Work of the Committee

In 2020-2021, the GSC convened for nine monthly meetings. The GSC continued its work of reviewing and approving policies and guidelines, program proposals, curriculum proposals, external examiners for thesis examinations, appeals for students for variances in their terms of study, and nominations for the Graduate Student of Highest Distinction Awards. In addition, the GSC hosted four informal meetings to discuss a variety of issues and best practices across programs. At these meetings, graduate program

chairs made recommendations on such processes and events as virtual learning modalities in response to COVID-19, recruitment, registration forms and instructions, Indigenization of graduate studies, and student community-building.

Work of the Subcommittees

In order to streamline the work of the GSC during its monthly meetings, a number of smaller subcommittees have been constituted to address recurrent issues. These subcommittees are:

1. Appeals Subcommittee – chaired by Janis Thiessen

This subcommittee considers student requests for leaves of absence or extensions of time limits to complete programs (11 appeals reviewed, all were approved).

2. Curriculum Subcommittee – chaired by Peter Moreira/Danielle Defries

This subcommittee reviews new course/course revision/course deletion proposals (27 proposals, including the new Master in Environmental and Social Change program curriculum and MAIG Comprehensive Examination Stream, were reviewed, revised, and approved).

3. External Examiner Subcommittee – chaired by Beata Biernacka This subcommittee reviews the CVs of external examiners proposed by graduate programs for thesis examinations (6 external examiners were reviewed and approved).

4. Policy Subcommittee – chaired by Michael Weinrath

This subcommittee reviews the existing Faculty of Graduate Studies Policies and Guidelines document (9 policy amendments were reviewed and approved including Visiting Graduate Fellow, residency requirement, gender neutral language in the policies, thesis examination guidelines for video conference examinations, inactive status, and continuance terms). The subcommittee also gathered information about program governance and management structures across disciplines and explored the development of an Academic Integrity Module.

Additionally, the GSC:

- Provided and continues to provide advice on measures taken in response to COVID-19 (May 2020-present).
- Participated in Graduate Program Orientation (August 2020).
- Developed recommendations for improving the online student registration system and student tracking processes (October 2020).
- Developed recommendations to address structural and resourcing issues between graduate programs and departments (November 2020).
- Collaborated in the development of the Faculty of Graduate Studies recruitment strategy (December 2020).
- Participated in the Working Group on Indigenous Graduate Education to discuss ideas, objectives, and strategies for initiatives related to Indigenizing graduate education at UW (December 2020-present).
- Reviewed the Senate Standing Committee Rules and submitted recommendations for revisions (February 2021).
- Collaborated in the development of a document on the Roles and Responsibilities of a GPC Chair (April 2021).
