LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

This production asks us to evaluate how we live our lives. It is impossible to address that notion without acknowledging the history of the land upon which we stand. We present this work on Treaty 1 Territory, the traditional lands of the Anishinaabe, Ininew, Oji-Cree, Dene, and Dakota, and the Birthplace of the Métis Nation. We acknowledge the harms done on this land and the need to educate ourselves and others.

Director and Cast Notes

Once again we find ourselves unable to share the theatrical space with our audience. This show is very much framed by the theatre and interaction with you, the audience, so we are really missing this connection.

We are however grateful that the ability to perform together was still possible. It is an important stage of learning for student actors to do a full show, even if it means having our audience in a different space.

Everybody was first produced in 2017 as a modern riff on *Everyman*, one of the oldest plays in the English language. It was a finalist for the 2018 Pulitzer Prize for Drama.

"That's the funny thing about the original too is that it's a play about death but also it's a play about hope. There's a hope for humanity to change itself, to die a noble death, to right its wrongs." – Branden Jacobs-Jenkins

As director and student actors, we collaborated in the casting and choices for the show. The goal was first and foremost to work safely amidst the health crisis, but beyond that it was to learn and apply what has been taught, while finding joy in the process.

Jacobs-Jenkins has called this play a love letter to actors. It certainly was a much needed opportunity to tell a story as artists, which is something we do not take for granted right now.

We are grateful to the team who put so much into this project, despite having to continue to adjust to changing restrictions. We need to connect more than ever right now, in order to decide the world we want to live in and the world we want to leave behind for generations to come. A bit more love and understanding will carry greater meaning at the end of the day than anything else.
