribution to University overhead or administration fees
- Personal remuneration or speakers fees for applicant or project personnel
